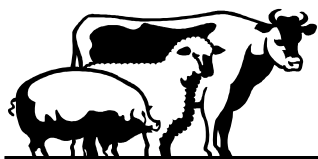

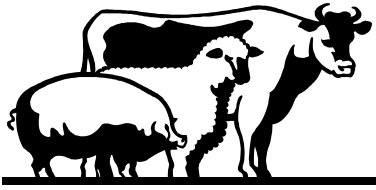

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STOCK SECTION

- 1 ALL CATTLE TO BE TB TESTED WITHIN 60 DAYS PRIOR TO SHOW AND BE FROM ACCREDITED FREE HERD. TB CERTIFICATE TO ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY FORMS, NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT CERTIFICATE.
- 2 No late entries accepted.
- 3 Stock judging will start at 9.30am sharp.
- 4 Cows in milk will be judged first.
- 5 All cattle must be haltered and broken to lead.
- 6 Beef Bulls 12 months and over must be rung and led by ring and under adequate supervision.
- 7 All Dairy Bulls must be rung, have two leaders and under adequate supervision as per administration manual.
- 8 All cattle must be led out for judges inspection if required.
- 9 All dairy cattle will be judged on dairy points.
- 10 Entries in registered classes to state name, date of birth and registered number. Sire and dam to be stated for young pedigree stock.
- 11 A Mutton breed sheep to be shorn on or after 1st September.
- 12 All classes of animals age to be determined on date of entry unless stipulated.
- 13 The judge to have the right to reclassify any stock entered in the wrong class.
- 14 The Committee will not be held responsible under any circumstances for loss, damage, or mis-delivery of stock or implements exhibited at the show.
- 15 Any person lodging a protest must deposit the sum of \$20.00, which will be forfeited if the protest is not allowed.
- 16 Prize money for Sheep and Cattle Classes: First \$5, second \$3, third \$2. 1 to 3 entries, 1st prize only will be paid, 4, 5 and 6 entries, 2nd prize will be paid. 7 entries, 3rd prize will be paid.
- 17 The scale of points shall be FIRST 6, SECOND 4, THIRD 2, FOURTH 1, if award made by judge. Champion – 2 extra points, Reserve Champion – 1 extra point.
- 18 No stock to be sold if not exhibited.
- 19 No stock shall be moved from the grounds until 3.30pm on the day of Show.
- 20 Loading ramp situated in grounds.
- 21 Unregistered cattle eligible for all Classes except Class 36 & 37 or any championship.
- 22 Selected from 1st & 2nd place-getters from all age group classes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR HORSE SECTION

- 1 Ring Classes start at 9.00am. Jumping at 12.30pm. Exhibitors must be conversant with the following rules.
- 2 No horses/ponies allowed on grounds unless officially entered.
- 3 Entries must be signed and will not be accepted without the entry fee.
- 4 The committee will refund 80% of entry fee on presentation of a vet or medical certificate.
- 5 Stables cost \$5 and must be left tidy.
- 6 \$5 will be charged for back numbers not returned.
- 7 Horse/Pony height certificates and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. **"The Central Districts of the Royal Agricultural Society collates all A&P Show Results to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all Novice wins.**
- 8 a) All riders ride at their own risk.
b) Age of rider to be at date of show.
- 9 **(a) The committee reserves the right to combine, alter or delete classes at their discretion.**
b) If there are less than 6 entries in any one ring the sections will be combined.
c) The committee reserves the right to reduce prize money according to entries.
- 10 a) All horses & ponies to be named & names to be included on entry form.
b) Committee requests that a horse or pony under 3 years not be shown under saddle.
c) Height of ALL HACKS & PONIES to be shown on entry form. Competitors to enter in ONE ring only with the exception of the following – Classes 96, 107 and The Pony Breeders' Sash, class 116.
- 12 Ponies entered in class 116, Pony Breeders' Sash, must include ponies registration number on entry form.
- 13 Events will not be delayed for competitors wanting to enter in more than one class at the same time.
- 14 a) A NOVICE is a horse or pony which has not won 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A&P Show at the time of the Show (Ladies and Gentlemen's Hack class wins count as an Open Conformation win). If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and may change to an Open class within the sub-section, or if no class remains to enter a refund will be actioned after the show.
b) A novice horse or pony is to be shown in a snaffle bit.
c) A novice hunter is a horse or pony that has had no more than 5 first prizes in Round The Ring Hunter Jumping. Horse/Pony height certificates and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
d) Only novice horses or ponies can enter novice classes. All horses & ponies can enter open classes.
e) Novice pony classes are open to riders of any age.
- 15 NOVICE RIDER not having won more than 5 first prizes in riding classes at A & P Shows.
- 16 **(a) Champion & Reserve Champion ribbons will be distributed in all sections where appropriate.**
(b) In all rings first prize winners ONLY to parade for Champion. Once the Champion has been selected, the second placed animals to the Champion must be allowed to parade for the Reserve Champion.
- 17 Boundaries for DISTRICT classes will be South of Taramakau, North of Mikonui. Combination of horse and rider.
- 18 **HARD HATS & SAFETY HELMETS – RAS Ruling.**
a) All riders must wear protective headgear when mounted on the grounds.
b) All riders 16 years and under must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area collecting rings or anywhere else within a showground.
- 19 a) SHOW JUMPING events will be conducted under NZEF Rules.
b) All show jumping is non grading.
- 20 Kindergarten & Training entries are not eligible for open jumping event except classes 153 & 154.
- 21 The Combined Western Districts Show Jumping Championship for highest aggregate points, in conjunction with the Buller, Whataroa, Westland, Reefton, Murchison and Greymouth Shows will be competed for in classes 151, 152, 153, 154.
- 22 The use of tranquilisers, stimulants or any substance which affects the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for Forbidden Substance may be carried out under FSJC procedures (Ref 10 of the RAS By Laws and Regulations Section 55A). Your signature on the entry form, and/or participation on competition denotes acceptance of these conditions (Ref. Rule 89 of RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book).
- 23 Any person lodging a protest must deposit the sum of \$20 which will be forfeited if the protest is not allowed. The protest must be lodged within an hour of the event in dispute.
- 24 Prize money: First \$5, second \$3, third \$2 unless stated. 1 to 3 entries. 1st prize only will be paid, 4, 5 and 6 entries, 2nd prize will be paid. 7 entries, 3rd prize will be paid.
- 25 The scale of points shall be FIRST 6, SECOND 4, THIRD 2, FOURTH 1, if award made by judge. Champion – 2 extra points, Reserve Champion – 1 extra point.
- 26 **MINIATURE HORSE SECTION**
Start 9.00am on grass track out from Grand Stand.
a) To be run under NZMHA Rules.
b) All Horses must have a current NZMHA Height Certificate.
c) All horses must be registered with NZMHA or National Miniature Horse Society.
d) Height for age rules apply.
e) Champion & Reserve Champion ribbons will be distributed in all sections where appropriate.

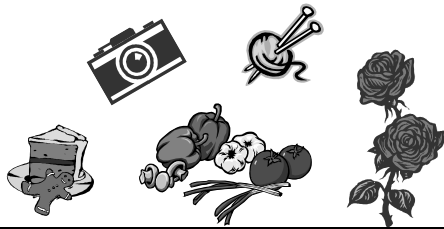
