ALL DISTRICT COMPETITORS REFER TO CLASS 44

BACK NUMBERS: \$4.00 to be paid at time of entry and will be refunded \$2.00 on returning same to Secretary's Office. Only Banks Peninsula Agricultural & Pastoral Association Back numbers allowed to be worn on Show Day. \$2.00 will be used for Judges Expenses as per RAS requirements.

HORSE YARDS. Due to a limited number of Horse Yards, these will be allocated on application (with your entries) a charge of \$10.00 per horse/pony unless a District competitor refer 'rule 29', contact P Young, 03 325-1081.

The Show Committee strongly discourage overnight camping due to limited space and Health & Safety requirements. Off road parking for camping is no longer available.

Please note: Owing to regulations beyond our control, ALL horse parking will be at the western end of the grounds.

Essential overnight parking must be beyond the Community Centre on Western Valley Road.

No horse or pony to be tied to floats on the roadside.

Before back numbers are issued to every competitor entered in a height class they must present their height certificates. Permanent and annual measuring

certificates issued by the Royal Agricultural Society will be accepted.

The RAS Horse and Pony Height Certificate & Performance Card or Banks Peninsula A & P Assn Day Certificate must be carried at all times. Failure to do so will result in elimination. (RAS Rule 67)

Please note that a record of wins will be asked for in all classes

Central Districts of the Royal Agricultural Society collates all A & P Show results to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all Novice wins

Competitors RAS Measuring and Performance Card number must be recorded on the Entry Form.

Measuring for Day Certificates for District Competitors (Regulation 29) will be available on the grounds:-

between 3pm - 4pm Friday, and from 7am to 9am Saturday. 'Only horses/ponies presented in a bridle and under suitable control will be measured for a Day Certificate.

A \$10.00 fee is levied for any NON District Competitors horse/pony requiring a day certificate only. Levy to be paid at time of measuring. NO back number issued till levy paid. All Day measures will be forwarded to Central Districts for recording.

Once a Horse or Pony commences the Show Year as a Hack, Saddle Hunter - Riding Horse, Saddle Pony, or Saddle Hunter Pony, that horse or pony may not transfer to another Section during that Show Year. If a Show does not hold Saddle Hunter - Riding Horse and Saddle Hunter Pony classes, this ruling will not apply.

All entry fees must be paid at time of making entry. Name of animal must be stated at time of entry.

No Horse / Pony under the age of three years is permitted to be shown under saddle at this Show.

A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A & P Show at the time of this Show. (Ladies/Gents Hack class wins count as an Open conformation Class).

Once a Horse or Pony has had 6 wins it is not eligible for Novice Classes.

Should a Novice Horse/Pony gain six wins in one or other section after time of entry and before the day of this show, the competitor must advise the Secretary and upgrade to open classes, if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the show.

'Novice' in Paced and Mannered classes is a Horse/Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Paced and Mannered classes at an A & P Show at the time of this Show.

Novice Horse/Pony may enter in open classes.

Novice Horse/Pony to be shown in a simple snaffle bit in novice classes.

Hacks / Park Hacks are not eligible for Saddle Hunter Section. Saddle Hunters are not eligible for Hack / Park Hack Section.

Winners of District Classes are eligible for Championship judging in one ring only.

(a) Drivers must wear colours, trousers, boots, safety helmets and carry a suitable whip in the manner of a racing driver.

(b) To be shown in a sulky appropriately sized for the horse (two wheeled cart with stirrups and no basket).

H07.02 Gaits

Jog Trot - The horse must display a slow, short true trot.

Road Gait - The horse must show a steady but brisk trot. The hind feet should at least touch the ground in the footprints of the forefeet.

Drive on Trot - The horse should show definite extension of both paces and their frame and cover as much ground as possible while maintaining the trot. Breaks of pace are acceptable providing the trot is re-established without gaining ground.

Roadster horses should have animation, brilliance and show ring presence. At all speeds they should work in form with head set and legs working beneath them. At speed the trot should be in balance with long reaching action in front with straight true movement. Pacey or mixed gaited horses that pace or rack will be penalized.

H07.03 Basis of Judging

(a) Horses should be judged entirely on their way of going in each pace and the smooth transitions between them. Manners are a low consideration providing other competitors do not become disadvantaged.

(b) A horse that has not demonstrated distinct gaits and smooth transitions (change of gaits) should not be placed over a horse that has demonstrated greater ability but has a minor or incidental break in gait.

H07-04 Workout

(a) Roadster horses must enter the ring in a clock wise direction at a Jog Trot, then show at the Road Gait, turn counter clockwise at the Jog Trot, show at the Road Gait and Drive-on trot. Horses will not be judged at a walk, although they may be asked to do so for safety when lining up, and are not required to rein back.
