YELLOW CARD SYSTEM:

This Show supports the trialled 'Yellow Card' system (as per the resolution at the 2009 Royal Agricultural Society Conference), which will be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show Officials, Judges, Fellow Competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the Equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors, as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook and Rule 13 of the RAS Constitution.

ALL ENTRIES are made subject to the Rules & Conditions and Bylaws of the Royal Agricultural Society and the Affiliated A&P Associations.

Ownership - All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading (whether by invitation or by entry) must be entered in the name of the bonifide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.

Leases - A lease lodged with the Royal Agricultural Society must cover each leased horse or pony competing at any A&P Show. A Lease or Partnership must be recorded with the RAS on a recognised form to be acceptable. All benefits and penalties relating to a leased horse shall be attributed to the lessee. If the animal is registered with an affiliated breed society the lease must also be registered with that Society.

THE COMMITTEE reserves the right to combine or delete classes as necessary where there are insufficient entries.

REFUND of ENTRY FEES (Horse or Pony). The Committee reserves the right to authorise the refund of entry fees only at a rate of 70% upon submission of - a) a receipted entry form, b) a veterinary or doctor's certificate, and c) a written explanation as to the reason for the request, within seven days following the Show. No refunds will be considered after this period and the Association's decision shall be final.

EQUESTRIAN JUDGES and COMPETITORS RULES & GUIDELINES

BOOKLET: Copies of this Booklet (\$35.00 including p&p) are available from the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ, PO Box 54, Woodend 7641. Website: www.ras.org.nz

BACK NUMBERS:

* ONLY Oxford A&P Assn Back Numbers to be worn - absolutely no other numbers to be used.

* To be collected from the horse float by the horse measuring stand and returned to the Secretary's office for a \$2 refund per back number.

* A list of Back Numbers will be published in the Catalogue. Catalogues are available by the Back Number Horse Float.

CONDITIONS:

(The following conditions to be read in conjunction with Rules & Regulations in front of Catalogue).

* No horse or pony to be entered in more than one section except jumping competitions.

* Competitors in Section 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 and 8 select whether they enter in Hack/Pony or Show Hunter classes but NOT BOTH.

* Where exhibits are entered to compete in more than 1 Section, they must be available when called, no compensation will be given for missed classes.

AGES of RIDERS:

* All ages of Riders of Ponies, where age restrictions are imposed, are taken at Birth Date at time of entries closing, except that Riders turning 17 after 1 January are able to ride Ponies until 31 July of the same year.

* A Pony Rider eligible to compete on the first day of an Event may continue to compete at that Event as a Pony Rider.

* The minimum age of rider in Led Rein section is 4 years at the date of entries closing.

* Proof of age to be carried and produced on request of Ring Steward/Judge.

HATS & SAFETY HELMETS:

* A hard hat is generally described as a hunting cap, a bowler, protective headwear or a safety helmet.

* Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing, working in or schooling or riding for any other reason a horse at an A & P Show or in any area considered to be for whatever reason a part of the Showgrounds.

* All riders 16 and under must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds.

- It is strongly recommended that all riders particularly those jumping horses wear protective headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety Standard or an equivalent standard and that the headgear be secured by a retention harness.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES:

* The use of tranquilisers, stimulants or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies or riders is forbidden.

* Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show and that testing of all animals is at the owners own risk.

* Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society Forbidden Substance Judicial Committee (FSJC), procedures and rules (refer to Rule 89 RAS Equestrian Judges and Competitors Rule Book and Rule 55a of the RAS General Rules and Regulations).

* Entry Fee includes RAS Equestrian Levy of 50c per class.

MEASURING HORSE and PONIES:

* A charge will be made for a Day Height Measuring Certificate (applicable for this Show only) \$3 District Competitor / \$15 other Competitor, entry form must be sited by Measurer.

* Life Certificates and current Annual Certificates accepted.

* Height and Performance Card Certificates must be carried and produced on request. Winners failing to produce their card when requested by the Steward forfeit their awards on the day.

* Horse Measurer available to issue day certificates from 7:30am to 8am on Show Day.

* Normal shoes may be fitted. In such a case 5mm allowance shall be made. 1mm shall be allowed for heavy harness horse or pony shoes. No allowance shall be made for thin shoes or racing plates. Measuring Certificates must be carried and produced as requested.

HORSE ABUSE:

Any alleged acts of horse abuse are reportable during the event to the organising body, supported by at least two other witnesses, or after the event to the Royal Agricultural Society in writing. Two separate letters must be received in writing to the RAS from unrelated members of different families within fourteen (14) days of the date of the event, giving rise to the incident.

NOVICE SECTION CONDITIONS:

1. A novice horse or pony or rider is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show. Divisions may be Pony Hacks, Pony Hunters on the Flat, Pony Round the Ring Jumpers, Cobs, Park Hacks, Hacks, Saddle (Flat) Hunters, Paced and Manners Classes in each of the preceding divisions, Round the Ring Jumping (ponies and horses) Rider Classes.

2. Once a horse or pony has had 6 wins it is not eligible for the Novice classes, including Paced and Mannered classes.

3. Novices may enter Open Classes.

4. Hacks: Any Lady's Hack class win counts as an Open Conformation Class.

5. Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won their Open Class, nor are they eligible for Supreme Award. Championship Award does not count as a win.

6. Novice horses or ponies entered in Novice Classes must be shown in Snaffle Bits only (excepting Harness Classes)

8. If a novice entry has gained 6 or more wins at the day of the show, the Competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and may change to an Open Class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned at such time as the Show Committee decides.

REGISTERED PONY CLASSES:

Open to ponies full registered with Pony Breeders Society of NZ and be foaled in

NZ. Registration number to be stated on entry form. Registration certificate to be produced if required - the winner of the sash MUST be able to show the ring steward their registration certificate before receiving the sash. If it is subsequently found that the winner of a Pony Breeders Society Sash is not registered with the Society, they will be required to forfeit this award.

STALLIONS:

Stallions are permitted in all classes they are eligible for, but must if led, be in the appropriate harness prescribed by the Breed Society the stallion is registered with or which is prescribed by the host Show, or if ridden must be in an appropriate bridle and be in total control. A Steward will order any stallion considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion owner/exhibitor/competitor.

IT IS COMPULSORY FOR ALL STALLIONS REGARDLESS OF AGE, TO WEAR AN IDENTIFICATION BADGE "S" AT ALL SHOWS AT ALL TIMES.

COLTS:

All Colts, 6 months or over in the In-hand classes must be exhibited with a bit in the mouth.

HACK/HUNTER DRY MARE CLASSES:

Refer to Section 12.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

* A Vet Certificate must be produced to the Secretary for any horse or pony wishing to be substituted with another animal. The substitution is required to meet qualifications as stipulated in accordance with Rule 1.

TROPHIES and CUPS AWARDED:

the winner of most points in livestock sections (horses, sheep, goats and cattle).

THE PARISH CHALLENGE CUP - One Pony/Rider combination to count - please nominate combination for most points in. Section 5 - classes 57 to 66, except District Rider.

Section 6 - classes 68 to 78, except District Rider.

Section 7 - classes 79 to 88, except District Rider.

Section 8 - classes 89 to 100, except District Rider.

Section 16 - all classes, except 210.

1. CHAMPION DISTRICT HORSE (to be judged from the winners of district classes from sections 1, 2 and 3) judged concurrently: Ashley Cooper Memorial Trophy, (donated by the late Lucy Cooper, to be awarded to the BEST DISTRICT HACK (from section 1, 2 and 3) - To be judged in Section 2, immediately after the completion of the District class in that ring.

2. CHAMPION and RESERVE CHAMPION DISTRICT PONY - To be judged from the winners of the District classes from rings 5, 6, 7 and 8 in Ring 5, immediately after the completion of the District class in that ring. Trophy donated by Mrs JP Judson.
