## ENTRY FEES

All entries are inclusive of GST.

All entries must be made in writing and duly signed.

The Committee will in no case consider any entry valid unless fees are paid at time of making it.

The rights to sell all types of food on the grounds are let by tender at the discretion of the Committee.

**TRADE SPACE:** Trade Display sites are ONLY available in sizes of 6 metres frontage x 7 metres depth (14 metres is maximum depth i.e. 2 sites) or multiples thereof. Cost is \$55.00 per site. Admission passes are issued on the basis of **ONE** per every \$55.00 paid for space. Additional passes may be available at a reduced cost of \$5.00 each, maximum of 1 extra pass per site. Limited power sites are available at an additional cost of \$40.00 per site.

In other exhibits not named, the entrance fee will be decided by the Secretary.

## **ALL PEOPLE ENTER THE GROUNDS AT THEIR OWN RISK.**

### GENERAL REGULATIONS

"To be read in conjunction with Section conditions and with the Rules and By-Laws of the Royal Agricultural Society of N. Z."

#### 1. Judging commences for:

Sheep Dog Trials at **7.30 a.m.**

Pony, In Hand, Hack & Mohair at **8.30 a.m.**

Black & Coloured Sheep, Pet Calf and Shetland Ponies

at **9.00 a.m.**

Cattle at **9.30am**

Dancing, Sheep, Goats, Donkeys & Mules, Alpacas, Poultry,

Produce Shed and Piping at **10.00 a.m.**

First Ridden, Leading Rein, Pet Lambs at **10.30 a.m.**

All exhibitors to have exhibits penned or displayed half an hour prior to judging. Refer also to individual sections for judging time.

2. All horses must be haltered when led; all stock must be thoroughly quiet, or they will not be admitted.

3. Horses are not allowed into the ring with prize tickets attached during judging.

4. Bulls (over 12 months old) **MUST BE RINGED** and tied accordingly.

5. No entries, trade space or implements may be removed from ground until after 4.00 p.m. without special order from the Secretary.

6. Stallions shall be permitted on the showground provided they are thoroughly quiet; otherwise the committee reserves the right to remove the exhibit. It is compulsory for all stallions regardless of age to wear an identification badge "**S**" at all Shows at all times.

7. The Committee will not under any circumstances hold themselves responsible for loss, damage, or mis-delivery of stock or implements exhibited at the show.

8. All protests must be in writing and may be entered either before or after the judges have proceeded to their duties. The person entering the protest in horses, cattle, and sheep to deposit \$10.00, the deposit to be returned if the protest is sustained. If the protest is lodged before the judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof to rest with the exhibitors, if after the judging is completed, the onus of proof to rest with the party protesting. No protest will be received later than one hour after the awards are made and the prize tickets affixed.

9. No distinguishing marks of ownership with the exception of earmarking, ear tags, and registered brand, may be attached to any pen or animal exhibited.

10. In the event of there being no competition in any class, no prize will be given unless the judge certifies to particular merit, and the judges are specially requested to withhold prizes in cases where there is competition if the exhibits are of inferior description.

11. In the case of funds of the Society are at any time insufficient, after paying expenses and making necessary provisions for all liabilities, to pay prize-money in full, the amount available for the purpose shall be distributed pro rata among the prize-winners. All special prizes not competed for, or awarded, to become the property of the Society.

12. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry, and all produce must have been grown by the exhibitor.

13. **TRADE DISPLAY** sites are only available in sizes of 6 metres frontage x 7 metres depth (14 metres is maximum depth i.e. 2 sites) or multiples thereof. Please state clearly No. of sites required. Make sure that you have allowed sufficient space for gye ropes/crowd space, etc. Admission passes are issued on the basis of one per every 6 x 7 metre site ordered. Additional passes are available at a reduced cost, maximum of 1 extra pass per 6m x 7m site. Limited sites with power are available at an additional cost per site. Power being 1 x 15 amp 3 pin plug. The committee will endeavour to honour all site requests but reserve the right to site displays at their discretion. The committee has the right to refuse any application for space. All applications must be on the official form. No photocopies or facsimile copies accepted. Payment must be made at time of application. Ribbons will be awarded for the best heavy Trade space, Promotional and Craft display. Trade Space exhibitors to be on the grounds by 9.30 a.m. and no trade space displays shall be removed from the grounds until after 4.00 p.m. without special order from the Secretary. The site plan is final.

14. All exhibitors agree and undertake to exercise reasonable care in conducting their operation and agree to make good to the Society any damage caused to cables, pipes or underground structures of any nature. The exhibitors shall hold sufficient insurance against such damage. All damage will be the responsibility of the applicant and all costs will be recovered. All underground cables & pipes will be marked with a red band; no tent pegs or holes are to be dug or driven within one metre of marked cables or pipes. All large or dangerous animals shall be contained behind fences suitable to make sure they cannot escape under any circumstances and meets and complies with all fencing requirements under New Zealand Law.

15. Exhibitors of machinery and mechanical equipment of any description must ensure that it is fully guarded so as to be incapable of injuring spectators while on display. Tractors and other machinery demonstrated at work must be attended by a member of the exhibitor's staff while working, and must be efficiently immobilized when not working. Exhibits which are considered by the Committee to be dangerous, to be excessively noisy, or undesirable in any way, may be immobilized at the discretion of the Committee.

16. Any prize winner of horse, or led cattle sections not taking part in the Grand Parade may have his prize money forfeited.

17. No animal will be allowed to take part in the Grand Parade carrying any awards or ribbons won at previous shows.

18. Regulation safety helmets must be worn by **ALL** horse and pony competitors.

19. In the event of an entered horse or pony becoming unsound prior to the show, a substitute may be entered in the same class, ridden by same rider, provided a vet's certificate is produced for the original entry. The Secretary to be notified prior to the show.

20. A novice is a Horse or Pony that has not had 6 (six) wins in Conformation at the day of the Show. (Paced and Mannered wins do not count in Conformation classes and Conformation classes do not count in paced and mannered classes.)

Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse / Pony Height and Performance Card must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. All wins in Novice Sections within each division count and must be recorded. Should a Novice Horse/Pony win an Open Conformation class including Ladies & Gents classes these must also be recorded. Once a Horse/Pony has achieved 6 (six) wins in either Conformation or Paced and Mannered this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change Sections at the beginning of the new show season. Novice Horse /Pony to be shown in snaffle bit only.

21. Champion and Reserve Champion horse or pony will be selected as follows: First prize winners in all Open Height Classes to be paraded before the Judge. Immediately the champion has been selected the 2nd placed animal in the class, from which the champion has been selected shall parade with the other place getters to Reserve Champion.

22. All horses and ponies must carry a current height certificate for all classes. Measuring available before 8.15am.

23. The use of tranquillizers, stimulants or any drug which affects the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

24. Competitors are advised that there may be random F S tests carried out during the show. Testing of all animals will be at the owner's risk and will be carried out under FSJC procedures (Ref 10 of the RAS By Laws and Regulations Section 55A. Your

signature on the entry form, and or participation in competition denotes acceptance of these conditions. (Ref. Rule 89 of RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book.

25. Any competitor who has administered to their horse or pony, any prohibited drug during 7 days prior to the show is required to notify the secretary before competing.
26. The above requirement must be completed in writing and the secretary should provide facility for scratching and substitutions.
27. Suggestions are welcomed by the Committee from exhibitors and patrons for the improvements of the Show. Such should be made in writing and handed in at the Secretary's office.
28. In the dog trial section a maiden shall be one which has not won a first prize at any trial at close of entry.
29. Exhibitor's passes will be given as follows - one pass after payment of \$5.00 or over in entry fees.
30. All persons admitted into any premises controlled by the Society shall be subject to the order of the Committee and shall in the event of misbehaviour such persons may be removed by order of the President or any two members of the Committee.
31. The President or any two members of the Committee may eject from the showground's, without compensation or return of fees, any persons whose conduct either personal or as proprietor of a sideshow, or exhibit, is a source of annoyance. The sideshow or sideshows of any such proprietor shall be closed down.
32. All exhibits shall be at the sole risk of the owner of exhibitor and the Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss, damage, misdelivery, detention or delay of exhibits of any description whatsoever.
33. The decision of the Committee for the time being in office shall be absolutely final in all cases.
34. The Committee reserves the right to remove any motor vehicle, float, caravan or any other form of trailer which is parked in any area or manner other than those prescribed by the Committee.
35. No person shall sell any tobacco, food, drink or any form of refreshment and raffles to any person on the land of the Society during any Agricultural and Pastoral show held by the Society without the written permission of the Committee.
36. Any animal found to be unsound shall be removed from the grounds.
37. Only registered sheep are eligible for purebred sections.
38. All vehicles enter at own risk and are accepted for parking on condition that the Mackenzie A & P Society accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage to persons or vehicles, their contents, fitting or accessories even when such loss, theft, injury or damage is attributed to any negligence on the part of the Society or any of its employees or stewards.
39. The Committee has the right to ask for a loose box or boxes to be vacated in the case of any emergency.
40. No animal from a herd or farm under movement control for TB or Brucellosis or distance control place notice and cattle awaiting a comparative cervical test result and any replacement stock associated with such animals shall be exhibited at an A & P show. (A herd consists of all replacement animals grazed off the farm regardless of how many mobs they are farmed in).
41. TB POLICY - All cattle, yearlings and over entered for showing must be from a T B accredited and Brucellosis free herd. All animals three months and over must be TB tested and a copy of the test certificate must accompany the entry form or be received by the show Secretary at least seven days prior to the show.
42. The owner of all dogs entering the show-grounds must be able to produce a dosing certificate if requested to do so.
43. It is the intention of the Society to publish all results.
44. Refunds for ALL sections. If a refund is required the Society will retain 25% of entry fees for expenses incurred. ALL applications must have a Veterinarian or Doctors certificates or a very good reason. ALL refunds are the discretion of the Secretary and Executive.
45. No trophies to be taken on show day
46. Cups and Trophies - All last year's cups and trophies to be signed in at the Secretary's office on show day or returned by prior arrangement. This year cups will be engraved by the Society, each individual please contact the Secretary regarding delivery arrangements.
47. All persons entering the grounds must comply with the Health Safety & Employment Act 1992 (and subsequent amendments.)
48. Some Special Prizes may not be as stated as they are not all confirmed by printing of the schedule.

1. The competition shall be open to all fleeces which fall into one of the above classifications and which have been nominated by an A & P Assn or Wool broker during the 2009-10 seasons.

2. Entry forms will be available from the Secretary Mackenzie County A & P Society, Wool Brokers, A & P Secretaries or the Royal Agricultural Society [www.ras.org.nz](http://www.ras.org.nz). Please ensure your **FULL** postal address is shown on the entry form and the person responsible for correspondence.

3. All fleeces must be skirted to the highest commercial standard.

4. **Fleeces entered in each class should be packed separately and clearly marked with the number of the class in which they are entered.** Fleeces entered in the wrong class will be reclassified by the R.A.S nominee.

5. The two Champion fleeces (Fine & Strong) become the property of the R.A.S for promotional and display purposes.

6. All fleece entries must be accompanied by an **ENTRY FEE** of \$10.00 or \$20.00 if the competitor wishes their fleece to be returned after the event. Fleeces not returned become the property of the Mackenzie County A & P Society and will be sold to defray competition expenses or otherwise donated to the local St John's.

7. All fleeces shall be freight prepaid to: The Mackenzie County A & P Society, C/- Barwood Motors Fairlie. Fleeces from outside the Mackenzie District may be consolidated at local Wool Brokers stores. Exhibitors should contact their nearest broker for further details.

8. **Any fleeces that are not clearly packed and labelled are entered at the convenors discretion.**

9. **ENTRY CLOSING DATE: 5<sup>th</sup> March 2010 at 5pm.**  
**All fleeces must reach Fairlie by 22nd March 2010.** No late entries will be accepted.

It is recommended that as soon as judging is complete at local A & P Shows that fleeces be put into polythene bags to prevent damage.
