Friday 7th February 2020 **Definitely no Food items to be left.**
3. Please place entries as early as possible with the Indoor Secretary so that entries can be processed.
4. **Children aged 15 years and over to enter in the Open Section.**
5. Judging of the Indoor Section will take place on the day preceding the show.
6. **All exhibits must be staged in the Arapohue Hall, with tickets attached, ready for judging by 11:30am on Friday 7th February 2020.**
Only judges and stewards in the hall after that time.
7. Only Cut Flowers and Dahlias may be post entry.
8. **ENTRY FEES:** Adults—50 cents per entry, Children—20 cents per entry unless otherwise stated.
9. **PRIZE MONEY:** 1st—\$2.00, 2nd—\$1.00. Prize money may be replaced with products/vouchers from sponsors.

CLASS 75 (1) RUAWAI KUMARA CAKE

½ cup butter	1 cup cooked mashed kumara	
½ tsp cinnamon	½ tsp salt	½ cup nuts
1 cup sugar	2 tsp baking powder	½ tsp cloves
2 eggs	½ tsp nutmeg	¼ tsp soda
2 cups flour	½ cup milk	

METHOD:

1. Cream butter & sugar
2. Beat in the eggs one at a time blending thoroughly
3. Blend in the kumara
4. Sift all the dry ingredients together and add the kumara mixture alternately with the milk
5. Add the nuts
6. Mix the batter well

7. Place the mixture in two papered and greased sponge tins
8. Bake at 180 deg C
9. Cool and ice with caramel icing

(2) KOPURU KUMARA CAKE

2 cups Shredded kumara	1 1/3 cups water	1 1/3 cups sugar
1 cup raisins	3 tbsp butter	1/2 tsp allspice
1/2 tsp salt	1/4 tsp cloves	2 cups flour
2 tsp baking soda	1 cup chopped nuts	

METHOD:

1. Combine raw shredded kumara, water, sugar, raisins and butter in a pot and cook five minutes after coming to the boil
2. Put pot in cold water to cool
3. Sift the dry ingredients together and add the cooled mixture
4. Beat well
5. Add the nuts and mix thoroughly
6. Bake at 160 deg C in a prepared tin
7. Cool and ice with lemon or orange icing

CLASS 76—KUMARA BISCUITS

1/2 cup butter	1 tsp. salt
1 1/2 cups flour	1/4 cup sugar
2 tsp. baking powder	2 cups hot mashed kumara

METHOD:

1. Mix mashed kumara with butter and salt
2. Leave to cool
3. Add flour, sugar and baking powder.
4. Roll out on floured board. Cut with scone cutter
- 5 Bake at 110 deg C for 15-20 minutes.
- 6 Serve with plenty of butter



CLASS 77 KUMARA SCONES

2 oz. (50g) butter

1 egg

Salt

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk

1 cup mashed kumara

2—2 & $\frac{1}{2}$ cups self raising flour

METHOD:

1. Cream butter and sugar
2. Mix kumara, egg and milk
3. Add sufficient flour to obtain a scone consistency
4. Roll out
5. Cut into squares and place on a cold oven tray
6. Bake at 200 deg C for 20 minutes

CLASS 78 (1) KUMARA LOAF

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup cooked mashed kumara

2 cups self-rising flour

1 cup mixed dried fruit

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar

1 tsp cinnamon

1 cup milk

TOPPING:

$1\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp sugar $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp cinnamon

METHOD:

1. Place all ingredients together in bowl and beat at medium speed until well combined

2. Put into a greased loaf tin
3. Sprinkle with topping ingredients
4. Bake at 190 degrees C for about an hour or until firm when pressed

(2) KUMARA LOAF

- 1 cup cold mashed kumara
- 2½ cups self rising flour
- Pinch of salt
- 1 tsp mixed spice
- 1 tsp ginger
- 225 grms butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 packet mixed fruit

METHOD:

1. Cream the butter and sugar
2. Add the eggs one at a time beating well after each addition
3. Add mashed kumara, salt and spices, with the mixed fruit
4. Mix well and bake at 180 degrees C for 2 hours

(3) KUMARA LOAF

- 1 cup mashed cooked kumara
- 2 cups self rising flour
- 1 cup dates
- ½ cup bran
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 1 tbsp golden syrup
- 1 cup water

METHOD

1. Blend all ingredients together
2. Add warm water
3. Stir well, then place in a greased loaf tin

4. Bake at 180 degrees C for about 40 minutes

Pattern for class 150

Using Size 8 knitting (4mm) needles and any baby wool. Cast on 48 stitches. Rib 16 rows of 2 plain, 2 purl. Then knit 30 rows of stocking stitch. Cast on 12 stitches for sleeves. Rib until the end of the row. Next row cast on 12 stitches and continue in the rib pattern for 20 rows. Right side: Rib 21 stitches, then cast off 30 for the neck. Rib 21 stitches. Next row rib 21 stitches. Cast on 30 stitches. Rib 21 stitches.

Repeat for 20 rows. Wrong side: Cast off 12 stitches (to finish the sleeve). Next row cast off another 12 stitches. Continue 30 rows of stocking stitch. Then rib 16 rows of 2 plain, 2 purl and then cast off and sew up the side seams.

This pattern is all knitted in one piece.
