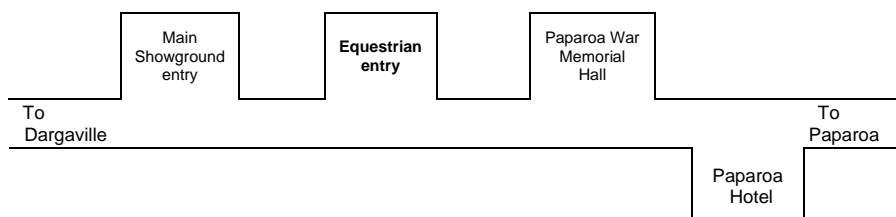

All riders and competitors compete at own risk, hard hats to be worn at all times when mounted and Driving. Helmets must now be tagged with official red tag from 1st August 2017.

A Yellow card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws, including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered measuring stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the person responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. The North Kaipara Agricultural Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showground of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable.

SMOKE FREE SHOW

Smoking is prohibited everywhere on the Show Ground.

NO DOGS ALLOWED
