Rose & Flower Sections

For best results, cut flowers at least 24hrs ahead of time and soak `up to their neck' in room temperature water. Always leave as much foliage on the stems as possible – stewards will advise what is acceptable at staging. Cut all flowers with the stems as long as practicable – stewards will advise the correct length when staging. Rose stems should be a minimum of 20cm (8") including two sets of leaves.

Flowers only to be staged on the shelves once registered with scribes and an exhibit card has been issued. If you have more than 10 entries, please attempt to stage these the evening before.

Alternatively, as a courtesy to our stewards, please plan to arrive no later than 8.45am the morning of the Show to ensure there is sufficient time for the staging before doors close at 9.30am.

If you have flowers you would like to display but are not sure what category they fit in, please cut them, and bring them along. Our stewards will advise where to stage them. Roses are judged to National Rose Society NZ Inc. Rules.
