EQUESTRIAN RULES & REGULATIONS

Please ensure that you read both the General & Section Conditions carefully before submitting entries.

Murchison A&P Show is run under the by-laws & regulations of the RAS, Breed or Kindred Society & the Murchison A&P Association. In the event of conflict, RAS rules & regulations take precedence.

General Conditions:

1. All entries must be in the hands of the Secretary no later than closing date advised. All fees must accompany entries & telephoned entries will only be accepted in cases of emergency.
2. Breastplate number holders are compulsory for all showing classes except Working Hunters & Hunter Jumping. Competitors are responsible for providing their own number(s) black numbers on a white background, or white on a black background only please.
Murchison A&P Back numbers are available for Working Hunters & Hunter Jumping from the Equestrian tent on show day.
3. No animals or goods of any description other than official entries will be allowed on grounds without permission of the committee.
4. Horse & Pony Sections winners must partake in Grand Parade (if held).
5. **Prizes**
 - a) In the event of two or less entries, in any class the judge is not bound to award a prize unless the entry is of sufficient merit. Prize money will then be scaled back accordingly as per below.
 - b) Where first equal is awarded no second prize will be awarded. The prize money of first & second prizes will be combined & divided between equal place winners.
 - c) Ribbons 1st to 4th place.
 - d) All prize money will be paid via Direct Debit within 7-15 days of Show day. Please ensure correct bank account number is shown on your entry via Showday online. We will follow up once & if no response received by 6th March 2023 prize money will be forfeited.
 - e) **Showing Classes – Prize money will be paid out as per number of entries as follows:**
 - **1 Entry:** 1st Prize \$10.00
 - **2-3 Entries:** 1st Prize \$15.00
 - **4 Entries** 1st Prize \$15.00, 2nd Prize \$10.00
 - **5 & Over Entries:** 1st Prize \$15.00, 2nd Prize \$10.00, 3rd Prize \$5.00
 - f) **Jumping Classes – Prize money will be paid out as per number of entries as follows:**
 - **1 Entry:** 1st Prize – Paid out at the specified class award for 2nd Place
 - **2-3 Entries:** 1st Prize – Paid out at the specified class award for 1st Place
 - **4 Entries:** 1st Prize & 2nd Prize – Paid out at the specified class award for 1st & 2nd Place
 - **5 & Over Entries:** 1st, 2nd & 3rd Prize – Paid out at the specified class award for 1st, 2nd & 3rd Place
6. Judging starts at stated times in catalogue (subject to change – competitors will be notified) & all competitors must be ready at these times. Classes will NOT BE HELD UP to wait for any late competitors.
7. Any person wishing to exhibit stock other than provided for in this schedule must gain permission from committee.
8. Temporary Pen fencing is NOT PERMITTED. **Refer RAS GR 7.**
9. For district classes horse/pony & rider to have resided in the Murchison District for three months prior to show or at discretion of organising committee.
10. **DISTRICT CLASS BOUNDARIES: Top of Hope Saddle, St Arnaud, Rainey River, Springs Junction & TDC Boundary in the Buller Gorge**
11. No competitor/exhibitor or member of their family shall approach a Judge in regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Show's Equestrian Convenor/Equestrian Secretary/Manager/Ring Master Steward, the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day. *Refer RAS Rule J 20*
12. Judges may be subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances.
13. **Hats & Safety Helmets – RAS Ruling GR4**
 - a) In all cases current WorkSafe NZ rules prevail.

- b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.
 - c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz-equestrian>. RAS will advise any changes via their website & Facebook.
 - d) All hats/helmets conform as per (c) must be identified by the current red or yellow tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. *The Equestrian Convenor can tag legal helmets if required to.*
14. **Whiskers and Inner Ears Trimming**, as from 1 January 2022:

15. **Refund of Entry Fees**
 The committee of the Murchison A&P Association reserves the right to authorise the refund of entry fees at a rate of 75% upon submission of:
- a) Receipt & written explanation as to the reason for the request, or
 - b) Veterinary or doctor's certificate no later than three (3) days after show day.
 - c) No refunds will be paid at the show. (Please do not ask).
16. **Novice Rules**
- a) All Novice pony classes are open to riders of any age, in novice pony classes only, except that special rules are in place for ridden stallions (see Age of Riders).
 - b) A Novice exhibit or rider is one that has yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show/Event. Number of wins is counted at time of show not time of entry.
 - c) Once an exhibit has achieved six (6) wins in any RAS section, the exhibit is not eligible to return to 'Novice' status even if it changes sections.
 - d) Novice exhibits are eligible for Open classes.
 - e) The number of Novice wins is to be counted at the time of the Show/Event, not the time of entry. If a Novice entry exceeds the permitted number of wins by the day of the Show/Event, the competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and change to an Open class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the Show/Event.
 - f) Novice classes are open to riders of any age. With the exception of Novice pony stallions must be ridden by a rider fourteen (14) years & over. *Refer RAS Rule CDE 11*
 - g) Novice champions are not eligible for open championships unless they have won their open class, nor are they eligible for Supreme award. Championship award does not count as a win.
17. Age of all horses/ponies entered will be determined as at the 1 August 2022. Exhibits under 3 years of age are not permitted to be entered in any ridden classes.
18. Open ponies must be ridden by riders under 17 years of age (Age as of 1 August 2022) this rule also applies in the same manner for riding classes e.g., if you are 11 years old on 1 August, then turn 12 on 2 August you complete the season as an 11 year old.
19. Riders in horse rings (exhibits over 148cm) must be twelve (12) years & over.
20. Whips in Ridden classes (excluding Lead Rein & First Ridden) shall not exceed 76 cm in length.
21. **Stallions & Colts** - *Refer RAS Rule CDE 14*
- a) All stallions & colts must be shown in a bit with the exception of Foals & Miniature Horses, & Shetland Pony Yearlings. A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
 - b) It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two RAS official (2) armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands from RAS Head Office.
 - c) Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

- d) Open pony stallions must be ridden by a rider fourteen (14), or fifteen (15), or sixteen (16) years of age, led handlers must be fourteen (14) years & over. *Refer RAS Rule CDE 11*

22. **HOY QUALIFYING SECTIONS** – Murchison A&P Show is a Horse of the Year Qualifying Show for the following Sections:

23. In all rings first prize winners only to parade for Champion. Once the judge has selected his/her Champion, the second placed getter to the Champion must be allowed to parade for Reserve Champion.

24. **Yellow Card**

This show supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system. A Yellow Card will be issued in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution & the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated show/event/registered measuring stand & their grounds & their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the person responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz

25. **Clean Sport**

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society NZ in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event & that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance – any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

26. **Arrears**

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

27. **Summary of RAS Resolution Process**

The full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, as per RAS Resolution Process, the show must forward this to the RAS CEO who will facilitate the necessary process.

28. **Protests**

Must be made in writing & lodged with the Equestrian Convenor or Equestrian Head Steward within 45 minutes of any situation occurring/posted result/after prize ribbons have been given out.

No protest will be considered later than 45 minutes after the prize ribbons are affixed.

Any exhibitor/persons entering a protest must deposit \$50.00 which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. If the protest is lodged before the judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the exhibitor. If protest is lodged after that, the onus of proof will rest with the party protesting. All correctly lodged protests will be considered by the 'Judicial Executive' made up of The Equestrian Head Steward, the Equestrian Convenor & Show President. All protests will be considered as soon as practicable & there should be no appeal from their decision.

29. **Entry Forms**

- 1: This is a legal document. The Owner/parent/guardian signing or authorising the entry must be 18 years or over.
- 2: The attention of exhibitors is particularly drawn to the conditions relating to the misuse of

substances & the intention of the Committee to undertake testing for forbidden substances.

3: Exhibitor Declaration:

The submission of my entries and/or participation in the competition(s), either written or by electronic means, demotes that I have read & accepted the RAS and Murchison A&P Association Rules & Regulations & the Association's Conditions of Entry. This also indemnifies the Murchison A&P Assn under the provisions of Health and Safety at Work Act 2015, & any amendments.

30. Height Certificates

Where classes are defined by height, the person responsible must carry a current RAS Height/Performance Certificate or Life Certificate for their exhibit & must produce it upon request to any authorized Show/Event personnel. Any competitor unable to produce a RAS Certificate means that the exhibit is ineligible to compete & will forfeit any awards.

Temporary Measuring Certificates

Are for specific circumstances only & under strict guidelines.

The underlying principle behind a temporary measuring certificate is for those new and/or local riders that only go to their local show/s. Our Local boundaries are within the Murchison-Maruaia district boundaries. RAS Rulings apply.

If you require a Temporary Measuring Certificate contact the Equestrian Convener to book your horse/pony into the scheduled measuring times. Friday and Saturday between 6 & 7pm. Bookings essential.

31. Yards

Uncovered Yards are available for booking at time of entry at \$10 per night per horse. Yards booked for Friday night only must be vacated & left clean no later than 4.00pm on Saturday so that they can be reallocated to Exhibitors who have booked the yards for Saturday night. Yard fees must be paid at time of entering with entry fees. Please indicate which nights you require your yards for. There are only 66 big yards & 5 Mini sized yards available they will be allocated on a 'first in first served basis so please ensure you get your entries in early to secure a yard if required.

Please tidy up after your horse & leave your yard clean. Manure pile next to all weather arena.

Please ask if you need special yarding conditions prior to the show.

32. Camping

Camping Fees: \$20 per truck/float for the weekend. Please pay at time of entering.

Camping is permitted in your truck/float or tent set up within the equestrian parking area over show weekend from 3pm on Friday 17th February 2023. (Non-powered sites)

Hot showers & toilets are provided within the Murchison Sports & Recreation Centre from Friday evening through to Sunday afternoon for campers only.

Only Horses & ponies staying on the show grounds must be entered in the Murchison A&P Show (due to limited space).

All horses are on these grounds at the owner's risk. All camping and riding is done so at your own risk. Please enjoy your stay.

33. Entry Fees

- Must be paid for at time of entering or entry will not be processed.
- Late entries prior to the show after the closing date may be accepted at the discretion of the organization but will incur a \$15.00 penalty.
- Late entries on show day if accepted must be into the Equestrian Secretary by 8:00am, a 50% penalty will apply in all classes & will not be catalogued. (Cash only as no eftpos available at the Equestrian Secretary tent).
- Alterations to entries or scratching's will not be taken by phone – please email to murchison.equestrian@gmail.com. Alterations to entries will incur a \$3.00 surcharge.
- Class Entry Fees are noted per ring.
- Entry Fees include the RAS Equestrian Levy of \$1.15 per class.

Other applicable charges:

- Ground Fee of \$5 per Horse/Pony
- Admin Fee of \$5 per Exhibitor
- Prepaid Catalogues \$5 Per catalogue

COVID19: If the show is unable to proceed due to government restrictions relating to COVID19, entry fees will be refunded less the \$5 Admin Fee. By entering our show, you hereby agree to this.
