RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Rules and Regulations for the government of affiliated shows as approved by the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ will be observed as outlined on RAS Website www.ras.org.nz

Equestrian Events - Conditions of Entry

Please read before sending your entries.

1. **NO CROSSING THE TRACK BEFORE 7.30 a.m. under any circumstances. Doing so may result in disqualification.**
2. Entry fees must accompany entry forms. **Entries close 5pm Friday 10th February; 2023.** Late entries will be accepted via Evo Events only until 5pm Thursday 16th February 2023 at an additional fee of \$30.00 per horse.
3. **The Committee reserves the right to alter the programme by adding, combining or deleting events at their discretion at any time.**
4. All protests must be in writing, and must be lodged with the Show Secretary within 1 hour of the class being judged, together with a fee of \$75.00
5. The RAS Yellow Card system (as per resolution of 2017 remits) is in place and may be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors, or any other third party connected with the show bringing the showing movement into disrepute, or in cases of abuse to animals, as per the RAS equestrian competitors and judges rulebook and the RAS showing rules. The Yellow Card System is included within the Complaints Procedure as above.
6. No horse may not compete in both the Hack / Park Hack or Pony / Saddle Hunter Pony rings.
7. A Novice is a horse or pony or rider that has yet to win 6 classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show.
8. Ponies must not be over 148cm high and the riders must be under 17 years of age. Adults may ride novice ponies only. All horses and ponies must have current height certificates before entering the ring and the certificate must be produced if requested by the Stewards. Failure to produce a current certificate will result in prizes being withheld.
9. Pens. Horses and ponies may only use the pens allocated and paid for at time of entry. Any horses or ponies using pens not allocated may be liable to disqualification. Preference will be given to overnighters.
10. Hard Hats Must Be Worn by ALL Riders and tagged with the current RED tag. RAS specifications apply. (Refer to section GR4)
11. Stewards may combine events where there are insufficient entries.
12. Monetary prizes may be substituted with product or vouchers at the Steward's discretion.
13. The use of any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems is strictly forbidden. (refer to CS section of RAS Manual).
14. Random Clean Sport testing may occur at the discretion and organisation of the R.A.S.
15. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animals Legislation and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2016 and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution.

16. Covid 19 restrictions will be in place as per Government instructions at the time of the show. The Tauranga A&P Association or any other organisations in conjunction with the show will not be held accountable for any cancellation of all or part of the show.
17. Any rider effected by regional alert level changes will be eligible for a full refund less admin and EvoEvent fees. If the whole event is cancelled due to Covid 19 prior to the 10th February 2023, all riders will receive a full refund less admin and EvoEvent fees. If the event is cancelled after this date, any refunds will be at the discretion of the Tauranga A&P Committee.
18. Scanning of QR codes and/or manual recording for all entering the show grounds is mandatory.
19. If less than 4 horses in any ring prize money will be paid to 1st and 2nd place getters only.
20. **NO LUNGING** in the rings.
21. **SCRATCHING:** Refund of entry fees will be considered if scratchings are made in writing officially to the Secretary by Tuesday prior to the Show. Refunds will be 50% of the original entry fee excluding EvoEvents admin fees. Veterinary/Doctor Certificate is required for scratchings during the show. Refunds are at the discrepancy of the Show Committee.

Lead Rein Ponies must be led by a leader/attendant (14 years and over) with the leading rein attached to the cavesson noseband of a snaffle bridle. Lead Rein Ponies will be asked to walk and trot - no cantering under any circumstances. Running or bearing reins or similar tackle are not allowed.

Equestrian Events - Conditions of Entry

Please read before sending your entries.

Pleasure Horse or Pony means those animals who do not fit the mould of a Show Horse or Pony. We welcome any breed (e.g Appaloosas, Quarter Horses, Standardbreds, Clyde X etc) and colour. They should be an uncomplicated and genuine pleasure to ride. Whilst they do not possess the show quality conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride, with impeccable manners.

A "pleasure mount" is NOT an inexperienced mount with show quality conformation who is destined for the open show ring.

- From 1st August 2015, for a horse or pony to meet the annual title show qualification requirements, they MUST be registered with NZEPS.
- Horses or ponies must never have placed 1st in an open ring class including working hunter. However, members may apply for dispensation to NZEPS. (please note – open show ring includes wins in novice classes in a defined open i.e saddle hunter, park hack etc) this also includes NZ Show Council and Showing Championships.
- Ordinary snaffle bit As per Dressage NZ definition only, no poll action. No bit guards, shadow rolls, ear plug muffs or bonnets, martingales (beast plates are allowed) or tie downs.
- Use of illegal gear at events prior to competition in a pleasure class. It is noted that pleasure horses often compete in classes other than pleasure in gear not allowed. The following rule has been adopted 4th July 2021 – No pleasure mount shall present to the ring i.e warmup area directly before classes, this includes the use of dressage whips spurs and other gadgets.
- Bitless bridles are only permitted in Recreational Pleasure Classes.
- Only cavesson nosebands are permitted, no strapping below the bit.
- Whips maybe carried but must not exceed 76cm in length.
- All riders must wear a 3 point harness helmet to the current NZ safety Standard or an equivalent standard and be red tagged.
- Spurs are not to be worn.
- Riders maybe registered with other bodies.
- Riders may have competed outside the Pleasure Horse or Pony Section.
- Riders in Pony classes must be under 17 years old (proof of riders age maybe requested). Age is taken as at 1st August.
- Children riding hacks must compete in the Horse Classes.
- Adults may ride ponies in Horse Classes without prejudice.
- Pleasure mounts may compete in recognized breed and colour classes i.e Welsh and Pinto classes but should not compete in the RAS inhand classes i.e Sporthorse, Thoroughbred or Inhand Pony sections.
- • Stallions may compete in this section however it is up to the discretion of each show committee as to whether they choose to allow stallions onsite.

Equestrian Events - Conditions of Entry

Please read before sending your entries.

1. **NO CROSSING THE TRACK BEFORE 7.30am under any circumstances. Doing so may result in disqualification.**
2. The Rules, Regulations and Bylaws of the Royal Agricultural Society will apply. (Refer to GR1)
3. Entry fees must accompany entry forms. **Entries close 5pm 10th February 2023.** Late entries will be accepted via EvoEvents only until 5pm Thursday 16th February 2023 at an additional fee of \$30.00 per horse.
4. The Committee reserves the right to alter the programme by adding or deleting events at their discretion.
5. Any competitor jumping his/her horse in the ring before any event is liable for disqualification.
6. As per the RAS Resolution Process adopted in June 2018, all protests must be in writing and detail the specific RAS or "Host" Association rule that has been breached. The protest must be lodged with the Show Secretary, preferably at the time of the incident or within 10 days of the date of the incident. Any protest lodged outside of this time frame will not be considered. A \$50 deposit must accompany the protest.

The RAS Yellow Card system (as per resolution of 2017 remits) is in place and may be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors, or any other third party connected with the show bringing the showing movement into disrepute, or in cases of abuse to animals, as per the RAS equestrian competitors and judges rulebook and the RAS showing rules. The Yellow Card System is included within the Complaints Procedure as above.
7. No horse may compete in both the Hack / Park Hack or Pony / Saddle Hunter Pony rings.
8. A Novice is a horse or pony or rider that has yet to win 6 classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show.
9. **Champion Novice Pony.** In the event a pony 138cm and under win, they shall compete in the Champion Pony 138cm and under. Should a Novice Pony 138cm and over win, they compete in the 138cm and under 148cm Champion Pony Class.
10. Ponies must not be over 148cm high and the riders must be under 17 years of age. All horses and ponies must have approved height certificates before entering the ring and the certificate must be produced if requested by the Stewards. Failure to produce a current certificate will result in prizes being withheld.
11. **Pens.** Horses and ponies may only use the pens allocated and paid for at time of entry. Any horses or ponies using pens not allocated may be liable to disqualification. Preference will be given to overnight competitors.
12. **Local Events** – The local area is defined as the Bay of Plenty region.
13. **Hard Hats Must Be Worn by ALL Riders and must be tagged with the approved RED tag.** RAS specifications apply. (Refer to section GR4)
14. Stewards may combine events where there are insufficient entries.
15. The use of any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems is strictly forbidden. (refer to CS section of RAS Manual).
