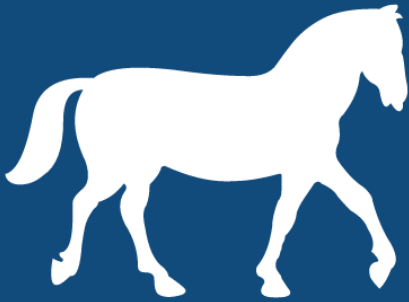

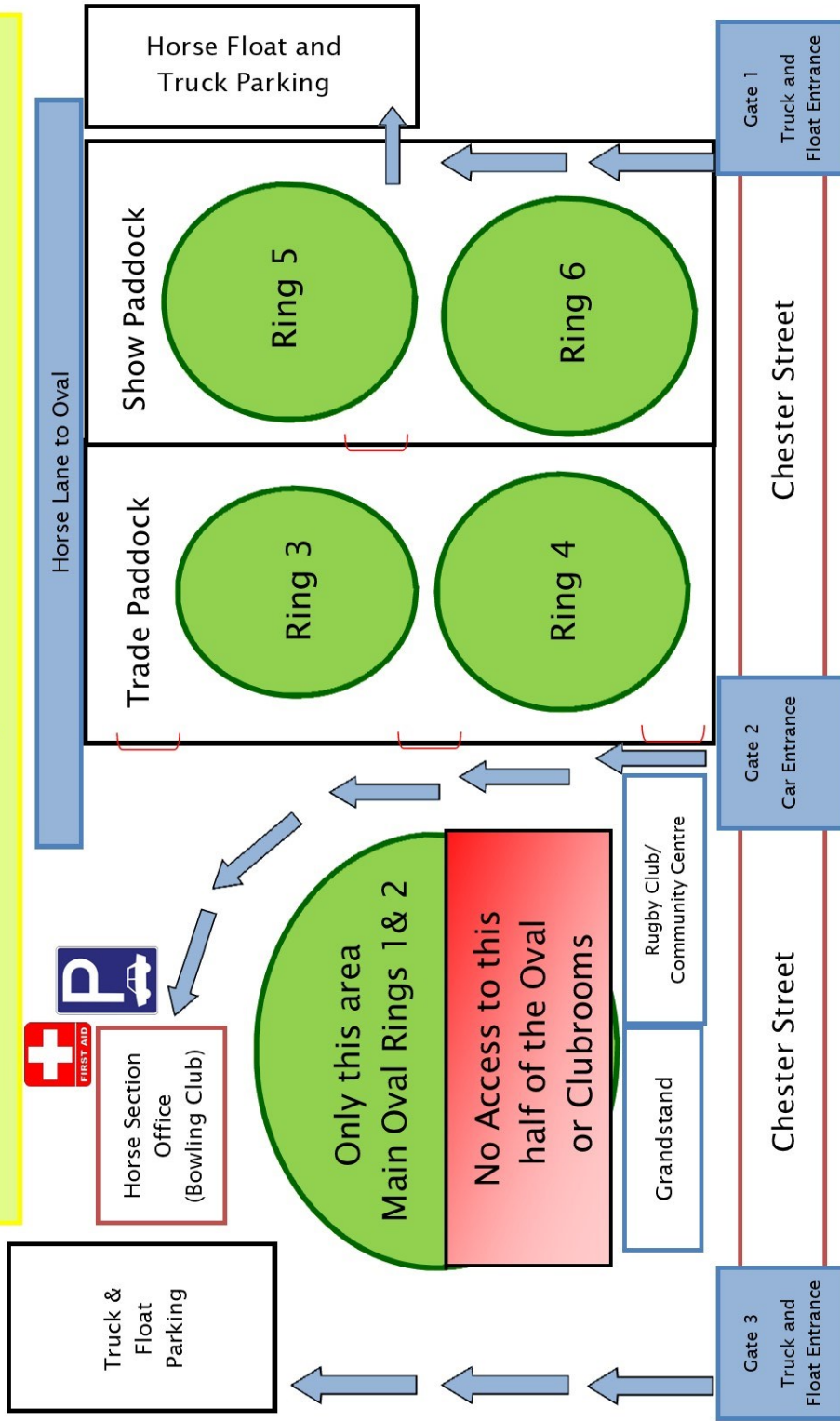




1. No late entries – all entries to be completed by 9pm Thursday 17th November 2022.
2. All entries must be completed via EvoEvents www.evoevents.co.nz
3. All competitors compete at own risk.
4. **Safety Helmets: Please abide by new ruling from RAS and ESNZ.**
<https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/>
5. There is to be no trimming of whiskers, eye or inner ear hair/whiskers of horses/ponies competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events. This is in line with the same animal welfare approach taken by the Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) and New Zealand Pony Clubs Association (NZPCA).

6. Open ponies must be ridden by riders 16 years and under.
7. Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age. Ponies may compete in Show Pony section or Saddle Hunter Pony section, **not both**.
8. Ponies competing in Show Pony or Saddle Hunter Pony are NOT eligible to compete in Junior Rider classes held on Tuesday 15th November 2022 or Recreational Junior Rider held on Saturday 19th November 2022.
9. Age of horse, pony and rider as of 1st August 2022.
10. **Show Ring: Current RAS Height/Performance Cards or Life Certificate must be produced on request in both HOYQ and non HOYQ classes. Copies to be attached to entry forms.**
11. Ring Stewards will record Novice wins on performance cards at the conclusion of each class. Show Entry Secretary can sign attendance cards.
12. Back numbers must be worn EXCEPT for Recreational Classes.
13. **CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES:** Horse and Pony Championships are judged from the open conformation classes only (excluding novice, & paced and mannered classes) with first place getters being paraded for Champion. Second place getters to Champion being invited to parade for Reserve Champion.
14. **In the event of only one competitor in Open Classes, the Champion will be awarded at the discretion of the judge and still be eligible for Supreme.**
15. **Stallions and Colts:** It is compulsory for all Stallions and Colts to be shown in a bit, (except Foals, Miniature horses and Shetland yearlings), and must wear two (2) official “S” ID badges attached to each side of their bridle or halter, at all times. Handlers/Riders must wear a Hi Viz vest when outside the ring, and riders of stallions must wear 2 RAS Stallion armbands. (see Rule CDE 11 g) and i) for ages of stallion riders/handlers).
16. **Pleasure Senior Horses/Ponies:** Show horses/ponies not eligible for this section.
All classes, except the Best Registered Combination, are open to both unregistered and registered with NZ Equestrian Pleasure Society.

17. All competitors or legal guardians to acknowledge the exhibitor declaration on entry via EvoEvents. The attention of exhibitors is particularly drawn to the conditions relating to the misuse of substances, and the intention of the Committee to undertake testing for forbidden substances.

18. This Show supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz.
19. **Clean Sport** - The Rules of the Royal A&P Society of New Zealand regarding Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the person's responsible risk.
Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina or courage or conduct of a horse or pony by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.
20. **Arrears** - No person who is in arrears regarding entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
21. **Summary of RAS Resolution Process** - the full process can be found on the RAS website. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is regarding an RAS official, the show to forward it on to the RAS CEO to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
22. **LEGAL LIABILITY:** Our Association's Public Liability policy does not cover Competitors or Exhibitors. Each Exhibitor is responsible for their own Liability Insurance and must supervise and control their animals at all times. Exhibitors must comply with Animal Legislation and Health & Safety at Work Act 2015 and subsequent amendments.
23. **ALL DOGS** to be on leash.
24. **STABLES/YARDS** are available at the Waverley Racecourse.
For bookings email ONLY please: bdsimson@farmside.co.nz . All stables, yards and areas around floats & trucks must be left clean. Please place any hay/sawdust/manure etc in bins designated for this.
25. **SHOW LEVY:** \$10 per mount.
26. **REFUNDS:** Requests to be made in writing and will be less 20%.
27. **Covid-19 Refunds:** If the Show is cancelled, we will refund 100% of class entry fees and the RAS/ Show levies, less any EvoEvents fees that are incurred when entering.
28. **CHANGES:** \$2.00 per class. Cash or DC—no eftpos available.
29. **PROTESTS:** Every objection or protest must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the Class in question, signed by the person making complaint and delivered to the Secretary. The objector shall, at the time of making such objection, lodge sum of \$50.00 which shall be forfeited to the Association should the objection be considered frivolous or vexatious. The deposit will be refunded if protest is upheld.
30. **START TIMES:** Are approximate only but will be adhered to as closely as possible.
31. **RAS Equestrian Levy** of \$1.15 per class will be charged in addition to the class entry fee.
32. **CUPS:** All cups will be retained by the Waverley A&P Association and engraving costs will be met.
33. After receiving all entries, sections that have classes with no entries or insufficient entries may be cancelled or merged with another class. Committee reserves the right to alter the programme.

Health & Safety

Helmet Tagging

All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showground or the grounds of an affiliated Event. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/>. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook. All hats/helmets that conform must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS.

Falls/Concussions and Reporting

The Waverley A&P Association follows the RAS/ESNZ guidelines in regard to helmets, falls, concussion and injury reporting.

Whilst we will provide basic first aid—a First Aid Certificate held by a designated person and a basic first aid kit and suitable indoor facility if required—in the event of a fall, in any part of the grounds including warm up areas and parking, the rider will be responsible for their own decision to remount. If an injury is sustained that requires further treatment, the Committee will call for necessary medical assistance and the appropriate record of the event will be completed. The rider/injured party is responsible for ensuring appropriate follow up treatment is sought following this event.

Riders/Spectators enter the grounds at their own risk.

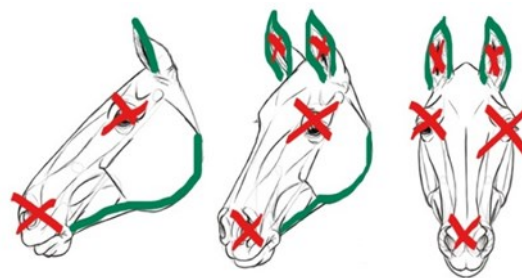

INFORMATION AROUND WHISKER, EYE & EAR TRIMMING AT RAS AFFILIATED A&P SHOWS & EVENTS

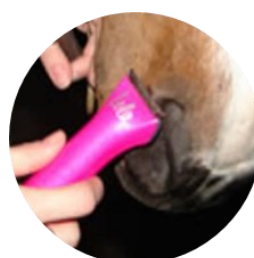
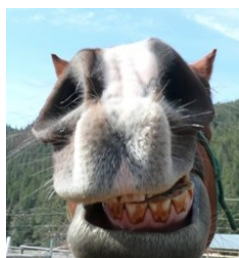
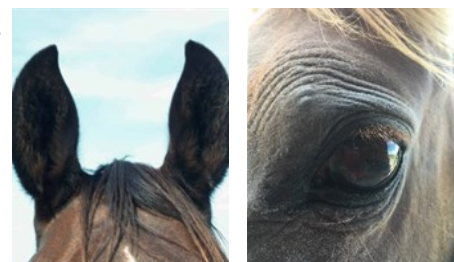


From 1 January 2022, the trimming of a horse/pony's whiskers, eye and inner ear hair is banned for any horses/ponies exhibiting or competing at affiliated A&P Shows or Kindred Events.

RAS Equestrian Rule – GR. 6

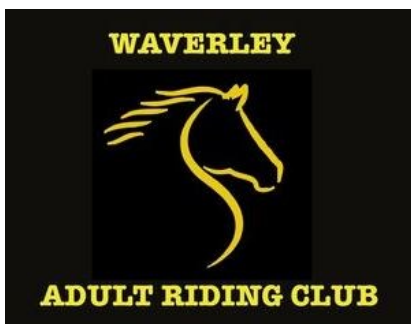
- The Royal Agricultural Society (RAS) has teamed with Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ) and NZ Pony Club (and the FEI from 2021) and banned the trimming of whiskers, eye and inner ear hair for horses and ponies competing at affiliated A&P Shows and Kindred Events from the 1 January 2022.
- RAS rules state GR6 Abuse of Exhibits b) Abuse can be defined as intentionally acting in a way, which may cause pain or unnecessary discomfort to a horse.
- RAS further considers other examples of abuse (but not limited to): whip or beat an exhibit excessively; subject an exhibit to any kind of electric shock device; excessive or persistent use of spurs; or to jab the exhibit in the mouth with the bit; remount or attempt to remount an obviously exhausted, lame or injured exhibit; rap an exhibit anywhere in or outside the grounds of the event; hyper sensitise any part of an exhibit; leave exhibit without adequate food, drink and exercise.
- Any person witnessing any form of abuse should utilise the RAS Resolution Process. For the purposes of this matter - illegal trimming of whiskers, eye or inner ear hair – from 1 January 2022 a protest form should be filed with the affiliated A&P Show/Kindred Event, citing the rule broken as being GR6 b. All affiliated Shows & Events have a template protest form available through the RAS Resolution Process which can be found here: <https://www.ras.org.nz/wp-content/uploads/2018/08/RAS-Resolution-Process-updated-2018.doc.pdf>.
- From the 1 January 2022, any upheld protests regarding the matter of whisker, eye & inner ear trimming should be handled in the following manner:
 - * The exhibitor/competitor is to be given a copy of the RAS whisker, eye & ear trimming pamphlet for educational purposes.
 - *The exhibitor/competitor and horse/pony are to be asked to leave the show ring
 - *Any prizes, ribbons and/or placings are to be forfeited.
- Please note all RAS Equestrian Judges will be advised, when judging, they are not to discriminate against facial whiskers and hair.

- Horses have whiskers on their face around their eyes and muzzle (nose and lips). In these locations whiskers not only help protect delicate tissue, but also help compensate for the blind spots a horse has in front of its face and underneath its nose.
- A horse's whiskers (called vibrissae) are actually an incredibly important sense to them. The whiskers around the eyes and muzzle are extremely sensitive and have a rich nerve supply.
- Ear hair serves a few special functions: to protect the inner ear skin from bugs, sun, and foreign objects. The outer edge of the ear also grows some hair, and in some cases, it can get pretty wild.
- With ears you can find a happy medium – clip the edges of the ear by folding it like a taco and zipping your clippers down the outside of the ear. Leave the insides.

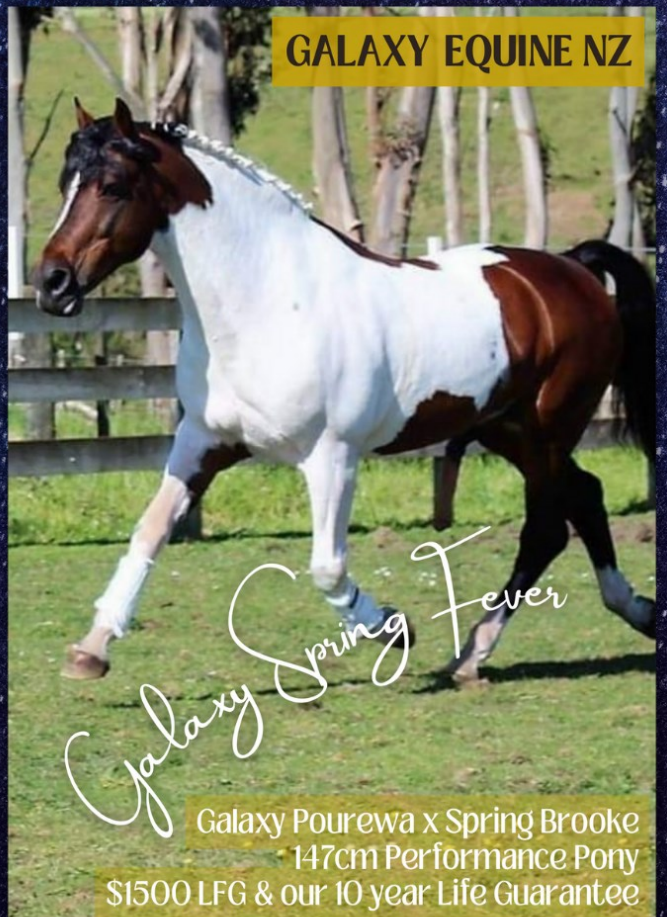

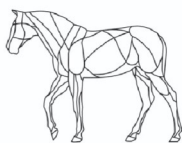

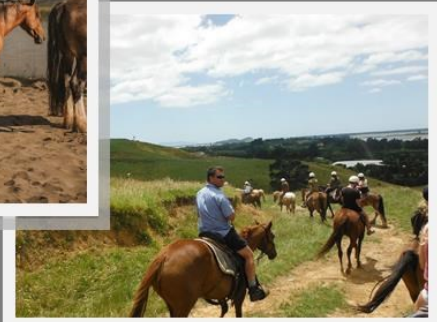
