Completion of Entry Forms

- Entries must be made on the official entry forms, signed and accompanied by full payment and be received by the Show Manager on or before the closing dates advertised in the schedule.
- Incomplete, incorrect or unsigned entry forms will be returned to competitors for correction. This requirement applies to all competitors, including members of the Association that have not as yet paid their annual subscription but who have calculated entry fees using the discount available to members.
- All entries must be made in the name of the bona-fide owner of the exhibits hereinafter called the competitor, and such exhibits must have been the property of the competitor at the time of entry. Registered lessees of animals are permitted to enter under their own name.
- A valid RAS Highland passport must accompany highland cattle entries into RAS classes. Entries received without a passport will not be accepted.
- A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to entry forms.

Confirmation of Entries

- Confirmation of entries - A confirmation of entries showing all details of your entries will be returned to competitor following data processing. Your entry form will NOT be returned to you.
- Responsibility - It will be the competitor's responsibility, to check the details on the confirmation of entries carefully and ensure that all details are correct. Any alterations to classes must be made to the Secretary by 4pm Friday 17 February 2023 in writing (email). NO EXCEPTIONS.

Substitutions

- Substitutions must be advised in writing (email) by 5pm Tuesday 21 February 2023. Substitutions will only be accepted for the same number of entries already entered. No additional entries will be accepted.

Refund of Entry Fee

Competitors desiring a refund of entry fees must apply in writing enclosing a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate within SEVEN DAYS of the Show. Such applications will be considered by the committee, and if successful, refund will be made less 25%.

Competitors Entry Passes

Will be issued according to the following schedule -

Cattle - 1 - 7 cattle 2 passes, 8 cattle and over 3 passes.

Children Livestock - 1 pass per animal.

Goats – 1 – 4 goats 1 pass, 4 or more goats 2 passes.

Sheep – 1 – 4 sheep 1 pass, 4 or more sheep 2 passes.

Membership

- Annual individual membership of the Helensville A&P Association is \$30. Year is 1 June – 31 May.
- A membership application form is on our website

- Discounted membership entry fees are available to current members of the Helensville A&P Association. The Association's membership form may be completed and forwarded with entries.
- Children of members up to the age of 16 years are eligible to claim entry fee discount.

Local

Local owner or competitor is defined as resident within the Kumeu subdivision of Auckland Council.

Exhibiting

- Competitors will be called only twice to the ring at which time they will be automatically scratched.
- All scratchings must be advised to the Steward as soon as possible.

Disease Control

TB Status, as per the current Biosecurity requirements:

- All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd.
- A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to entry forms. The Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form.
- There are two documents required:
 1. TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area – all animals aged three months or older are to be TB tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with its current routine TB testing requirements.
 2. TB Animals Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards may be inspected at the unloading area.
- A NAIT approved RFID tag is mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.

- All animals being exhibited at the Show, including any participating in a hoof and hooks carcass competition, come under the standard identification and ASD regulations. These cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag.
- Where live cattle or deer form part of a trade display the exhibitor is responsible for:
 - Ensuring all stock have completed all TB testing requirements as per Animal Health Board testing regulations.
 - Ensuring all stock are identified in accordance with current legal requirements.
- PLEASE NOTE: To comply with M Bovis protection protocols and procedures please visit <https://www.mpi.govt.nz/dmsdocument/34401-mycoplasma-bovis-biosecurity-advice-for-cattle-showing-events> for more information.
- All sheep entered in the Show must be from a flock currently accredited Brucellosis free. Brucellosis Accreditation Certificates must accompany entry forms. Any entries received without accreditation will be returned to the competitor. Entries will be accepted from ABF breeders with status being confirmed by breed societies.
- No exhibit entered in the sheep classes will be allowed on the Showgrounds if infested with external parasites or suffering from foot rot.
- The Association shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection howsoever arising.
- Each competitor shall be deemed to have guaranteed to the Association, by signature on their entry form, and have given warranty that each exhibit entered by him/her or brought upon the Showgrounds, and every animal, bird, or other living thing brought by them onto the ground, is at the time of its entering upon the Showgrounds free of any contagious or infectious disease.
- Any competitor whose exhibit or animal that infringes this warranty shall be responsible to the Association, and to any other competitor who may suffer by reason of such breach. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous; the Association shall have the right to refuse admission of such exhibit to the Showgrounds or to remove the exhibit from the Showgrounds at the expense of the competitor.

Inspection

The Committee reserves the right to inspect at random any cattle for tattoos or identification to establish TB Status, or to detect any malpractice of presentation in Dairy Cattle.

Championships

In all rings first prize winners only to parade for champion. Once the champion has been selected the second placed animal to the champion MUST be allowed to parade for judging of the reserve champion.

Prize Money

Prize money in all classes will be awarded in full and will be paid electronically into the bank account specified by you on your entry form. Please allow four weeks for payment to be processed.

Value of Points

The Points for prizes are as follows:

- First Prize - 6 points
- Second Prize - 4 points
- Third Prize - 2 points
- Highly Commended - 1 point
- Champion - 2 points
- Reserve Champion - 1 point

In the event of a tie, the largest number of first prizes will decide the matter, and if that fails to decide, then the value of the prize will be divided equally amongst those who have tied.

Privacy Act

The Association holds records of names and addresses of all members and competitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show, media reports, or promotional purposes at the Association's discretion. The Association may take photographs and video images of members, competitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any competitor, and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media at the Association's discretion.

Rights of the Helensville A&P Committee

The Helensville A&P Committee reserves the right to, at any time, for any reason, and without notice (i) refuse or cancel any entry; (ii) alter the Show timetable; (iii) withdraw or change any event or class; (iv) request the removal from the Showgrounds of animals deemed unruly or dangerous, and (v) remove any dangerous or inappropriate exhibit or display.

Protests

- All protests must be in writing and may be lodged with the Secretary within one hour of the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of \$50 which shall be returned should the protest be sustained. Should the protest be lodged before the judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the competitor; thereafter, the onus of proof will be with the party protesting. No protest will be received later than one hour after the prize tickets/ribbons are affixed.
- The Helensville A&P Committee, or not less than three members thereof, will determine the results of all protests as soon as practicable. There shall be no appeal.

Health & Safety

- The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit, or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such competitors. By signing the entry form declaration, competitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.
- Each competitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds.
- Competitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.
- The Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds any animal it considers unruly or dangerous.
- It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property, and to make provision for the protection of the property of others, but the Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
- Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or other seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.

Parking is entirely at the owner's own risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or Stewards.

The aim of this competition is to:

- encourage young people to enhance their skills and knowledge of animal handling
- foster showmanship between competitors
- bridge the gap between calf club and the pedigree ring.

Ages as of October 1st of current Show season (competitors may be asked for proof of age on Show day):

- Juniors are to be aged 5 – 12 (inclusive)
- Seniors are to be aged 13 – 20 (inclusive)

- In both the dairy and beef competitions, junior competitors may only enter a calf and senior competitors may enter either a calf or yearling only.
- The competitor may only enter the beef or dairy class – not both.
- Judges are to line-up all competitors. Shows are to record the names of all entrants regardless of placing.
- Please note that this is not an overall accumulator competition, just a one-off Show day class.

Judging Guidelines

Presentation of the Competitor:

- The competitor is to wear a plain white shirt with dark pants and clean, strong, appropriate boots for cattle handling. No open footwear or gumboots are permitted.
- No logos or advertising whatsoever are permitted. This includes on hats and breed uniforms.

Presentation of the Animal

- The conformation of the animal itself is not to be judged – however general presentation is to be taken into consideration. It is expected that the competitor has prepared the animal sufficiently themselves and is encouraged to know basic information about the animal such as birth date, breeding and rearing.
- Rope, leather, chain and nylon halters are permitted and should be clean and fit the animal correctly.
- For beef competitors if a show stick or cane is carried, it is to be used correctly.

Parading of the Animal

- The competitor should aim to display the animal in such a manner that the judge gains a clear view of the animal at all times and that the animal is seen to the best of its ability.
- Emphasis is placed on the effort of the competitor to be able to parade and handle in general regardless of the particular animal on the end of the halter, therefore senior competitors will be requested to swap animals (juniors will not).
- The competitor should be able to stop, move the animal on and keep the animal under control whilst being aware of where the judge is in the ring.
- Outside assistance is not permitted under any circumstances and competitors will be disqualified.

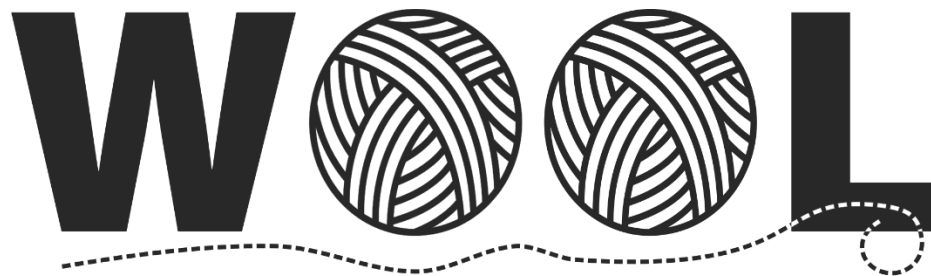

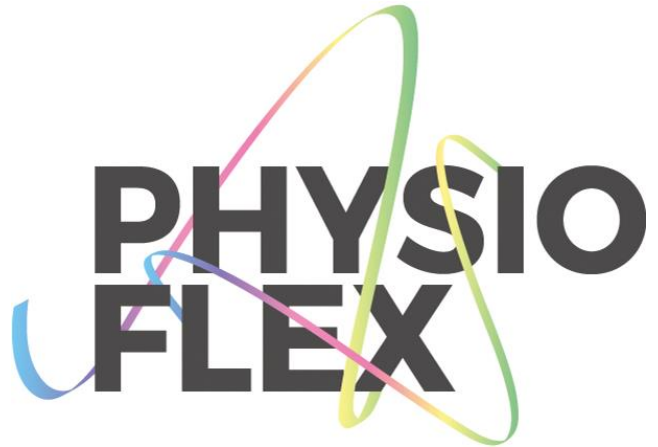

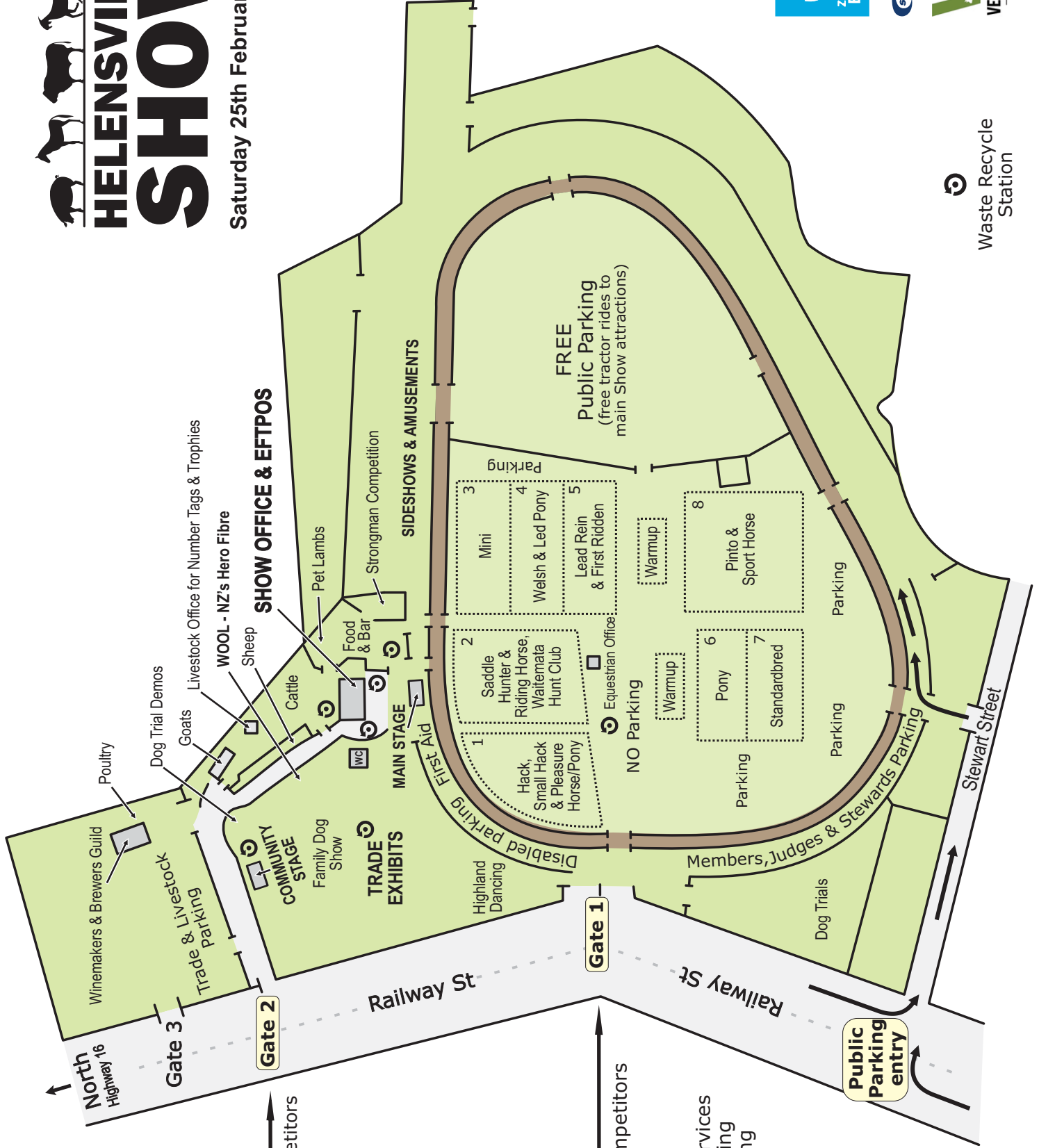
