2. Depot for Indoor exhibits—  
Dargaville Sewing and Curtain Centre no later than 10:00am on Friday 10th February 2023 **Definitely no Food items to be left.**
3. **Please place entries as early as possible with the Indoor Secretary so that entries can be processed.**
4. **Children aged 15 years and over to enter in the Open Section.**
5. Judging of the Indoor Section will take place on the day preceding the show.
6. **All exhibits must be staged in the Arapohue Hall, with tickets attached, ready for judging by 11:00am on Friday 10th February 2023.**  
Only judges and stewards in the hall after that time.
7. Only Cut Flowers and Dahlias may be post entry.
8. **ENTRY FEES:** Adults—50 cents per entry, Children—20 cents per entry unless otherwise stated.
9. **PRIZE MONEY:** 1st—\$2.00, 2nd—\$1.00. Prize money may be replaced with products/vouchers from sponsors.
10. Prizes will be paid in the Secretary's Office at 3:15pm on Saturday 11th February 2023.

### **CLASS 79 (1) RUAWAI KUMARA CAKE**

½ cup butter

1 cup cooked mashed kumara

½ tsp cinnamon

½ tsp salt

½ cup nuts

1 cup sugar

2 tsp baking powder

½ tsp cloves

2 eggs

½ tsp nutmeg

¼ tsp soda

2 cups flour

½ cup milk

#### **METHOD:**

1. Cream butter & sugar
2. Beat in the eggs one at a time blending thoroughly
3. Blend in the kumara
4. Sift all the dry ingredients together and add the kumara mixture alternately with the milk
5. Add the nuts
6. Mix the batter well
7. Place the mixture in two papered and greased sponge tins
8. Bake at 180 deg C
9. Cool and ice with caramel icing

**(2) KOPURU KUMARA CAKE**

2 cups Shredded kumara	1 $\frac{1}{3}$ cups water	1 $\frac{1}{3}$ cups sugar
1 cup raisins	3 tbsp butter	$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp allspice
$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt	$\frac{1}{4}$ tsp cloves	2 cups flour
2 tsp baking soda	1 cup chopped nuts	

**METHOD:**

1. Combine raw shredded kumara, water, sugar, raisins and butter in a pot and cook five minutes after coming to the boil
2. Put pot in cold water to cool
3. Sift the dry ingredients together and add the cooled mixture
4. Beat well
5. Add the nuts and mix thoroughly
6. Bake at 160 deg C in a prepared tin
7. Cool and ice with lemon or orange icing

**CLASS 80—KUMARA MUFFINS**

1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sifted flour	2 table spoon brown sugar
1 tablespoon baking powder	1 tspn salt
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup coarsely chopped walnuts	
1 beaten egg	$\frac{3}{4}$ cup milk
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups mashed kumara	$\frac{1}{4}$ cup melted butter
Sugar	Cinnamon

**METHOD:**

1. Sift together flour, brown sugar, baking powder & salt
2. Add walnuts
3. Combine eggs, milk kumara & butter. Mix well
4. Add to dry ingredients, mix until just moist
- 5 Fill muffin pans  $\frac{2}{3}$  full, sprinkle cinnamon & sugar over
- 6 Bake at 212C for 30 to 35 minutes.



**CLASS 81      KUMARA SCONES**

2 oz. (50g) butter

1 egg

Salt

¼ cup sugar

½ cup milk

1 cup mashed kumara

2—2 & ½ cups self raising flour

**METHOD:**

1. Cream butter and sugar
2. Mix kumara, egg and milk
3. Add sufficient flour to obtain a scone consistency
4. Roll out
5. Cut into squares and place on a cold oven tray
6. Bake at 200 deg C for 20 minutes

**CLASS 82      (1) KUMARA LOAF**

½ cup cooked mashed kumara

2 cups self-rising flour

1 cup mixed dried fruit

½ cup sugar

1 tsp cinnamon

1 cup milk

**TOPPING:**

1½ tbsp sugar                      ½ tsp cinnamon

**METHOD:**

1. Place all ingredients together in bowl and beat at medium speed until well combined
2. Put into a greased loaf tin
3. Sprinkle with topping ingredients
4. Bake at 190 degrees C for about an hour or until firm when pressed

**(2) KUMARA LOAF**

1 cup cold mashed kumara

2½ cups self rising flour

Pinch of salt

1 tsp mixed spice

1 tsp ginger

225 grms butter

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

1 packet mixed fruit

**METHOD:**

1. Cream the butter and sugar
2. Add the eggs one at a time beating well after each addition
3. Add mashed kumara, salt and spices, with the mixed fruit
4. Mix well and bake at 180 degrees C for 2 hours

**(3) KUMARA LOAF**

1 cup mashed cooked kumara

2 cups self rising flour

1 cup dates

½ cup bran

¾ cup brown sugar

1 tbsp golden syrup

1 cup water

**METHOD**

1. Blend all ingredients together
2. Add warm water
3. Stir well, then place in a greased loaf tin
4. Bake at 180 degrees C for about 40 minutes

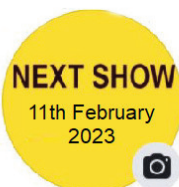
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
