Due to Mycoplasma Bovis, cattle from different herds must be kept TWO meters apart

- 3 Entry Forms must be filled in by exhibitor or some person authorized by him or her, and the entries are made subject to all Rules and Regulations of the Association in all respects.
- 4 A \$5.75 levy is to be charged for RAS per in-milk cow, per show i.e if an in-milk cow is entered in more than one class at a show then the levy is still \$5.75. There is no levy on exhibiting young stock.



BIO-SECURITY

A massive amount of work has been done by a large number of people from the agricultural bio-security system over the past few years. MPI, TBfree, NAIT and Ospri should be congratulated and applauded for their efforts. TB is heading downwards and Mbovis is close to being eliminated.

But its not time to relax yet!

The full use of the NAIT system is what is making all these improvements possible. Te Aroha AP&H Show will fully comply to and support our exhibitors in compliance to using the NAIT system.

**All cattle will be checked for a NAIT tag as they arrive at the show
NO NAIT TAG = NO SHOW!**

This show is being conducted according to the
MPI Mycoplasma-bovis Bio-security Advice for Cattle Showing Events
(May 2019)

As well as tag compliance, exhibitors will need to record movement to and from the event. This can be done up to 48 hours before show day and a tick box is available to indicate that the animal will be going home after the show which automates the sending movement back to the home farm – the NAIT contact centre can assist with this: 0800 482 463.

The risk of M. bovis spreading at cattle-showing events is low, so it's possible for these events to go ahead while the bacteria is being eradicated in New Zealand.

However, appropriate protocols should be put in place to protect cattle exhibits, as there is still some risk wherever cattle may mingle.

**All movements of cattle to and from the show are required to be recorded
with Nait by the Te Aroha AP& H Show**

TUBERCULOSIS

NO CATTLE FROM A MOVEMENT CONTROL HERD MAY BE EXHIBITED.

All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd.

If the animals are going to the event and coming back on the same day, then ASD's are not required when sending animals to the event. If there is a possibility for the animal to be sold, auctioned off or will be going to another property after the event then ASD's must be completed before they leave the property.

Mycoplasma-bovis

Each exhibitor MUST provide their own water trough(s).

Cattle from different herds must be kept TWO meters apart.

Nose to nose must be avoided

Milking equipment used at the show should be cleaned and disinfected between uses on animals from different exhibitors

COVID-19

If you are suffering from any signs or symptoms associated with Covid-19 immediately prior to the Show, please do not compete.

Cattle stewards notes

We only have three people involved in the cattle and calf club section at committee level. If we were to lose one of these the section would not be able to be held. If you want to see the Te Aroha cattle and calf club section grow and prosper please give some thought to being involved in our team.

Please remember our judges, stewards and helpers are volunteers who give their time freely and should not have to deal with any threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, be it done face to face, over the phone, in correspondence, or over social media.
