Late entries for all other indoor classes (except for Photography, Painting and Drawing classes where there are NO LATE ENTRIES) are accepted on **Friday 23 February** from **8am - 10am** only at the Show Office of the Helensville Showgrounds.

- As late entries can cause a considerable backlog on the day, we urge you to enter early please. *No family can enter more than 20 late entries on Friday 23 February.*

Completion of Entry Forms

· All entry forms must be signed, and entry fees calculated correctly for entries to be accepted.

• Entry forms that have not been signed, or where entry fees have been calculated incorrectly, will be returned immediately for correction.

• This requirement will apply to all competitors, including members of the Association that have not as yet paid their annual subscription but who have calculated entry fees using the discount available to members.

Receipt of Entries

A receipt of entries will only be provided to the entrant if they request one following data processing. Your entry form will **NOT** be returned to you.

Responsibility

- It will be the competitor's responsibility to check the details on the receipt of entries carefully and ensure that all details are correct. Please advise any alterations to entries as soon as possible.

 \cdot The Association will take all care but no responsibility for exhibits.

Membership

 \cdot Annual individual membership of the Helensville A&P Association is \$40. Membership year is 1 June – 31 May.

 \cdot Discounted membership entry fees are available to current members of the Helensville A&P Association. The Association's membership form may be completed and forwarded with entries.

· Children of members up to the age of 16 years are eligible to claim entry fee discount.

Instructions to Judges and Stewards

· Judges to report to the Chief Indoor Steward on arrival.

· If the judges consider that any exhibit does not come within the regulations they are requested to report it to the Senior Steward of the class.

 \cdot In the event of there being no competition in any class, prizes may be given if the judges certify to particular merit, but they are specially requested to withhold prizes, even where there is competition, if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for the class in which they are competing.

Value of Points

The Points for prizes are as follows:

- · First Prize 6 points
- · Second Prize 4 points
- · Third Prize 2 points
- · Highly Commended 1 point
- · Champion 2 points
- · Reserve Champion 1 point

In the event of a tie, the largest number of first prizes will decide the matter, and if that fails to decide, then the value of the prize will be divided equally amongst those who have tied.

Winners may have their photo taken with any trophy won and receive a certificate, but cups and trophies cannot leave the Showgrounds. Trophies are updated after each Show.

 \cdot If you have already sent through an entry form, your entries will be listed with the Steward of each section. Any other entries need to be registered as a late entry at the Show Office.

- Please enter as early as possible late entries on the day will be limited to no more than 20 per family.
- · All competitors must report to the Steward of each section to register your entries in that section.
- · All entries must be registered while the competitor is still there.
- \cdot All indoor exhibits must be registered and in the exhibit hall not later than 10am.
- \cdot All persons must vacate the exhibit hall by 10:30am.
- · All indoor exhibits will be judged at 11:30am.

Saturday 24th February 2024 - Show Day

· The indoor exhibits will open for public viewing at 9am.

- \cdot Prize money in all classes will be awarded in full, unless otherwise stated.
- · All prize money will be paid out on Show day from the office from 10am, or in the exhibit hall from 4:30pm.
- \cdot All persons must vacate the exhibit hall by 3:15pm on Show day, in order for the Stewards to dissemble the displays and sort the entries for collection.
- \cdot All exhibits and prizes must be collected after 4:30pm on Show day. You must report to the Steward of the section before removing any entries.
- \cdot Any entries or prize money not collected by 5:30pm on Show Day will be disposed of at the Steward's discretion.

· If you have any questions about the judging, please ask the Steward of the section involved.

Privacy Act

The Association holds records of names and addresses of all members and competitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show, media reports, or promotional purposes at the Association's discretion.
The Association may take photographs and video images of members, competitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any competitor, and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media at the Association's discretion.

Rights of the Helensville A&P Committee

The Helensville A&P Committee reserves the right to, at any time, for any reason, and without notice (i) refuse or cancel any entry; (ii) alter the Show timetable; (iii) withdraw or change any event or class; (iv) request the removal from the Showgrounds of animals deemed unruly or dangerous, and (v) remove any dangerous or inappropriate exhibit or display.

Health & Safety

• The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit, or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association, and it

shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such competitors. By signing the entry form declaration, competitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any subsequent amendments.

- It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property, and to make provision for the protection of the property of others, but the Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.



History of this Recipe

This recipe was shared recently by Buckingham Palace's Pastry Chefs, who revealed it is the recipe they use to create the quintessential Queen Victoria sponges for the Royal Garden Parties. So pop on your pearls and tiara and give us your best effort at knocking out a right proper sponge.

THE BUCKINGHAM PALACE SPONGE

INGREDIENTS

3 eggs 150g caster sugar 150g unsalted butter 150g sieved self-raising flour 1/2 tsp of vanilla essence 100g jam (strawberry or raspberry) 150g softened unsalted butter 220g sieved icing sugar 1/2 tspn vanilla essence (for the icing)

METHOD

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C
- 2. Grease and line two 8"/20cm cake tins (if you only own one tin, you can bake the sponge and slice in half)
- 3. Cream the caster sugar, vanilla essence and softened unsalted butter until light and fluffy
- 4. In a separate bowl whisk the eggs
- 5. Gradually add the beaten eggs, a little at a time, to avoid the mixture curdling
- 6. Sieve the flour and fold into the mixture
- 7. Divide the cake mix between the two cake tins and smooth
- 8. Bake in middle shelf of oven for approximately 20 minutes, until the cake appears golden brown
- 9. Insert a skewer and ensure it comes out clean
- 10. Remove the sponges from their tins and leave to cool
- 11. Cream the softened butter with the sieved icing sugar and or vanilla essence
- 12. Ensure both sponges are completely cold before spreading a layer of jam onto the surface of one sponge
- 13. Spread a thick layer of buttercream on top of the jam (if you prefer this can be done first)
- 14. Gently place the second sponge on top and gently press down
- 15. Sprinkle with icing sugar and serve with a pot of fresh English tea!




