

Venue Rules

- 1. All competitors and persons on the grounds must abide by the Egmont Showgrounds Health & Safety Policy and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015, and any amendments.
- 2. All trucks, cars and trailers transporting livestock must be parked in the truck park behind the TSB Centre.
- 3. Competitors must park in the designated carparks not on the show grounds. The Parking Stewards ruling must be adhered to at all times.
- 4. It is the responsibility of the competitor to keep livestock under restraint and control at all times. The Stewards reserve the right to remove an animal deemed unsafe from the venue as and when they see fit.
- 5. Any temporary fences erected by exhibitors will result in disqualification in all classes.
- 6. If you wish to camp on the Showgrounds during the show a fee of \$30.00 per truck is payable at time of entry. This will give access to showering facilities during your stay.
- 7. Horses are banned from using the roadway at the front of the Cattle showing rings and the TSB Centre at all times during the show.
- 8. Dogs must be kept on leads at all times, competitors will be asked to leave the venue if dogs are found to be roaming.
- 9. Dogs are not permitted in any building on the showgrounds or in proximity to any competition arena.
- 10. All road rules apply on the showground, all vehicles must remain under 15kph on the venue. Persons riding motorbikes or ATV vehicles must wear a safety approved helmet.
- 11. No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show charges will be eligible to compete at any A&P Show, proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.
- 12. Exhibitors must insure all stock and property. The Egmont A&P Association will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage incurred while on the grounds or competing.
- 13. Stewards and Association's employees rulings must be adhered to.
- 14. All Cups and trophies will be available for awarding and photography purposes ONLY and will be engraved at the Egmont A & P Associations expense.
- 15. No Cups and trophies are to leave the Egmont A&P Showgrounds.
- 16. The Association reserves the right to alter the programme or prize money as they see fit.
- 17. The Egmont A&P Association reserves the right to use photographs taken at the event for promotional and advertising purposes as required
- 18. Live Streaming, The Egmont A&P Association reserves the right to record and broadcast via live stream or any other type of digital broadcast any or all of the competition and events at the Egmont Show 2023 both during and after the event. Competitions and/or participants will receive no remuneration for this. All footage remains the property of the Egmont A&P Association.
- 19. ESNZ Blue Card rules for concussion will apply in both Dressage and Jumping Sections.
- 20. Clean Sport The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio - vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

RAS In Line Resolution Process/ESNZ Official Warning Card

- A RAS Yellow or Red Card may be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible. Full wording of the Resolution Process can be found at<u>www.ras.org.nz</u>.
- 2. ESNZ Official Warning Card may be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per Dressage NZ, ESNZ Jumping and /or ESNZ Rules and General Regulations Full information on ESNZ Official Warning Card procedure can be found at www.nzequestrian.org.nz.

Clean Sport Testing

- 1. The attention of exhibitors is particularly drawn to the conditions relating to the misuse of substances, and the intention of the Committee to undertake testing for forbidden substances.
- 2. Competitors are advised that there may be random drug tests carried out by the RAS and or ESNZ during the show. Any competitor who has administered to their horse or pony any drug during seven days prior to the show is required to notify the secretary and fill out a medication advice form before competing.
- 3. ESNZ rules apply to all Dressage and Show Jumping competitors.
- 4. RAS rules apply to all showing, sport and pleasure horse competitors.

Please refer to RAS Equestrian Rulebook 2023 and/or ESNZ General Regulations and/or rules for ESNZ Dressage & Jumping 2020

Entries

- 1. By entering online the competitor agrees to abide by the rules of the following organisations relating to their section, Egmont A&P Association, Royal Agricultural Society Dressage NZ, ESNZ Jumping and Equestrian Sport NZ.
- 2. All riders, including harness drivers, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear tagged protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards and tagged to reflect compliance. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at www.ras.org.nz
- 3. RAS Equestrian Levies are included in Entry Fees.
- 4. Entries received after closing date will only be accepted at the discretion of the organisation and will incur a late fee of \$25.
- 5. Late entries on show day must be in by 8.00am, a 25% penalty will apply in all classes and will not be catalogued.
- 6. Alterations to entries or scratching's will not be taken by phone please post or email.
- 7. Alterations to entries will incur a \$3.00 surcharge.
- 8. All entrants in Dressage and Jumping must be a full ESNZ member.
- 9. For Dressage and Showjumping ESNZ horse and rider registrations must be current to 24th November 2023.
- 10. The Committee reserve the right to request a veterinarian or Doctors certificate if any competitor requires a refund. Application for refunds to be in writing within 14 days of the show. 75% of entries fees only will be refunded, no refunds under \$20 will be made except where grading affects the class.
- 11. Late entries may not receive yards or stabling, priority will be given to horses entered prior to closing date.

- 12. Horse boxes and yards are issued in order of application of entry, with preference to visitors, stabling days required to be stated at time of entry.
- 13. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if entries are insufficient.
- 14. Prize Money will be paid online after the completion of the show.

Fees/Levies

- 1. Ground Levy \$20 per horse/pony.
- 2. Medical/Admin levy per rider \$15 (non-refundable)
- 3. Camping fee \$20 each truck/float per night
- 4. Covered Yard/Stable for event \$75. Covered yard/Stable Discount for one night only \$40
- 5. Open Yard for event \$40. Open Yard Discount for one night only -\$20
- 6. Preference will be given to those competing at higher levels, sponsors and volunteers.
- 7. If yards are left dirty, competitors will be invoiced \$75 and may not have a yard allocated to them in the future.

Show Jumping and Show Hunter Conditions:

Online entries close with Evo Events on the 10th November OR ONCE EVENT IS AT CAPACITY. No postal or email entries will be accepted unless special arrangements are made with the show secretary.

All entries will be expected to pay at the time of entry and will not be confirmed until full payment has been received.

Late entries may be accepted if there is capacity with 50% late entry fee before 5pm night prior to the class (at the discretion of the organising committee).

- 1. All classes run under ESNZ rules.
- 2. Committee reserves the right to alter the programme.

3. Ring 1 to be run in strict draw order. Ring 2 will also run in draw order but allowances will be made for riders riding in multiple rings. Ring 3 and show hunter will be run in black board order.

4. Please ensure registrations and memberships are up to date. Failure to do so may result in loss of points, placings, prize money after the show and may result in rider being fined under ESNZ Jumping conditions.

5. Non-registered horses/ponies can compete under casual levy system for non-series classes and no higher than 1.10m for horses and 1.00m for ponies but riders must be fully registered. Flexi start is available for horses/ponies WITH current ESNZ equine registration but no Jumping/Show Hunter Discipline Start to compete no higher than 1.10m for horses and 1.00m for ponies. In both cases, horses/ponies cannot compete in series classes and will not be eligible for HOYQ points in show hunter.

Introductory members can only compete in INTRODUCTORY level classes (horses 90cm and below and Ponies 80cm and below).

6. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry. Committee reserves the right to evict and eliminate anyone who is acting in an unacceptable manner. Security may be patrolling the grounds.

7. Motorbikes are not to be ridden between the hours of 8pm and 6am. Motorbike riders must wear a helmet, not drive under the influence of alcohol or substances and not carry passengers.
 8. Dogs must be under the control of their owners at all times, and may not enter the competition

8. Dogs must be under the control of their owners at all times, and may not enter the competition Oval.

9. Photographers on the grounds are by application and/or invitation only. Any photographer outside of this may be asked to leave.

10. Competitors enter at own risk and the organisers take no responsibility for any injury to horses, riders or spectators or any damage to competitors or spectators' property.

11. The Burnside Ave gate is to remain closed throughout the show. The double gates adjacent to the Pony Club paddock are kept closed at all times.

Stabling Criteria – stabling will be prioritised for those that enter early, horses jumping 1.30 and over, the organising committee and sponsors at the discretion of the organising committee.

Egmont Horse Coaches Pony Points Prize

The Egmont Horse Coaches Pony Points Competition is held over the Taranaki Show jumping circuit in selected classes beginning at Waverley A&P, Egmont A&P, Taranaki Equestrian Jumping & Egmont Horse Coaches Spring Spectacular, Stratford A&P and ends at the Taranaki Equestrian Jumping Show in January. Points are allocated 5,3,2,1 at each show and the "John Henry" cup is presented to the leading Taranaki rider at the completion of the series.

IMPORTANT NOTICE to riders about MEDIA - By entering or attending this competition, you accept that you may appear within differing media streams that are on location covering the event. Your behavior at the event and within the competition arena is at your discretion and is your responsibility.

Fees and levies

- Ground Levy \$20 per horse/pony.
- Medical/Admin levy per rider \$15 (non-refundable)
- Camping fee \$20 per truck/float per night
- ESNZ Jumping levy \$7 per horse/pony (compulsory) per show
- ESNZ Casual Jumping Levy \$30.15 per show for horses/ponies WITHOUT current ESNZ Equine Registration (includes \$25 flexi start) - horses may compete at 1.10m and below and ponies 1m and below. Horses/ponies cannot compete in series classes and will not be eligible for HOYQ points in show hunter.
- ESNZ flexi-start levy \$25 <u>per show</u> for horses/ponies WITH current ESNZ Equine Registration but no Jumping/Show Hunter Discipline Start. Horses may compete at 1.10m and below and ponies 1m and below. Horses/ponies cannot compete in series classes and will not be eligible for HOYQ points in show hunter.
- ESNZ Casual Membership \$16.30 per day for riders not registered with ESNZ only able to compete in introductory classes (horses 90cm and below and Ponies 80cm and below named introductory).
- Covered Yard/Stable for event \$75. Covered yard/Stable Discount for one night only -\$40

• Open Yard for event - \$40. Open Yard Discount for one night only -\$20

Preference will be given to those competing at higher levels, sponsors and volunteers.

If yards are left dirty, competitors will be invoiced \$75 and may not have a yard allocated to them in the future.

Refunds less 25% if notified to the event secretary by 7:00 pm three days prior to the show.
 Refunds after that less 50% at the committee's discretion.

• Class changes - 25% retained and no late fee charged. LATE ENTRIES, SCRATCHINGS AND CHANGES IN ALL CLASSES NEED TO BE WITH THE SECRETARY BY 5:00PM THE NIGHT BEFORE (at the discretion of the organising committee) – late entries to ride first in draw classes. Class changes must be completed online.

• Prize money will be paid out by direct credit within 14 days after the show so be sure to include your bank details with the online entry. Riders are responsible for checking their placings and prize money online within two days of the show's competition. No changes in prize money will be made after then.

• In case of cancellation of the event the Medical/Admin fee and a percentage of entry fees will be retained to cover out of pocket expenses only. The organising committee will do their best to return entry fees to riders.

Show Hunter Conditions:

1. Introductory and casual members can only compete in INTRODUCTORY level classes (horses 90cm and below and Ponies 80cm and below).

2. All Equines must have a Current ESNZ Equine Registration and an Annual Jumping/Show Hunter Start to gain Horse of the Year Qualifying Points but can compete on a casual jumping levy or flexi-start WITHOUT earning points.

3. This is a Horse of the Year Qualifying Show for the 2023-2024 Season.

4. Ponies must compete in the correct category for ESNZ High Points classes to compete. Ponies over 8 years old need a height certificate, but it is not required to be current, ponies 8 years and under must have a current height certificate.

5. Pony riders can enter either the "Big On Writing Pony Equitation" <u>OR</u> the "BOP/Waikato SH Groups 12 & Under Equitation" – <u>not both.</u>

6. Rings will be run in draw order.

7. There are no show hunter practice rounds at this show.

RAS Showing Conditions

- 1. ESNZ Blue Card rules for concussion will apply in both Dressage and Jumping Sections.
- 2. Clean Sport The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio - vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.
- 3. Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS Certificate for their horse/pony at all RAS affiliated Shows/Events, and must produce it upon request to any authorised Show/Event personnel. Any competitor unable to produce such a certificate means that the exhibit is ineligible to compete, and will forfeit any awards.
- 4. Rider/Handler's age and eligibility is determined as per the 1 August i.e., Riders/handlers who are of age for any division/section on the 1 August complete the show year/ season in that division/section.
- 5. Exhibits three (3) years of age and under are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.
- 6. Large classes may be split or prize money extended. No 2nd prize unless three entries received. No 3rd prize unless five entries received. No 4th prize unless eight entries received. Prize rule is at the discretion of the stewards.
- 7. If sections coincide no class will be delayed.
- 8. RAS Exhibit Numbers showing classes It is compulsory to display your exhibit number (exhibitor to provide) while in a RAS judging ring. This can be in a number holder or make your own armband which is worn on left arm.
- 9. ESNZ Horse registration number must be displayed at all time during the Dressage competition.

Stallions & Colts

- 1. All Stallions and Colts must be housed in a stable for the duration of the show, they may not be accommodated in a yard or tied to a truck or float.
- 2. All stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature horses Shetland Pony Yearlings and foals) must be shown in a bit.
- 3. A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
- It is compulsory for all stallions and colts contesting any class , except foals, to wear two
 (2) official `S" identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all at
 all times during the show.
- 5. The rider must wear two red official (2) armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring.
- 6. Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest or Red armbands (2) when outside the competition ring.

RAS Novice Classification

- 1. Novice exhibit or rider is one that has yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show/Event.
- 2. Once you have achieved 6 wins in Conformation and/or Paced & Mannered classes, you can no longer enter in Novice classes in that category
- 3. Wins at all affiliated RAS Shows/Events including the NZ Horse of the Year (HOY) Show must be recorded on the RAS Certificate and/or Performance Card.
- 4. Once an exhibit has achieved six (6) wins in any RAS section, the exhibit is not eligible to return to Novice status even if it changes sections.
- 5. Novice exhibits are eligible for Open classes If that Novice exhibit wins the Open class then they are eligible for the Open Championship
- 6. Novice classes within each section (not breed sections) count and must be recorded on the RAS Certificate. Should a Novice exhibit win an Open conformation class including Ladies and Gents classes, these wins must also be recorded.
- 7. The number of Novice wins is to be counted at the time of the Show/Event, not the time of entry. If a Novice entry exceeds the permitted number of wins by the day of the Show/Event, the competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and change to an Open class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the Show/Event.
- 8. Imported Horse/Pony Any wins gained overseas by a horse/pony that is imported into New Zealand, count towards their classification when showing in New Zealand, i.e. whether it can still compete in the Novice section (5 wins or less), or if it has 6 or more wins, then it must compete in the Open section.

CHARITABLE TRUST

The Fred and Eunice Rodie Charitable Trust was set up in 1988 by the late Eunice Rodie to recognize and perpetuate the shared interest of herself and Fred in the South Taranaki Community. Fred and Eunice Rodie were both from local families and lived and worked in the South Taranaki Community. In absence of family of their own, Fred and Eunice generously donated substantial assets within their charitable trust for the benefit of the wider community. Fred's father was Station Master of the Hawera Railway Station and his brother Town Clerk at Manaia. Eunice Nicholas grew up in Caledonia Street, Her father John was a beekeeper.

Fred and Eunice lived in Kaponga where Fred was Branch Manager of Newton King Ltd. In 1948 they moved to Hawera as Fred became Manager of the Hawera branch. Eunice did secretarial work for Walkley and Laurance Accountants in Hawera. They bought a farm on the Skeet Road and one on the Auroa Road. Throughout their lives they both took a great interest in the farming operations. Fred being a meticulous manager and record keeper in his work and farming operations.

They were kind, friendly, private people who enjoyed being involved. Fred was very involved with Rotary and contributed generously to many worthy causes in our local community, for example; to the Rotary organised Intensive Care and Scanner Trusts, and a Hall of Residence at Massey University. Eunice was very involved in the St Mary's Church and for a number of years was Fellowship Secretary.

Fred retired from Newton King when he was 60 in 1970. He and Eunice continued to live in their 57 Disraeli Street home (next to Bayly Park) until Fred died in 1974. Eunice soon after moved into a unit in Argyle Street until her health required admission to Calvery/Trinity rest home/hospital. Fred Rodie Born 1910 died 1974. Eunice Luxford Rodie Born 1910 died 2000.
