If any Competitor is not sure of the conditions they should get in touch with the Secretary.

This Section is open to all Dairy Goats registered with the following RAS Affiliated Societies: NZ Dairy Goat Breeders Association, Premier Dairy Goats and the Anglo-Nubian Breed Society of NZ.

Exhibitors must comply with the by-laws of the RAS of NZ for the exhibition of Dairy Goats, and any conditions of the Society. All Dairy Goats entered in the Show must be the bona fide

Dairy Goats must not be housed for more than 48 hours prior to the Show.

PRIZE MONEY

The Society reserves the right to substitute advertised prize money with either Product or Vouchers. The Society reserves the right to provide lower prize money amounts if there are three entries or less in any Class. The Society reserves the right to combine or substitute Classes if there are low entry numbers in individual Classes.

PRIVACY ACT

The Society holds records and names and addresses of all members and exhibitors and will publish these as necessary for media show reports unless advised.

PROTESTS:

All protests are to be lodged at the Secretaries office within 30 minutes of the event. Protests must be in writing and accompanied by a \$50.00 cash deposit. This will be refunded if the protest is upheld. The protest shall be determined by the Appeals Committee. Their decision shall be final and binding. No reasons for the decision shall be required. If a prize winner were afterwards disqualified, the Committee may, with or without the advice of the Judge, decide whether the next animal on the list shall gain the prize.

DISCLAIMER:

It may be necessary to make changes to the programme, prizes or judges because of circumstances beyond our control. No correspondence will be entered into.

CHANGES TO THE SCHEDULE:

The Society reserves the right to alter or amend the Schedule as they see fit, with no recourse to the Society.

SPORTSMANSHIP:

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting Competitors the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and competition. Any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow Competitors, Stewards, Judges or Show Officials may be asked, at the discretion of

the Show Committee, to leave the Showgrounds.

INSURANCE

The Society will not be held responsible for loss or damage to Competitors or their property whilst on the grounds. The Society will not be responsible for any claim. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur in competition or that may occur from machine or other exhibits or plant belonging to Competitors or the Society and it is a condition of entry that such Competitor or visitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings from any accidents caused.

Judging to commence 10.00am

All Dairy Goats to be penned by 8.15am, in allocated stalls.

Entry to the showgrounds is through **GATE 5** to unload and pen goats. All vehicles must be cleared from the site by 8.45am as the gates open to the public at 9.00am. No vehicles movements are permitted after 8.45am. To pack up after the event goats will have to be loaded in the parking area, vehicles will not be able to get back onsite to reload until 4.30pm when the gates close to the public.

ENTRIES CLOSE: Friday 9th February 2024

Animals may be substituted but only into the same class – the Office is to be notified by 5.00pm on the day before competition. Late entries will not be accepted. No refunds will be given for non-participation after payment has been made.

ENTRY FEES: \$10.00 per class unless otherwise stated

GROUND FEE

Ground Fee \$10.00 per Dairy Goat (capped at \$20.00). All Dairy Goats on the grounds must have paid a Ground Fee.
