(Inc.) and it shall be deemed as if they have been printed in full in this Schedule. If any Competitor is not sure of the conditions they should get in touch with the Secretary. Entry in competition at the Show is deemed to be acceptance of the Rules and Regulations.

PRIVACY ACT

The Society records the names and addresses of all members and exhibitors and may publish these as necessary.

LAND ROVER HORSE OF THE YEAR SHOW 2024

Refer to this page for details of your Section requirements: <http://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/horse-of-the-year-hoy>. This is a Qualifying Show for Land Rover Horse of the Year 2024. You now require a Certificate of Qualification and Attendance to enter, it is the Competitor's responsibility to have the forms completed and sent to RAS Head Office. The Certificate of Qualification and Attendance can be downloaded from the RAS website as above.

ENTRIES CLOSE FRIDAY 2nd FEBRUARY 2024

Late entries may be accepted (at Committee discretion) with a 50% penalty on all entries up to (and including) Friday 9th February 2024. Late entries will not be catalogued. No entries will be accepted after Friday 9th February 2024.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

Competitors desiring a refund of Entry Fees must apply in writing, enclosing a Veterinarian's or Doctor's Certificate, no later than one week after the Show. All refunds will be made less 25% of total fees. Scratching prior to close of entries will receive a full refund less a \$10.00 Administration Fee.

EXHIBITOR PASSES

Each Competitor is entitled to entry to the Show for themselves and a supporter / assistant. All Competitors who cannot present proof of entry at the Gate will be charged normal entry charges and there will be no refunds.

PRIZE MONEY

1st \$20.00, 2nd \$15.00, 3rd \$10.00

(Except where otherwise stated)

The Society reserves the right to substitute advertised prize money with either Product or Vouchers.

REDUCTION IN PRIZE MONEY

The Society reserves the right to provide lower prize money amounts if there are three entries or less in any Class.

COMBINATION OF CLASSES

The Society reserves the right to combine or substitute Classes if there are low entry numbers in individual Classes.

TIMETABLE

The Society reserves the right to alter, change or rearrange the start times of the individual Sections after entries have closed, to have the competitions take place in a timely manner. The Society will try not to negatively impact Competitors with multiple horses by changing the scheduled start times. There will be no recourse to the Society for any changes made.

SAFETY

COMPETITORS RIDE AT THEIR OWN RISK, AND MUST BE SUITABLY ATTIRED. ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR YELLOW TAGGED SAFETY HELMETS.

SAFETY HELMETS:

- In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.
- All riders competing at RAS affiliated A & P Shows must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the Arena or Ring, the Practice Area, Collecting Rings or anywhere else within the Showgrounds.
- Hats / helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but

the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz-equestrian>. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

d) All hats / helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current YELLOW Tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. Equestrian Adults riding in a Safety Helmet will not be subject to penalty.

OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

All Horses must be entered in the same owner's name throughout the Catalogue. The name of each Horse must be supplied at the time of entry.

CLEAN SPORT

The Rules of the Royal A & P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk.

A forbidden substance is defined as: Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

AGE OF RIDERS AND HANDLERS

Rider / Handlers age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st of August i.e. Riders / Handlers who are of age for any division / section on the 1st of August 2023 complete the Show year / season in that division / section. Proof of age may be required and must be on hand. Lead Rein Classes are restricted to Riders under 8 years of age with a minimum age of 4 years, who are not competing in any other Sections at any A & P Show. Lead Rein Classes are to be led by an attendant aged 14 years of age or over.

First Ridden Classes are restricted to Riders under 10 years of age, who are not competing in any other Section at any A & P Show.

- Novice Pony Exhibits (except Novice Pony Stallions) may be ridden by a Rider of any age.
- Novice Pony Stallions must be led or ridden by a Rider 14 years of age or over.
- Open Pony Exhibits must be ridden by a Rider under 17 years of age.
- Open Pony Stallions must be ridden by a Rider 14, 15, or 16 years of age. Led Handlers must be 14 years of age or over.
- Stallions over 148cm must be led or ridden by a Rider 17 years of age or older.

AGE OF RIDDEN EXHIBITS

Exhibits 3 years of age and under are not permitted in any Ridden or Driven (Harness) Class, no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.

HEIGHTS OF PONIES AND HORSES

Any Pony 148cm and under may not compete in any Horse event. Any Horse over 148cm may not compete in any Pony event.

RAS HEIGHT CERTIFICATES

All Horses and Ponies competing at A & P Shows must have a current annual RAS Height Certificate, an RAS Horse / Pony Identification Card or an RAS Life Height Certificate. These must be carried on the day of competition and produced on request. You will not be able to compete without one. Prize winners will forfeit any prize money if performance cards are not produced at the request of the Stewards. A copy of the Height Certificate / Performance card must be forwarded with your entry.

Exception applies to Sport Horse and ESNZ Show Jumping Classes providing those Horses are not entered in any other Section. **Should these Breed Classes choose to enter any RAS Qualifying Classes then a Height Certificate will be required.**

BREAST PLATE NUMBERS (Back Numbers)

Your entry confirmation will state your Horse or Pony's Back Number beside their names. You must use your own Number Holder.

THE SOCIETY DOES NOT SUPPLY NUMBER HOLDERS

In the case of Rider Classes; if riding a Horse not entered in the Class, please use the entered Horse's number as that will ensure any prize money won is credited to the correct Competitor.

DEFINITIONS

A Novice is a Horse or Pony that is yet to win six Classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show.

All wins in Novice Classes within each division count and must be recorded on the RAS Measuring and Performance Card. Should a Novice Horse win an Open On Type Class, that win must also be recorded.

Once a Horse has achieved 6 wins in On Type or Paced and Mannered Classes, this Horse is not eligible to return to 'Novice' status should it change sections at the beginning of the new Show season.

PLEASE NOTE: An adult can ride a Novice Pony in Novice Pony classes only. An adult rider cannot ride a Novice Pony in a Rider Class.

NOVICE CLASSES

In the best interest of time, placings in the Novice Classes can be taken from the Circle and do not necessarily have to be given a work out. This decision is at the Judges' discretion.

STALLIONS AND COLTS

All Stallions and Colts must be shown in a Bit with the exception of Foals, Miniature Horses, and Shetland Pony Yearlings. A Steward will order from the Ring any Stallion or Colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other Horses without recourse from the Stallion or Colt's owner / exhibitor / competitor. It is compulsory for all Stallions and Colts, except Foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' Identification Badges, one attached to either side of their Bridle, at all times. The rider / handler must wear two (2) RAS official Armbands (one on each arm) when in the Ring. 'S' Badges and Armbands can be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ. Handlers and Riders of Stallions or Colts must wear an RAS approved Hi Viz Vest at Shows when outside the Showing Ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

EQUIPMENT

Whips in Ridden Classes may not exceed 76cm in length. Competitors in Led Classes may carry a dressage style whip. For a First Ridden Rider, a cane or whip not exceeding 68cm, including flap 2cm wide by 4cm long, may be carried.

SUBSTITUTIONS AND SUBSTITUTE JUDGES

Substitutions will be allowed at the discretion of the Chief Steward. The Committee reserves the right to substitute a Judge.

JUDGING AND PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

Competitors must have their Horses / Ponies ready for judging at the times stated, or they will be liable for disqualification.

No distinguishing mark of ownership or stud name (with the exception of registered brands) may be attached to the animal exhibited or the handler.

CHAMPIONSHIP JUDGING

When judging of all eligible Classes within the division has been completed, all the first placed Horses, Ponies and Riders may parade for Championship Judging. The Horse or Pony competing for Champion, Reserve Champion or Supreme Champion must be ridden by the Rider who qualified the Horse or Pony or have had dispensation from the Chief Steward to substitute the Rider. Dispensation will only be granted in the event of illness or because the original Rider is competing in another Ring. Horses cannot be led when judging Championship Classes.

The second placed Horse to the selected Champion must be allowed to parade for Reserve and be given the same consideration as the other animals in the Ring.

Ring Championships are judged from winners in the On Type Classes.

Paced and Mannered Champions may be judged from the winners of the Paced and Mannered Classes in any Section or Ring at the Show or within any Section or Ring at the Show.

Reserve Championships are judged from the eligible winners and the second placed Horse or Pony to the selected Champion.

SUPREME CHAMPION

Open Championship winners from all appropriate Divisions will be judged under the 60 / 40 criteria. Supreme Champion will be judged according to the Show Schedule. Judges, independent of each other, are to place each Horse or Pony by their ID number from first to last using the RAS Judging Pad Form. In the situation where a Horse or Pony misbehaves, fails to work out or goes uneven during the Championship Judging, regardless of how many first prizes won, it is the Judge's prerogative to be able to place it accordingly. All Horses or Ponies must be ridden for the Supreme Judging.

PROTESTS AND OBJECTIONS

The determination of the Judge shall be final, unless an objection is made to any Horse or Pony and allowed on the grounds of disqualification. Any Competitor who wishes to lodge a protest concerning any decision on the part of a Judge or any decision or act or omission on the part of the Society or of any Official of the Society shall lodge a protest form within one hour from which the decision, act or omission occurred. A protest form is available from the Secretary's office. Every protest must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 cash, and this amount shall be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not upheld. The fee shall be refunded if the protest is upheld. The protest shall be determined by the Appeals Committee whose decision shall be final and binding. No reasons for the decision shall be required. If a prize winner were afterwards disqualified, the Committee may, with or without the advice of the Judge, decide whether the next animal on the list shall gain the prize.

SPORTSMANSHIP

The purpose of our Show is to provide our community and visiting Competitors the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and competition. Any person who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow Competitors, Stewards, Judges or Show Officials may be asked, at the discretion of the Show Committee, to leave the Showgrounds. This Show supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system, which will operate in the Equestrian Section. A Yellow Card will be issued for offences in respect of abuse of animals or for any inappropriate behaviour toward Show Officials, Judges, fellow Competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the Equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/ or Exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution. The RAS affiliated Show and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within ten days of the Show). Implementation of the 'Yellow Card' will be in accordance with the RAS Rules that accompany this card, and full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website.

RAS Resolution Process – the full process can be found on the RAS website: www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the Show. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official, the Show shall request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

INSURANCE

The Society will not be held liable for loss or damage to Competitors or their property whilst on the grounds. The Society will not be responsible for any claim. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur in competition or that may occur from machinery or other exhibits or plant belonging to Competitors or the Society and it is a condition of entry that such Competitor or visitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings from any accidents caused.

IN-HAND HORSES AND PONIES

For In-Hand Classes, all Horses or Ponies are to be led clockwise with the Attendant on the near side. Attendants are requested to be suitably attired when parading Horses in the Ring. Jodhpurs or breeches, short or long riding boots, shirt and tie (or stock), waistcoat or riding jacket are acceptable. Riding hats and gloves are optional. Alternatively, a long-sleeved shirt and tie, trousers or slacks, waistcoat or jacket may be worn. Ladies may wear a skirt (not tight or see through). Protective footwear that covers the upper part of the foot must be worn.

ARREARS

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

EVENT CANCELLATION

If the Show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Show Organiser, the Show Organiser is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part, any payments made by the Competitors. Any refund will be made at the discretion of the Society.

YARDS

No overnight accommodation is available for Stallions or Colts.

Uncovered Yards are available for \$20.00 for the weekend.

Unpowered Campsites are available for \$20.00 per vehicle for the weekend.

- All Horses and Ponies must be kept in their allocated Yard.
- All Yards must be cleaned of dung and placed in the allocated Manure Pile at the end of the Pen rows.

Limited Yards are available, therefore ensure you get your entries in early to secure one. Late entries will only be eligible for Yards and Campsites if there is availability.

NO TEMPORARY PENS OR TAPES ARE ALLOWED

HORSE MANURE

DO NOT put manure around trees or under fences. DO NOT put manure in rubbish bins.

Please do not be embarrassed to put your horse manure under your truck or float. If you are caught putting manure in places that are not permitted, you will be asked to remove it.

GROUND FEE

Ground Fee \$20.00 per Horse (capped at \$40.00).

All Horses on the grounds must have paid a Ground Fee. Horses that are not entered in Competitions are not permitted on the grounds. This is due to the large number of Horses expected across both Showing Classes and Show Jumping Classes.

IMPORTANT

Please ensure that a copy of your Height Certificate and Performance Card accompanies your Entry Form.

RING LAYOUT

The Ring Layout will be available prior to the Show online and in the Secretary's office, and will be available in the Pony Hut on the day.

Working Hunter Horse

Start time: Approx. 1.30pm

This Section is a Land Rover Horse of the Year Qualifier

Working Hunters are required to demonstrate jumping ability and be of good, strong conformation, with good manners, sound paces and be a comfortable ride over long distances. They will be required to jump a minimum of three (3) Hunter type Fences.

Judging will be on Jumping style and ability 40%, On Type 30%, Paces and Manners 30%.

Horses will be required to gallop within the confines and constraints of the Ring involved.

No Boots or Bandages are permitted.

Jumps will not exceed 85cm in height.

- Current Height Certificates are not required.
- Competitors registered with NZEPS are to provide their registration number on their Entry Form.
- Leisure Horse / Pony means those animals who do not fit the mould of a Show Horse / Pony. We welcome any breed (e.g. Appaloosas, Quarter Horses, Standardbreds, Clyde X) and colour. They should be an uncomplicated and genuine pleasure to ride. Whilst they do not possess the show quality conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride, with impeccable manners.
- A "leisure mount" is NOT an inexperienced mount with show quality conformation who is destined for the open show ring.
- From 1 August 2015, for a Horse / Pony to meet the annual title show qualification requirements they must be registered with NZEPS.
- Horses / Ponies must never have been placed first in an open show ring class including working hunter. However, members may apply for dispensation to NZEPS.
- Ordinary snaffle bit as per Dressage NZ definition only, no poll action. No bit guards, shadow rolls, ear plugs, muffs, bonnets, martingales (breast plates are allowed) or tie downs.
- Bitless bridles are only permitted in Recreational leisure classes.
- Only cavesson nosebands are permitted - no strapping below the bit.
- Whips may be carried but must not exceed 76cms in length.
- All riders must wear a 3 point harness helmet conforming to the current NZ Safety standard or an equivalent standard and be yellow tagged.
- Spurs are not to be worn.
- Riders may be registered with other bodies.
- Riders may have competed outside the Leisure Horse / Pony section.
- Riders in Pony classes must be under 17yrs (proof of rider's age may be requested). Age is taken as at 1st of August.
- Children riding hacks must compete in the Horse Classes.
- Adults may ride ponies in Horse Classes without prejudice.
- Leisure mounts may compete in recognized breed and colour classes i.e., Welsh and Pinto classes but should not compete in the RAS In-Hand classes i.e. Sporthorse, Thoroughbred or In-Hand Pony Sections.
- Local competitors not registered with the New Zealand Equestrian Pleasure Society are able to enter the Leisure Horse / Pony Classes but are not eligible for Land Rover Horse of the Year qualification.

There is no height restriction in Registered Welsh, Purebred or Partbred Classes and Height Certificates are not required. Registered Welsh Partbreds must not be plaited in In-Hand Breed Classes unless exhibited in other Ridden or Driven Classes on that day.

Ponies and Cobs must be entered under their fully registered name.

All Stallions entered in Stallion Classes must be on fully registered Stallion papers, temporary colt papers ineligible.

Geldings must not be shown on temporary colt papers.

Rules for the section:

- Current Height Certificates are not required.
- Competitors registered with NZEPS are to provide their registration number on their Entry Form.
- Leisure Horse / Pony means those animals who do not fit the mould of a Show Horse / Pony. We welcome any breed (e.g. Appaloosas, Quarter Horses, Standardbreds, Clyde X) and colour. They should be an uncomplicated and genuine pleasure to ride. Whilst they do not possess the show quality conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride, with impeccable manners.
- A "leisure mount" is NOT an inexperienced mount with show quality conformation who is destined for the open show ring.
- From 1 August 2015, for a Horse / Pony to meet the annual title show qualification requirements they must be registered with NZEPS.
- Horses / Ponies must never have been placed first in an open show ring class including working hunter. However, members may apply for dispensation to NZEPS.
- Ordinary snaffle bit as per Dressage NZ definition only, no poll action. No bit guards, shadow rolls, ear plugs, muffs, bonnets, martingales (breast plates are allowed) or tie downs.
- Bitless bridles are only permitted in Recreational leisure classes.
- Only cavesson nosebands are permitted - no strapping below the bit.
- Whips may be carried but must not exceed 76cms in length.
- All riders must wear a 3 point harness helmet conforming to the current NZ Safety standard or an equivalent standard and be yellow tagged.
- Spurs are not to be worn.
- Riders may be registered with other bodies.
- Riders may have competed outside the Leisure Horse / Pony section.
- Riders in Pony classes must be under 17yrs (proof of rider's age may be requested). Age is taken as at 1st of August.
- Children riding hacks must compete in the Horse Classes.
- Adults may ride ponies in Horse Classes without prejudice.
- Leisure mounts may compete in recognized breed and colour classes i.e., Welsh and Pinto classes but should not compete in the RAS In-Hand classes i.e. Sporthorse, Thoroughbred or In-Hand Pony Sections.
- Local competitors not registered with the New Zealand Equestrian Pleasure Society are able to enter the Leisure Horse / Pony Classes but are not eligible for Land Rover Horse of the Year qualification.
