THEME

The theme for the Home Industry section of the 2024 Show is:

Kiwiana

Kiwiana is generally seen as collectable objects or ornaments from New Zealand's heritage, especially from around 1950s and 1960s, that are seen as representing iconic New Zealand elements. These quirky things that contribute to a sense of nationhood include both genuine cultural icons and kitsch. Although the term is sometimes used to describe any and all New Zealand icons, it is more commonly used to describe pop culture items such as toys or branded foods. A few more serious national icons have become Kiwiana through heavy use in advertising and the souvenir industry. These include the Kiwi and the Tiki.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of the Franklin A & P Society shall be those issued by the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ Inc and it shall be deemed as if they had been printed in full in this Schedule. If any Exhibitor is not sure of the conditions they should get in touch with the Secretary.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Entries per Class:

Entries restricted to **2 entries** per class unless otherwise stated. Please read each class details carefully. EXHIBITS may be entered in ONE class only.

How to Enter:

Entries accepted via ShowdayOnline or by manual entry on forms provided online or at the Society's Office.

Entry Fee Payment:

Via ShowdayOnline or direct credit to: Franklin A & P Society Kiwibank Pukekohe 38 9023 0290291 00

Late Entries and Refunds:

Late entries <u>will not be accepted</u>. No refunds will be given for non-participation after payment has been made.

Exhibitor Passes:

Exhibitors whose total entries equal \$20 or more will be entitled to free entry to the Show for themselves. All Exhibitors who cannot provide proof of entry at the Gate will be charged normal entry charges and there will be no refunds.

Prize Money:

If the prize involves money, this will be paid via direct credit into the winner's nominated bank account at the completion of the show. The Society reserves the right to alter the amount of prize money relevant to entrant numbers in each Class. The Society reserves the right to substitute advertised prize money with either product or vouchers. A prize giving will be held at 3pm Sunday to present trophies, sashes and take photos.

Privacy Act:

The Society records the names and addresses of all members and exhibitors and will publish these as necessary for media show reports unless advised.

Bona Fide Work:

Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the entrant and may not have been a previous prize winning entry of the Franklin A & P Show.

Full Disclosure:

Entrants must supply their full name, address, and phone number on entry form. **ALL EXHIBITS MUST HAVE A TICKET** with class number on one side and exhibitor name and Entry on the other, <u>not the entrant</u> <u>number</u>. The names of the winners may be published.

Points:

Where points prizes are awarded, points will be: 1st = 6, 2nd = 4, 3rd = 2.

Protests:

All protests are to be lodged at the Secretary's office within 30 minutes of the event. Protests must be in writing and accompanied by a \$50.00 cash deposit. This will be refunded if the protest is upheld. Where necessary, the Franklin A & P Society will adjudicate in all matters other than judging and such a decision shall be final.

Disclaimer:

It may be necessary to make changes to the programme, prizes, or judges because of circumstances beyond our control. No correspondence will be entered into.

Sportsmanship:

The purpose of our show is to provide our community and visiting competitors the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and competition, therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges or show officials may be asked, at the discretion of the show committee, to leave the showgrounds.

Date and Time for Delivering Exhibits: Stewards available to receive exhibits in Massey Hall at the following times:

Non-Perishable: 9th February 2024, 9am - 4pm

Perishable: 16th February 2024, 9am - 4pm

Date and Time for Collecting Exhibits at Completion of Show:

Exhibitors will be able to collect their exhibits for the Home Industry section from Massey Hall on Sunday 18th February 2024 from 3.30pm until 5.00pm. No vehicles will be allowed on the grounds until all traders have left the grounds. Tow away rules will be in force prior to this time.

Please ensure ALL entries are collected from Massey Hall by 1.00pm on Monday 19th February 2024.

NOTE: People collecting exhibits must produce an Entry Form or other form of identification. Exhibits will not be released without this.

NOTE: Due to health regulations, all perishable goods (food and vegetables) will be disposed of at the close of the show.

Time of Judging and Judging Rules:

Non-Perishable – Handcraft, Preserves, and the Art section will be judged after 4.00pm Friday 9th February 2024

Perishable - Cooking, Vegetables, Flowers, Floral Art, and all Children's classes will be judged after 4.00pm on Friday 16th February 2024 with the exception of the Beer, Wine, Honey, and Eggs sections as these will be judged on Saturday 17th February 2024 at the show, time to be advised.

Garden Exhibits will be judged after 4.00pm on either Friday 9th February 2024 or Friday 16th February 2024. Check schedule carefully for when exhibits must be delivered.

The Society reserves the right to verify suitability of exhibits in classes. Where appropriate exhibits may be transferred to another class or disqualified.

Classes may be cancelled or merged if there are insufficient entries at the Society's, Judge's, or Head Steward's discretion.

Judges will be accompanied by Stewards only. No visitors allowed in Massey Hall during judging.

JUDGE'S DECISIONS ARE FINAL. If entries are deemed to not be up to standard, prizes will not be awarded.

Insurance:


The Franklin A & P Society will not under any circumstances be held responsible for loss, damage ormis-delivery of goods exhibited at the Show.

Cooking exhibits must be accepted and staging completed at Massey Hall on Friday 16th February 2024.

Stewards are available to receive exhibits 9am – 4pm.

No exhibitors permitted after 4pm. No exhibits are to be delivered to the main office.

Because of the rising cost of ingredients, full size items are not essential. Smaller sizes are acceptable and are at no disadvantage e.g. loaf.

Rules:

- No more than two entries, of different recipes, per class per person.
- Exhibits must be the bona fide work of the entrant and may not have been a previous prize winning entry of the Franklin A & P Show.

The Grace Pollock Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the overall winner of the most points who has competed in both the Cooking and Preserves Sections.


