GENERAL INFORMATION

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION FOR MEMBERSHIP

Single member - \$15.00 Family membership - \$30.00

Privileges: Single members – free admission to the show

Family membership – free admission two adults and three children

ADMISSION: Non members – \$8.00 single, \$15.00 couple, Children 5 – 15 years - \$2.00.

Under 5 years – free. Cars – free parking

Every person, including competitors and handlers will be charged an admission fee on the days they enter the show grounds. Members must show their members pass or Northern District RAS pass for free admission.

No discussion will be entered into at the gate. Any dispute to be referred to Secretary's Office.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. In case funds of the Association are insufficient after paying working expenses and providing for liabilities, to pay the prize in full the amount available for that purpose will be distributed pro rata among the prize winners.
2. Vehicles driving on the grounds are strictly prohibited except in competitions.
3. Trade Exhibits must not be driven about the grounds except on entering and leaving the grounds.
4. The Committee will not under any circumstances hold themselves responsible for loss, damage or mis-delivery of stock or goods at the show.
5. All outside exhibits will be judged from 9:00 am on Show Day and must be in, at or before 9am on day of show, and cannot be removed before 3:00pm without permission.
6. In the case of double entries in all stock classes, the onus stock being submitted to judges is placed on exhibitors.
7. The points prize, except where otherwise specified will be reckoned as follows: Champions 2; Reserve Champions 1; First prize 6; Second prize 4; Third prize 2, Highly Commended 2. Points for milk classes in Dairy section: First 10; Second 8; Third 6. In classes where there are fewer than two exhibitors only half points will be counted. In the event of ties for any prize, the winner of the greatest number of first prizes will take precedence.
8. The Association will not be responsible for any accident that may occur from any machinery or other exhibit belonging to any exhibitor, and it is a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any incident so caused.
9. The Association will **not accept liability** for any injury or accident to any person or persons due to the presence on the ground of any exhibit, sideshow, display stands buildings or other apparatus appertaining to the conduct of the show.

- 10 All entries in Pedigree stock classes must be the property of a breeder and a member of the appropriate Breed Society except in equestrian events.
- 11 All cattle entered for showing must be from a TB free or TB accredited herd for the last 3 years. All cattle, yearlings and over must be TB tested within the preceding 12 months and a copy of their Certificate must accompany the entry form. All animals must with identified with a NAIT tag.
- 12 Age of animals is calculated from 1st June.
- 13 **Entries** – No entries will be acknowledged unless accompanied by entry fees. Entries made by phone, email or fax must be immediately confirmed in writing accompanied by entry fees.
- 14 **POSTPONED OR CANCELLED SHOW:**
 - (a) Postponed to another date – NO refund
 - (b) Cancelled – Refund less 25%.
- 15 **FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES:**

The Northern Wairoa A & P Association is an affiliated A & P Show to the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (inc) and as such the rules of the RAS for Forbidden Substances will apply at this show. All matters pertaining to Forbidden Substances come under the jurisdiction of the RAS Horse Stewards Council, Forbidden Substances Judiciary Committee. Testing for forbidden Substances will be carried out by stewards appointed by the Forbidden Substances Judiciary Committee from nominations made by the Royal Agricultural Society District Committee.
- 16 The Show Committee reserves the right to substitute vouchers or product in lieu of prize money.

RAS NORTHERN DISTRICTS YOUNG PARADER

Rules

The aim of this competition is to encourage young people to enhance their skills on animal handling and knowledge whilst fostering showmanship between competitors as well as having an opportunity to bridge the gap between calf club and the pedigree ring.

- This competition is run in the Northern District only and the overall top four placings will be selected from participants who live within the Northern Districts RAS region.
 - Competitors in the Junior competition are to be aged 5 – 12 (inclusive), whilst competitors in the Senior competition are to be aged 13 – 19 (inclusive). All ages are as of October 1st of the current show season. Competitors may be asked for proof of age on show day.
 - Entry is to be free for all competitors.
 - In the both the dairy and beef competitions, junior competitors may only enter a calf and senior competitors may enter either a calf or yearling only.
 - The competitor may only enter the beef or dairy class — not both. Any competitor recorded competing in both the dairy and beef section will be excluded from the overall competition.
 - To be eligible for the overall Northern Districts Young Parader prize, the competitor must compete in four or more Northern Districts A&P Shows in the particular class for the current show season. Please refer to the RAS website for a full list of Northern Districts A&P shows.
 - The competitor may enter as many shows as they wish, however their final score will be calculated as an average from their top four shows.
 - The highest-scoring Northern District competitors in each of the four classes will receive; \$100 for 1st place, \$75 for 2nd place, \$50 for 3rd place and \$25 for 4th place, sponsored by the Northern District RAS
 - Judges are to line-up all competitors. Shows are to record the names of all entrants regardless of placing.
 - Results will be published on the Northern Districts RAS Youth Facebook page shortly after each show in order to track the competition. Please contact this page directly with any queries.
- 9 Points are to be awarded as follows (regardless of number of competitors in the class).

Judging Guidelines

Presentation of the Competitor:

- The competitor is to wear a plain white shirt with dark pants and clean, strong, appropriate boots for cattle handling. No open footwear or gumboots are permitted.
- No logos or advertising whatsoever are permitted. This includes on hats and breed uniforms.

Presentation of the Animal:

- The conformation of the animal itself is ***not to be judged*** — however general presentation is to be taken into consideration. It is expected that the competitor has prepared the animal sufficiently themselves and is encouraged to know basic information about the animal such as birth date, breeding and rearing.
- Rope, leather, chain and nylon halters are permitted. It should be clean and fit the animal correctly.
- For beef competitors if a show stick or cane is carried, it is to be used correctly.

Parading of the Animal:

- The competitor should aim to display the animal in such a manner that the judge gains a clear view of the animal at all times and that the animal is seen to the best of its ability.
- Emphasis is placed on the effort of the competitor to be able to parade and handle in general regardless of the particular animal on the end of the halter, therefore senior competitors will be requested to swap animals (seniors will not).
- The competitor should be able to stop, move the animal on and keep the animal under control whilst being aware of where the judge is in the ring.
- Outside assistance is not permitted under any circumstances and competitors will be disqualified.

It is the responsibility of the show to brief the cattle judge fully, prior to this class with its specific rules and it is strongly recommended that this class is judged straight after lunch whilst animals, competitors and judges are fresh. The decision of the Northern Districts RAS Youth Representative is final.

Horse & Pony Schedule

The Northern Wairoa A&P Society will conduct this Show in accordance with the Rules and Regulations for the governance and conduct of A & P Shows, in their entirety, as ratified by the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (RAS). These rules will be on display at the Show Office. Northern Wairoa A&P Society has offered the standard qualifying section schedule as presented in the RAS rules. As such the Society believes therefore that this Show is a qualifying show for Horse of the Year. In addition, the RAS equestrian levy (as set by the RAS) is incorporated into the entry fees.

IMPORTANT HEALTH & SAFETY INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS & COMPETITORS

All Exhibitors agree to comply with the terms of the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015 and its subsequent amendments. Northern Wairoa A&P Society will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act. All Exhibitors and Competitors must follow the instructions of Stewards and Officials. Exhibitors and Competitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept in control at all times. Northern Wairoa A&P Society reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable. Exhibitors and competitors must ensure that they keep walkways and access ways clear and no dangerous equipment of chemicals are accessible to the public.

Legal Liability – The Society's policy does not cover Competitors and Exhibitors

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.

No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head steward.

All exhibits shall be at the sole risk of the owner or exhibitor and Northern Wairoa A&P Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss or damage, mis-delivery, detention or delay of exhibits of any description whatsoever.

COMPLETION OF ENTRY

Entries to Arapohue Show will be accepted according to RAS Rules.

REFUNDS – 75% of entry fees will be given in valid circumstances where written notification has been received at the Show office no later than one week after the show. This notification must be accompanied by a detailed doctor's or veterinarian's certificate.

COVID 19.

If the Show is unable to proceed due to restrictions relating to COVID 19 entry fees will be refunded less an administration fee of 15%

Prize Money

Supreme Awards

It would be appreciated if all Champions eligible for Supreme Awards present themselves for these awards in a timely manner. It is poor manners to leave the Show prior to these Awards being presented if you are eligible.

Competitor Number

Competitors must supply their own competitor number, which may be worn on the breastplate, arm or back. The competitor number is shown on the entry confirmation, which is mailed to you

Electronic or Audio Equipment

Electronic or Audio equipment carried on a competitor deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor is banned from all competitions at any RAS or affiliated shows, with the penalty of forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at that show.

Local

Means a local rider and exhibit who is resident within the area of the Kaipara District Council.

Class Amalgamation

The Society reserves the right to amalgamate classes if there are insufficient entries.

If less than 2 entries in a section, the section maybe cancelled.

Limiting Entries

The Society reserves the right to restrict entries if numbers require it. Entries will be accepted on a first in first served basis. If entry levels exceed amounts that the Society deems can be comfortably run within the timetable, full refunds will be given.

Publication of Show Results & Show Photos

The Northern Wairoa A&P Society reserves the right to publish show results. Entry in the show entitles the Society to publish an exhibitor's name in result reports and distribute with exhibitor lists. Furthermore, as an entrant in the Show, any photographs taken of entries, competitors or exhibitors may be used for publicity purposes by the Society.

In-Line Resolution Process Policy- This Show/Event supports the RAS Policy.

A Yellow or Red Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible.. Full wording of the Policy is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz

Clean Sport Testing

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. See Clean Sport Section (CS) in RAS Equestrian Rule Book. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. A Forbidden Substance is any substance capable of affecting the

speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital.

PROTESTS – Any protest must be made, in writing, within 30 minutes of the completion of the judging of the specific class, signed by the protester and delivered to the Show Secretary. The protester shall, at the time of making such protest, lodge the sum of \$50.00 cash which shall be forfeited to the Society should the objection be considered frivolous or vexatious. All protests will be determined by the Judicial Committee whose decision shall be absolutely final.

Protective Headwear

Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse within the Showgrounds. Such head gears must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere on the showgrounds. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards and **MUST** have been Yellow TAGGED to confirm this. No tag = no entry into the show ring.

Height Certificates

A photocopy of the current NZ RAS Height Certificate & Performance Card must accompany entries for entry to be accepted.

Exhibitors **must** carry a current RAS Height Certificate in all classes where height is a requirement of eligibility. Height Certificates will be checked by stewards before horses/ponies enter the ring. Judges will refuse to judge exhibits who do not produce height certificates when requested. NO Height Certificate on the day = NO competing! Unless height certificates are presented, no prizemoney or ribbons will be awarded.

NOVICE QUALIFICATIONS are as at show day. Please advise the Secretary if you should win your way out of a class after entry and before show day, we will adjust your entry accordingly.

All Wins, whether they be novice or open, (and this includes Lady's & Gent's classes) at all affiliated RAS Shows/Events including the NZ Horse of the Year (HOY) Show must be recorded on the RAS Certificate and/or Performance Card, until six wins are achieved.

Ages of Riders & Handlers Rider/Handler's age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st August 2023

Lead Rein classes are restricted to riders under eight (8) years of age with a minimum age of four (4) years, who are not competing in any other sections at any A&P Show/Event. To be led by an attendant fourteen (14) years of age or over.

First Ridden Classes are restricted to riders under ten (10) years of age, who are not competing in any other sections at any A&P Show/Event.

Novice pony exhibits (except Novice Pony Stallions) may be ridden by a rider of any

age. Novice pony stallions must be led or ridden by a rider fourteen (14) and over. Open pony exhibits must be ridden by riders under seventeen (17) years of age. Open pony stallions must be ridden by a rider fourteen (14- sixteen (16) years of age, led handlers must be fourteen (14) years and over. Riders in horse rings (exhibits over 148cm) must be twelve (12) years and over. Stallions over 148cm must be led or ridden by a rider seventeen (17) years of age or older.

Ages of Ridden Exhibits, Exhibits three (3) years of age and under are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.

Parking – Is limited please park with consideration of others

Stallions All stallions and colts (with exception of Miniature horses and foals) must be shown in a bit. A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing any undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/ exhibitor/ competitor. It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/ Events at all times. The rider must also wear two RAS official (2) armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands from RAS Head Office. Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident / illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety in Employment Act 2015 and any subsequent amendments.
