All Exhibitors agree to comply with the Terms of the **Health & Safety Act 2015 and any subsequent amendments**. The Westland A&P Association hereby states that it will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act. Livestock Exhibitors and Competitors must follow the instructions of Marshals and Officials. Exhibitors and competitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept in control at all times. The Westland A&P Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable.

Livestock Exhibitors must ensure that they keep walkways clear and no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public. In any livestock parade children aged under 10 years leading cattle are to be accompanied by an adult. Any animal 2 years or over must be led by a person aged 16 years and over.

Protective Headgear:

Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse within the Showgrounds and must comply with RAS required standards. **A YELLOW Tag must be attached to the Helmet.**

First Aid:

The show is manned by St John. Please make yourselves aware of their location. Accidents must be reported to your Section Office or the Show Office.

RULES & REGULATIONS – Cattle & Stock

NAIT Registration No. 461146

1. ALL CATTLE TO BE TB TESTED WITHIN 60 DAYS PRIOR TO SHOW AND BE FROM ACCREDITED FREE HERD. TB CERTIFICATE TO ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY FORMS, NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT CERTIFICATE.

2. No late entries accepted.

3. Stock judging will start at 10.00am sharp.

5. All cattle must be haltered and broken to lead.

8. All cattle must be led out for judges inspection if required.

9. All dairy cattle will be judged on dairy points.

10. Entries in registered classes to state name, date of birth and registered number. Sire and dam to be stated for young pedigree stock.

12. All classes of animals age to be determined on date of entry unless stipulated.

13. The judge to have the right to reclassify any stock entered in the wrong class.

14. The Committee will not be held responsible under any circumstances for loss, damage, or mis-delivery of stock or implements exhibited at the show.

15. Any person lodging a protest must deposit the sum of \$20.00, which will be forfeited if the protest is not allowed.

16. Prize money for Cattle Classes: First \$5, second \$3, third \$2. 1 to 3 entries, 1st prize only will be paid, 4, 5 and 6 entries, 2nd prize will be paid. 7 entries, 3rd prize will be paid for show day classes only.

17. The scale of points shall be FIRST 6, SECOND 4, THIRD 2, FOURTH 1, if award made by judge. Champion – 2 extra points, Reserve Champion – 1 extra point.

18. No stock to be sold if not exhibited.

19. No stock shall be moved from the grounds until 3.30pm on the day of Show.

20. Loading ramp situated in grounds.

21. Champions selected from 1st & 2nd placings from age group classes.

ON FARM

1. No late entries accepted.

2. Maximum 2 entries per class.

3. Breed class animals must be registered. State name, date of birth and registration number. Sire and dam to be stated for young pedigree stock.

4. Boundaries – Grey Valley in the North, South Westland in the South.

5. Judging will take place within the 2 weeks prior to show day.

6. Champion Cow and Champion Junior female will be awarded for each section and sent out with results.

RULES & REGULATIONS – Horse Section

Exhibitors must be conversant with the following rules.

1. All riders ride at their own risk. **(PLEASE NOTE RULE 18)**
2. No horses/ponies allowed on grounds unless officially entered.
3. Entries will not be accepted without the entry fee.
4. The committee will refund 80% of entry fee on presentation of a vet or medical certificate.
5. Stables cost \$5 and must be left tidy. Please note that there is no guarantee of stable conditions.
6. \$5 refundable back number hire charge.
7. Horse/Pony height certificates and performance cards must be carried with the exception of the Versatility ring & Hunter Jumping classes. Failure to do so will result in elimination. **“The Central Districts of the Royal Agricultural Society collates all A&P Show Results to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all Novice wins”**.
8. Rider’s age from 1st August 2023.
9. a) **The committee reserves the right to combine, alter or delete classes at their discretion.**
b) The committee reserves the right to reduce prize money according to entries.
10. a) All horses & ponies to be named on entry form.
b) Horse or pony 3 years and under not to be shown under saddle.
c) Height of ALL HACKS & PONIES to be shown on entry form.
11. Competitors to enter in ONE ring only.
12. Ponies entered in Class 62, Pony Breeders’ Sash, must include pony’s registration number on entry form.
13. Events will not be delayed for competitors wanting to enter in more than one class at the same time.
14. a) A NOVICE is a horse or pony which has not won more than five conformation classes at any A&P Show at the time of the current Show. If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the competitor must advise the Secretary’s Office and may change to an Open class within the sub-section, or if no class remains to enter a refund will be actioned after the show.
b) A novice horse or pony is to be shown in a snaffle bit.
c) A novice hunter is a horse or pony that has had no more than 5 wins in ‘Hunter Jumping’. NB height certificates and performance cards not required for hunter classes.
d) Only novice horses or ponies can enter novice classes. All horses & ponies can enter open classes.
e) Novice pony classes are open to riders of any age.
15. A NOVICE RIDER is a rider who has not won more than five riding classes at A & P Shows.
16. a) **Champion & Reserve Champion ribbons will be distributed in all sections where appropriate.**
b) In all rings first prize winners ONLY to parade for Champion. Once the Champion has been selected, the second placed animal to the Champion must be allowed to parade for the Reserve Champion.
c) Winners of Novice classes are eligible for championship judging.
17. Boundaries for WESTLAND DISTRICT classes will be south of the Punakaiki River, West of Omotomutu bridge, north of Mikonui. Combination of horse and rider.
18. **HARD HATS & SAFETY HELMETS – RAS Ruling.** All riders must wear RAS approved protective headgear when mounted on the grounds **(helmets to display current yellow tag)**.
19. a) SHOW JUMPING events will be conducted under NZEF Rules.
b) All show jumping is non grading.
20. Pony or Hack may enter a **maximum of two showjumping classes only**.
21. ‘Moynihan Trophy’ & sash for Mare most suitable for breeding winners from all classes to be judged at the conclusion of all ridden classes - in hack ring.

22. This show supports the RAS 'In-Line Resolution Process Policy' system, which will operate in the All of the show sections of all RAS affiliated Shows and will be used for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and Judges Rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution. Implementation of the policy will be in accordance of the RAS Rules that accompanied this Card, and full wording of the Policy is available to view on the RAS website.

23. Competitors are advised that tests for Forbidden Substance may be carried out under CSJC procedures (of the Rulebook). Your signature on the entry form, and or participation on competition denotes acceptance of these conditions.

25. Any person lodging a protest must deposit the sum of \$20 which will be forfeited if the protest is not allowed. The protest must be lodged within an hour of the event in dispute.

26. Prize money: FIRST \$5, SECOND \$3, THIRD \$2 unless stated. 1 to 3 entries, 1st prize only will be paid, 4, 5 and 6 entries, 2nd prize will also be paid. 7 entries, 3rd prize will also be paid.

27. The scale of points for trophies shall be FIRST 6, SECOND 4, THIRD 2, FOURTH 1, if award made by judge. Champion – 2 extra points, Reserve Champion – 1 extra point.
