



NOTE: The Committee particularly invites suggestions from Members and others as to the better management of the Society's work generally and its future development as a source of education to agriculturists and proposals that may tend to increase its influence, welfare or popularity. Any notification to the Secretary in this direction will be duly considered.

GENERAL CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS

1. All entries close with the Secretary, in writing, or online before **26 SEPTEMBER 2025**, unless otherwise stated. and must be the property of the exhibitor at the time of making the entry.
No exhibit will be catalogued unless entry fees are paid in full.
2. **RIGHTS OF COMMITTEE:** The committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to make any alteration to the show timetable or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. If there are insufficient entries in a class at close of entries, classes may be combined. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the showgrounds.
3. **RESOLUTION PROCESS:** This Show supports the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy. A Yellow or Red card will be issued for offences of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook. Full wording of the In-Line Resolution Process Policy is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.
4. No competitor or exhibitor or members of their family shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Show Convenor/Manager/Ring Master or Ring Steward the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day.
5. **CANCELLATION/REFUND:** Due to any unforeseen circumstance our show being cancelled memberships will not be refunded. The Committee will look into refunding entries excluding the administration fee but doesn't guarantee a refund will be given. In the case of an exhibitor unable to attend the show a refund may be issued less administration fee and 20% of their entry fee.
For Horse exhibitors please refer to the front of the Horse Section. Trade refunds will be issued less 20% due to cancellation of show and if received 14 days prior to the show after this there will be no refunds issued.
6. The Ellesmere Agricultural & Pastoral Association will account for the Goods and Services Tax on an inclusive basis.
7. The same animal cannot be entered in two classes; but this shall not apply to Private or Special Prizes, and to the several classes in Cattle, Horses.

8. **EXTRA STOCK:** Stock, Implements, etc. not eligible under any of the enumerated classes, may be exhibited by paying one-half of the usual entrance fees. N.B. – No prize will be awarded where the Judges consider there is a class in which such stock can be exhibited.
9. Exhibitors will be required to state as accurately as possible, at the time of entry, the date of birth of all stock in classes where age is to be specified; also the date of the last shearing of Sheep.
10. Any Cow or Ewe which is barren shall not be eligible to take a prize, except in the Fat Stock classes. If any Mare shall lose her foal, or if it should have met with an accident such mare will be eligible to compete if she is in milk.
11. **REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS:** No Exhibit or Implements exhibited to be removed from the Showgrounds until 4.00pm on the Saturday, without special permission from the Secretary. The doors of the Produce Sheds will be closed at 5.00pm.
12. The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for loss, damage or mis delivery of Stock, Poultry, Produce, Implements, or any other exhibit or thing exhibited at the Show.
13. Judges of Stock, in arriving at their decisions, are requested not to give undue weight to high condition (except in classes for Fat Stock), but to award the prizes to the animals in each class which they consider best represent the particular breed of the description intended to be encouraged. Judges are directed to pass over all animals whose want of condition be token weakness of constitution, however great their merit may be in other respects.
14. Discrepancies in the prize list must be notified in writing to the Secretary within fourteen days from the date of the Show, or they will not on any account be entertained.
15. All prizes not claimed within 14 days after the date of the Show, will be forfeited.
16. **PROTESTS:** All protests must be lodged with the Secretary either before judging or within one hour of the exhibit being judged, either before or after the Judges have proceeded to their duties. The party entering a protest must deposit \$50.00, which will be returned if the protest is sustained. If the protest is lodged before the Judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the exhibitor; if after that, the onus of proof will rest with the party protesting. The Committee will meet at the Secretary's Office at 3.45pm on the Saturday to consider all protests: five members to form a quorum. All protests must be lodged within one hour after the exhibits are judged, or the awards distributed.
17. **GENERAL:** Any Exhibitor infringing any of the above Regulations shall be subject to be dealt with as may be decided by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.

The decision and ruling of the Committee on any rule, regulation, protest or any other matter affecting the Association will be final and absolute, without the right of appeal.

18. **District to mean and include the following boundaries:**
Western boundary: the Rakaia River; Northern boundary: Steeles Road to Rakaia Terrace Road; Rakaia Terrace Road to Te Pirita Road; Te Pirita Road to Saunders Road; Saunders Road to Morgans Road; Morgans Road to Rockworth Road; Rockworth Road to Ardlui Road; Ardlui Road to Haldon Road; Haldon Road to Hororata Dunsandel Road; Hororata Dunsandel Road to Gillanders Road; Gillanders Road to the Selwyn River; Selwyn River to the Main South Highway; Eastern Boundary: Main South Highway to Weedons Lincoln Road; Weedons Lincoln Road to Boundary Road; Boundary Road to Lincoln Tai Tapu Road; Lincoln Tai Tapu Road to Halswell River; Halswell River to its entry into Lake Ellesmere; Southern Boundary: Lake Ellesmere.
19. **Time of Judging** – Exhibits must be ready for judging at the times specified in the schedule.

HEALTH & SAFETY PLAN

A full copy of the Health & Safety plan is held in the Secretary's office along with a map of the grounds and restricted zones, first aid area and fire extinguishers.

Public and competitors enter the grounds and compete at their own risk.

EVACUATION PROCEDURE: is at two sites – the Bayleys Main Ring and the Dog Trial area.

EXHIBITOR PASSES

An Exhibitor's Pass will be issued to all exhibitors whose entry fees amount to \$10.00 or more.

PARKING

Please follow parking marshal instructions.

MAIN SOUTH GATE for the following Sections: Sheep, Cattle, Alpacas (by stock entrance), Poultry, Produce Sheds, Trade Display, Entertainment.

Exhibitors Enter by NORTH EAST GATE for: Member Parking, Public Parking, Horse and Donkey Exhibitors, Dog Trials, Implements, National Dancing, Wood-Chopping and Shearing.

ENTRY FEES & PRIZE MONEY

Please refer to each individual section for the appropriate entry and admin fee.

PRIZE MONEY – All prize money will be paid in cash on the day of the show except for the sheep section, which will be direct credited to the winners' bank account, where possible, after the Show. **School Lambs** – Prize money will be paid on the day. **Produce Section** – Prize money will be paid on the day, at 4.00pm by the Steward in charge of the Section. At the time of printing this schedule, the Association advertises all sponsorship and special prizes in good faith but will not be liable for the payment of any sponsorship or special prizes not received from the sponsor, as they are not all confirmed by the time the schedule goes to print.

In all classes where two or three prizes have been awarded, the judges are directed to “very highly commend”, “highly commend” or “commend” the other exhibits worthy of these distinctions.

Insufficient entries in a class may mean full prize money is not paid out. Third prize money will not be awarded in any class in which there are less than five entries; in the event of there being no competition in any class, no prizes will be given unless the Judges certify to particular merit. Power is reserved to withhold a prize where the Judges consider it ought not to be awarded, for want of sufficient merit, even where there is competition.

DOGS

The Ellesmere A&P grounds are a working farm, only authorised dogs with a current dosing certificate can be on site, the certificate must be presented on request.

PARADE

Grand Parade for all exhibitors will be held at 3:30pm – Please follow directions of Stewards for each section.

SUPREME ANIMAL OF SHOW

Judging and presentation is held prior to the Parade in the Bayleys Main Ring, all livestock entries awarded a Supreme Champion at the show are eligible.

Online entries will not be downloaded or confirmed until payment has been received.

ADMIN FEE: \$6 applies to all competitors whose total entry cost is \$10 or more.

SPECIAL PRIZES: Champion Ribbons will be awarded in Pure-Bred Sections.

All classes open to imported or New Zealand bred Sheep unless otherwise specified, and all Sheep must be shown in the wool, with the exception of the specified classes in the Pure-Bred Section.

No restrictions as to feeding.

Sheep shown in natural or open classes under 18 months old must carry a full fleece unless otherwise specified.

All Sheep entered in Pure-Bred classes must be entered in, or be eligible for entry in, their respective Flock Books.

In all Shorn classes, all sheep to be machine shorn close and even to the skin on or after 20th July preceding the Show, unless otherwise specified. All Terminal Sire classes are to be machine shorn fairly and evenly on or after September 1, preceding the show.

Exhibitors in Pure-Bred classes must state Breeder's name for each entry or entry will not be accepted.

NATURAL CONDITION CLASSES will be subject to the following:

- a) That the wool has not been trimmed in any way except crutching, dagging or wiggling.
- b) That there has not been any colouring, oiling or locking.
- c) That the sheep have not been housed, rugged or covered at any time or in any way.

In reference to the above conditions the judge's decision in all classes to be final.

ADMINISTRATION FEE: An additional administration fee of \$12.00 per rider/handler is payable with entry fees.

JUDGING TIMES: Prior to Show Day please check website/Facebook for any changes to class times.

GRAND PARADE: All prize winners are encouraged to participate in the parade at 3:30pm.

The Horse section is run under the Royal Agricultural Society Equestrian, Competitors and Judges Rules. Please familiarise yourself with the General Regulations listed in the front of the schedule.

BOXES & YARDS: Covered stables are available and will be allocated at the discretion of the convenor. Costs are \$10 for boxes, \$7 for covered boxes and \$5 for open yards per night. You MUST state on the entry form which nights/days are required. Fees to be paid with entry. Tape yards are not to be erected on grounds.

RESOLUTION PROCESS: This Show supports the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy. A Yellow or Red card will be issued for offences of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook. Full wording of the In-Line Resolution Process Policy is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.

PROTESTS: See General Conditions at the front of the Catalogue.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All riders, including harness drivers, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows / Events must wear approved protective headgear. These must be tagged with a YELLOW approval sticker prior to the day of competition. The current standards can be found at www.ras.org.nz – equestrian. Standard protective headgear tags are changing from 1st August 2023.

CLEAN SPORT: Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show under RAS rules. A Forbidden Substance is: any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

FALL OF RIDER: If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/event in the: competition ring / arena, practice / warmup / collecting ring / arena; or elsewhere within the

grounds where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personal and be given the 'all-clear' before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

RIGHTS OF COMMITTEE: The committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to make any alteration to the show timetable or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. If there are insufficient entries in a class at close of entries, classes may be combined. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the showgrounds.

Handlers must be capable of managing their exhibits.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- **All Novice Horses and Ponies to be ridden in a snaffle bridle while on the grounds (except Hunter Jumping Classes and Working Hunter).**
- Online entries will not be downloaded or confirmed until payment has been received.
- **ARREARS** – No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
- All Stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature Horses and Foals) must be shown in a bit. All stallions and colts must be identified by two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of the bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; Stallions are eligible for any ridden classes at the show with exception of show jumping. Please refer to rules CDE14 in the RAS Equestrian Rules.
- All exhibits must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner/lease/partnership.
- Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS certificate for their horse/pony and must produce upon request to any authorised show/event personal. The name of the exhibit must match the current RAS certificate.
- **SUBSTITUTIONS** – A veterinary certificate must be produced to the Horse Office staff prior to the event for any horse being substituted.
- **REFUNDS** – For any scratching on Veterinary or medical advice, a refund of 80% of the entry fee will be made. Advice of the scratching must be given prior to the judging of the class and the relevant Certificate to be given to the Event Secretary within 14 days.
- All class changes to be made to the Secretary by 12.00 pm on Thursday 16th October 2025.
- All saddlery and accessories to comply with RAS Equestrian Rules GR 5.
- A Novice is a Horse/Pony is yet to win six (6) first placings in conformation classes at any A&P Show at the time of the show. Wins accumulated in Hack Sections are transferable to the Saddle Hunter Section. Wins accumulated in Pony Groups A, B & C are transferred to Saddle Pony Hunter (Group D). District classes are restricted classes and wins do not count.

- A Novice Hunter is a Hunter that has not won six (6) first placings in a Hunter Jumping event over fences at any A&P Show at the time of the show.
- Novices may enter the Open Classes.
- Novice Championships are not eligible for Open or Supreme Championships unless they have won their respective Open Class. Champion does not count as a win.
- If a novice entry has gained six wins by the day of the show the competitor must advise the Horse Office and may change the entry to an Open Class. If an Open Class is not available for entry, a refund will be given.
- Horses and Ponies must be 4 years or older be shown under saddle and driven.
- Riders of any age may ride ponies in Novice Classes. Rider's age is taken as of 1 August 2025.
- Breastplate numbers and Sports Numbers only at this Show. Back numbers are required for the Hack and Pony Hunter Jumping events. The Back Number listing will be available on the Show website in the week before the show.
- Combinations entered in the Pleasure section are NOT permitted to enter any other ridden section of the show, apart from the Pinto, and any other Breed sections. (if eligible). Horses or Ponies that compete in Open Ridden sections at any show are not permitted to enter the Pleasure sections.
- WHISKERS and INNER EAR TRIMMING – as from 1 January 2022 – The trimming of a horse/pony's whiskers, eye and inner ear hair is banned.
