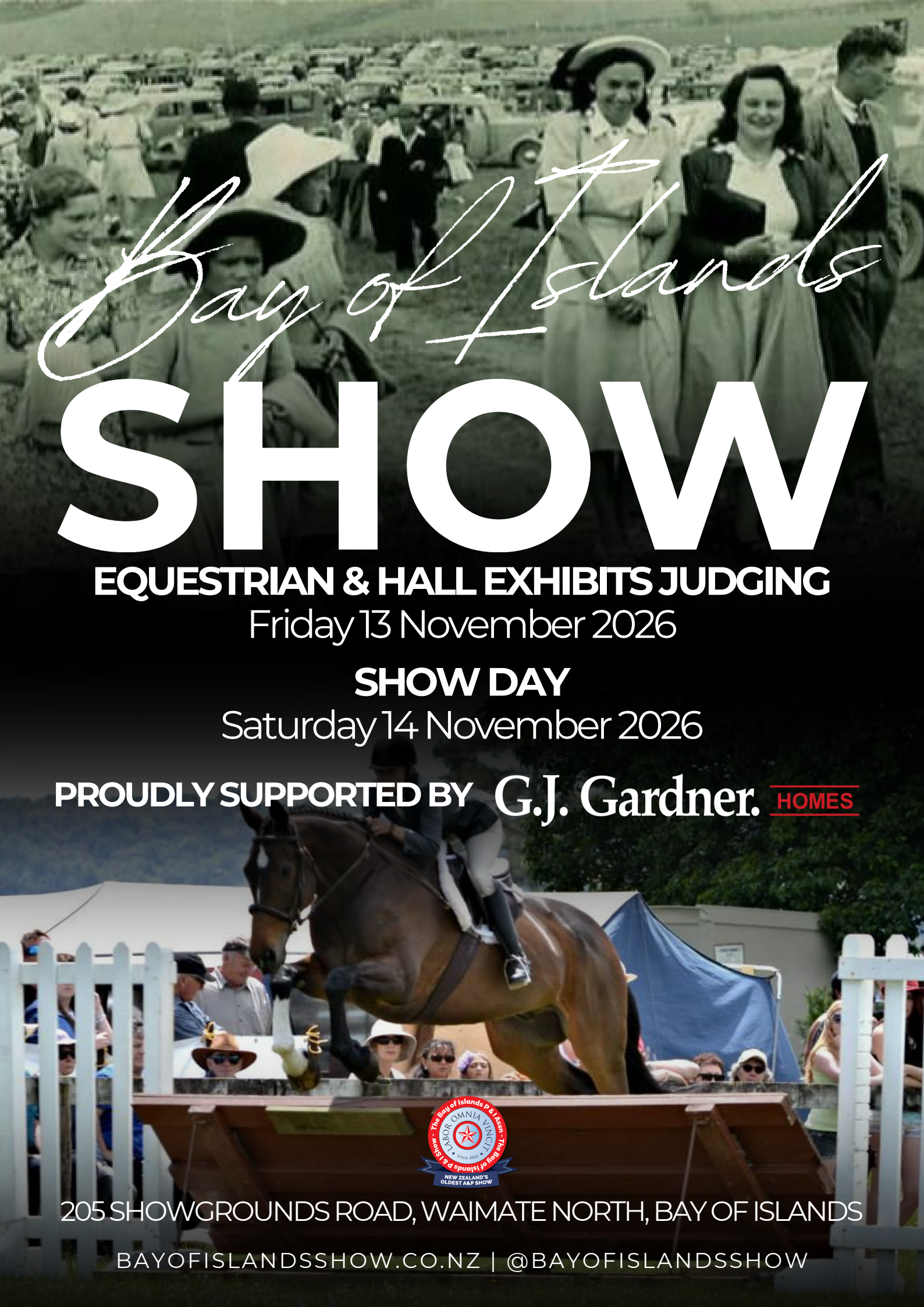

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Bay of Islands Show will be conducted under the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (RAS). A copy of these rules can be viewed on the RAS website: www.ras.org.nz. All persons admitted to the Showgrounds shall be subjected to these Rules and Regulations.

The Bay of Islands P & I Association is an affiliated A & P Show of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) and as such the rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (Inc) for Clean Sport will apply at the Show.

The use of tranquilisers, stimulants, or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show. The testing of all animals is at the owners' risk and will be carried out under CS procedures (RAS Clean Sport Rules). Maximum Monetary Penalty under RAS Rules is a fine not exceeding \$10,000 – see Equestrian Rule CS5. Maximum Monetary Penalty under NZER Rules is \$15,000.

Health & Safety

1. The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by an exhibit or which may be caused directly or indirectly by any other exhibit; notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any Officer or Servant of the Association; and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such exhibitors. By signing the entry form declaration, exhibitors accept the Association's conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.
2. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals on the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments.
3. The Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers unruly or unmanageable.
4. It is the Association's policy to see that all reasonably due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property and to make provision for the protection of the property of others. The Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
5. Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or seating accommodation on the Showgrounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.
6. Parking is entirely at the owners' risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or stewards.

General Show Policy Rule

The purpose of the Bay of Islands Pastoral & Industrial Show is to provide the community and visiting competitors, the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition.

The Bay of Islands Pastoral & Industrial Association has therefore made a policy rule that any person or persons who verbally, or otherwise, abuses fellow Competitors, Stewards, Judges or Show Officials will be asked to leave the Showgrounds and their offending actions will be referred to other Districts A & P Shows.

Entry Fees Refund

An 80% refund of entry fees will be paid to any competitor who has to withdraw from competition on presentation of a Doctor's or Veterinarian's Certificate or at the discretion of the Show Committee.

Show Cancellation

In the event of the cancellation of the Show, refunds will be made as follows:

- 80% of Competitors' Entry Fees
- 80% of Trade Exhibitors' Site Fees

EQUESTRIAN CLASSES

The following Rules & Guidelines apply to all Horses, Ponies and Riders in the Equestrian Section.

The RAS Equestrian Rules for RAS affiliated Shows/Events, Competitors, Exhibitors and Judges (see www.ras.org.nz) sets out all the conditions that apply to the classes and sections offered.

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal Legislation and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and any amendments thereafter.

All riders must wear an approved safety helmet ('yellow' tagged) & suitable footwear at all times. Note: as from 1 August 2023 new Helmet Standards came in to force where a 'Yellow' Tag must be shown.

Riders of any age on ponies must wear jodhpur boots, no long boots, chaps or gaiters.

Fall of Rider

If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the "all clear" before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

Entrants in all classes must provide a photocopy of a current Height Certificate with entry fees and must carry the original certificate while competing.

At the direction of the Royal Agriculture Society of NZ, there will be no penning behind tapes or rope of horses or ponies at any time while on the Showgrounds.

The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that Clean Sport Testing for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show. The testing of all animals is at the owner's risk and will be carried out under CS procedures.

All horses to be brought into the ring under the direction of the ring steward.

All horses & ponies competing in any event must be entered in the name of the bonafide owner or a member of his or her family.

No stallion shall be eligible to enter ridden classes.

No refunds will be given without a Vet's or Doctor's certificate.

Any rider or horses competing in the Horse Rings are not eligible to compete in the Pony Rings. Rider and Horse to compete in one ring only.

Novice Classification: all horses that have not won more than five (5) firsts in classes judged on conformation.

Open Classification: all horses that have won six (6) or more classes. Only Novice horses may enter in Novice classes. All may enter in open classes.

A current Height Certificate must be produced before any ribbons are presented or prize money is paid out.

The Committee has the right to alter or combine Classes depending on entries and to substitute prize money for vouchers of equal or greater value.

If less than 3 entries in a ring the committee reserves the right to cancel the ring completely.

Prizemoney will be awarded:

4 or more entries in class – Full prizemoney, 3 or less entries in class – First place prizemoney only, 1 entry in class – Ribbon only.

Each exhibitor must always supervise and control their animals and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds.

No person is permitted in any judging ring without the express permission of the Chief Steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

All Horses and Ponies are to be ridden with a bit attached to the bridle. Bitless bridles are not permitted for use in the BOI A&P Show Ring. If used on a horse or pony, this will result in disqualification.

The use of Prefixes on Horses & Ponies in the Showing Classes at RAS affiliated Shows be those of the Breeder only. The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for doing so.

Ages: Ages of Riders/Handlers/Horses/Ponies are as at 1 August 2026. Horses/Ponies 3 years and under must not be ridden.

Number breastplates are now compulsory. Black on white or white on black, except for jumping classes where bridle numbers may be used. All horses must wear a number.

Equestrian Entries are to be submitted via the Evo Events website and will close on Wednesday 4 November 2026.

No Equestrian Section entries will be accepted on Show Day.

Horse pens are available and must be booked and paid for with entry – you will need to supply your own gateways.

Please clean your yards after use.

Horses/Ponies must be kept in allocated yards.

NO TEMPORARY PENS (tape, rope, chain etc.).

Show Entry is \$10 for all riders/handlers/exhibitors/spectators over the age of 12 (12 years & under FREE). This is to be paid for with online entry.

Please show paid invoice at gate upon entry.

Overnight camping is permitted at a fee of \$10 per vehicle. Toilets are available but no showers are provided on the grounds.

BAY OF ISLANDS VETERINARY SERVICES PLEASURE HORSE & PONY



RAS Height Certificates are not required

Plaiting and show attire is optional. Riders must wear a yellow tagged helmet and smooth sole riding boots.

Pleasure Horse/Pony means those animals who do not fit the mould of a Show Horse/Pony. We welcome and breed and colour. They should be an uncomplicated and genuine pleasure to ride. Whilst they do not possess the show quality conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride, with impeccable manners. A "pleasure mount" is NOT an inexperienced mount with show quality conformation who is destined for the open show ring. Horses/Ponies must never have been placed first in an open show ring class. Ordinary snaffle bit only, no poll action. Only cavesson nosebands are permitted. Whips may be carried but must not exceed 76cms in length. Spurs are not to be worn. Riders may have competed outside the Pleasure Horse/Pony section.

Riders in Pony classes must be under 17yrs (proof of rider's age may be requested). Age is taken as at 1 August. Children riding hacks must compete in the Horse Class. Adults may ride ponies in Horse Classes without prejudice. To qualify for RASNZC, horses, and riders must be registered with NZEPS prior to the date of the show with Champion and Reserve Champion placings as qualifiers.
