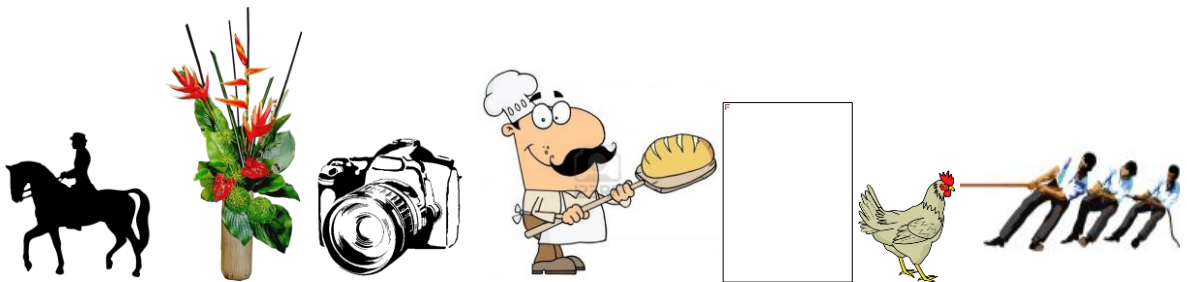

HORSE PENS are available at a charge of \$10.00 per horse per pen per night. Please enter requirements in the space provided on Entry Form. The erection of temporary pens made of rope or electric fence tape is strictly forbidden under RAS Rules & Regulations.

EXHIBITS not collected at the conclusion of the Show at 5pm, will become the property of the Show Association.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Show will be conducted under the amended Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ. A copy of which is held at the Secretary's Office of these grounds & may be seen. All persons admitted to the show grounds shall be subject to these Rules.

ENTRIES: No entries will be acknowledged unless accompanied by entry fees. Entries made by phone or fax must be immediately confirmed in writing accompanied by entry fees.

ADDITIONS TO ENTRIES: Late entries will be accepted but Class swapping on Show Day is NOT permitted.

REFUNDS: Entry Fees will not be refunded except at the discretion of the Association.

(1) Before Entry Closing Date Those requiring refunds will receive an 80% refund.

(2) After the Closing Date Those requiring refunds must apply in writing enclosing a Veterinary or Doctor's Certificate which will be considered by the Committee and if successful will receive an 80% refund.

(3) POSTPONED And/Or CANCELLED (a) Postponed to another Date SHOW – No refund.

(b) Cancelled – 80% Refund.

(4) Covid 19 – Level 2 – Cancelled - 80% refund

ARREARS No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any A & P Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.

PRIZE MONEY In all classes throughout the Schedule will be distributed as:

Four or more entries - full prize money paid out.

Three or less entries - 1st prize only paid out.

If only 1 entry in class - Ribbon prize only.

The Association reserves the right to alter prize money without prior notice. Trophies & Cups will not be handed out, but you will receive a 'Cup Winner' card to keep.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES

(a) The use of tranquilizers, stimulants or any drug affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden.

(b) Competitors are advised that there will be random FS tests carried out during the show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing will be carried out under FSJC procedures (Ref 10 of RAS Bylaws and Regulations, Section 55A ad Ref 89 RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book) (c) The signature of the competitor on the entry form denotes acceptance of the above conditions. No entry form will be accepted unless signed.

PROTESTS: All protests must be made in writing with a deposit of \$50.00 and left with the Secretary within 20 minutes of the prize money and/or ribbons being handed out to the place getters. The findings of the Judicial committee will be final and binding on all parties. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.

ALTERATIONS TO PROGRAMME. Kaikohe A P & H Association reserves the right to combine classes, alter, postpone, or cancel any event as may be deemed desirable. (Section 42 of RAS Bylaws & Regulations).

ENTRY FORMS

HORSE & PONY CLASSES. A Photocopy of the current RAS Height Certificate must accompany entry form. If not attached, entry will not be accepted. Original Height Certificates must be carried by Rider on Show day to be produced if requested.

CATTLE EXHIBITORS TB Testing requirements. Please refer to the beginning of the cattle section of the schedule for full conditions of TB Testing. A copy of the current TB testing results must accompany entry form.

NAIT: The Kaikohe A P & H Assn Number: 442299.

SHEEP EXHIBITORS A photocopy of the current Brucellosis accreditation certificate must accompany Rams displayed at the Show, otherwise Rams will not be accepted.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- As a member of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand, the Kaikohe Agricultural, Pastoral & Horticultural Assn is committed to the protection of people from accidental injury or damage whilst they are on the Association's grounds at Ngawha. Kaikohe A P & H Assn will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused directly by any other exhibitor, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association indemnified against any claim in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by an exhibit, or such exhibitors. By accept signing the Association's entry form declaration, exhibitors accept the conditions of entry and indemnify the Association under the provisions of the Health & Safety in Employment Act 1992.
- Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals on the Show grounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and the Health & Safety in Employment Act 1992.
- The Association reserves the right to order the immediate removal from the show grounds of any animal it considers unruly or unmanageable.
- It is the Association's policy to see that all due care is taken to protect property and to protect and to keep in efficient order its own property and to make provision for the protection of the property of others. The Association shall not be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect howsoever arising.
- Persons occupying grandstands, buildings, other structures or seating accommodation on the show grounds do so at their own risk, and no claim shall be made against the Association in respect of any loss, or injury by reason of any defect of accident, or by reason of any act or omission whether negligent or otherwise, on the part of the Association or of any employee or agent of the Association or on the part of any other person.
- LOCK IT OR LOSE IT - Parking is entirely at the owners' risk. Any vehicles parked will be on this condition and the Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage attributed to any negligence on the part of the Association, its employees or stewards.

PURPOSE OF OUR SHOW The purpose of the Kaikohe A P & H Show is to provide our community and visiting competitors with the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun and friendly competition.

The Kaikohe A P & H Assn has therefore made a policy rule that any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow Competitors, Stewards, Judges or Show Officials, will be asked to leave the show grounds and your offending actions will be referred to other Districts A & P Shows.

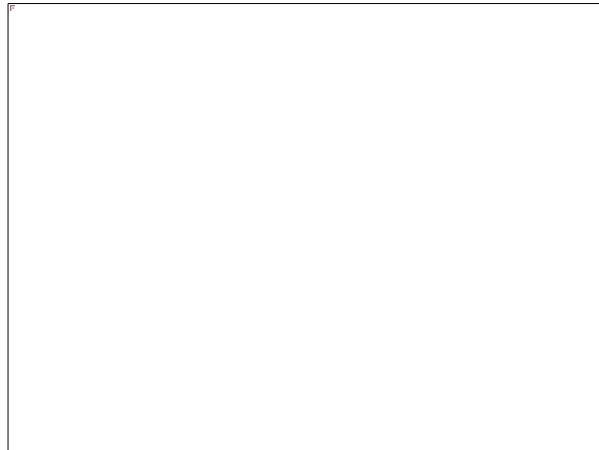

EQUESTRIAN RULES

The following Rules and Guidelines apply to all Horses, Ponies and Riders in the Equestrian Section. Kaikohe A & P Show has a clean sport policy.

The Show Year/Season, Horse and Rider age is from 1 August to 31 July

Please make yourself aware of the Rules & Regulations as set by the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand on ras.org.nz. I have included a few rules for your information.

All Members of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand (RAS), its Affiliated and Kindred Societies competing at Agricultural and Pastoral Shows/Events and functions sanctioned by the Royal A&P Society New Zealand, and competitors at affiliated Shows/Events are expected to abide by the Rules. All are bound, by the Constitution, Rules and Regulations of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand and those of the particular host Affiliated Society or host Kindred Society.

The Judges adjudicate positively and to show how no breed or competitor/exhibitor prejudice. The "Best Exhibit" on the day, regardless of breeding, to be declared the winner.

The Judges adjudicate based upon the correct observance of the conformation and the overall work of the exhibit, and consequently select the best exhibit as set out in the rules in this Rulebook. All involved to be good sportspersons – this means such things as fairness, courteous relations to others and graceful acceptance of results etc.

With co-operation from all of those involved, we can ensure everyone will have a 'good positive day' at the Show/Event.

Conformation Judging

- Most RAS sections (Hacks, Park Hacks, Riding Horse, Saddle Hunter, Show Pony and Saddle Hunter Pony) are judged under the 60/40 criteria – i.e. 60% conformation and 40% paces and manners. The judges would therefore place a higher emphasis on conformation than the paces and manners in these classes/section.
- In the Lead Rein and First Ridden sections the judging criteria is 60% suitability, temperament and safeness, and 40% conformation and paces. Once again conformation is of a lesser priority than the suitability, temperament and safe ride aspects of the pony however, still retains some significance.

Whips

- Whips in Ridden classes (Main Ring) shall not exceed 76cm in length; Whips in Lead Rein and First Ridden sections shall not exceed 76cm including the flap (2cm & 4cm); whips in Led Classes shall not exceed 120cm

Ridden and Lunging

- The following are not allowed when horses or ponies are being ridden on the grounds at affiliated shows/events, nor shall a rider be lunged on a Horse or Pony with any of the following equipment attached to a bridle; Nosebands other than cavesons combined with Double Bridles or rugby Pelhams, attachments to the curb rein of a Double Bridle, or running reins used in conjunction with Double Bridles or other curb bits, Market Harborough, bearing reins, Tie downs, Gags, Side reins or any other equipment not specifically listed here that could force or tie a horse or pony into a frame, and thereby be deemed cruel or come under the mistreatment rule.

Stirrups

- In the interests of safety, the stirrup iron and the stirrup leather (this also applies to safety stirrups) must hang freely from the bar of the saddle and outside the flap. The rider must not directly or indirectly tie any part of their body to the saddlery, unless it is stated otherwise on a current RAS issued competitors/exhibitors disability card.

Safety Helmets

- In accordance with the Health & Safety Act the rider must wear an approved safety helmet displaying the approved yellow tag and suitable footwear at all times.
- All hats/helmets that conform must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ & RAS. Please note – as from 1 August 2023 there are new Standards, where a ‘Yellow’ tag must be shown – www.ras.org.nz/health-and-safety https;

GR 8. FALL OF RIDER If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the ‘all-clear’ before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

ABUSE OF EXHIBITS

Any complaints of exhibit abuse, will be dealt through the RAS Resolution Process/Yellow Card – view on www.ras.org.nz

Abuse can be defined as intentionally acting in a way, which may cause pain or unnecessary discomfort to a horse. As examples but not limited to; i. whip or beat an exhibit excessively. ii. Subject an exhibit to any kind of electric shock device iii. Excessive or persistent use of spurs, or to jab the exhibit in the mouth with the bit v. Rap’ an exhibit

anywhere in or outside the grounds of the event vi Hyper sensitise any part of an exhibit vii Leave exhibit without adequate food, drink and exercise.

Horse and Pony

- Novice – A Novice horse, pony or rider is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show. Upon achieving the sixth win in a division, a pony, horse or rider must then compete in the appropriate open classes with \in that division
- Novice Pony classes are open to riders of any age
- Open – All horses, ponies and riders that have won six classes within a designated section (as above). All may enter in Open classes

Height Certificates

- Where classes are defined by height, competitors/exhibitors must carry a current RAS Height Certificate for their horse/pony at all RAS affiliated Shows/Events and must produce it upon request to any authorized Show/Event personnel. Any competitor unable to produce such a certificate means that the exhibit is ineligible to compete and will forfeit any awards
- Horses/Ponies to be presented to a showring with true & correct markings that match on their **Height Certificate**. Any competitor found to have false marking on their horse/pony when they are presented to the gate to enter the showring, will be disqualified by the Show from their class/section.
- Some classes do NOT require a **Height Certificate** – please read your section rules for guidance. Foals up to 6 months of age do not need Height Certificate.

Horses and Ponies

- An exhibit may only be entered in the Section as stated on the RAS Height Certificate
- Hacks, Park Hacks, Riding Horse, Saddle Hunters, Show Pony or Saddle Hunter Pony

- All Horses and Ponies must be at all times remain in the area allocated and under the control of Stewards

Classes and Schedule

- The Kaikohe A P & H Assn Committee reserves the right to combine classes, alter, postpone or cancel any event as may be deemed desirable. Chief Steward reserves the right to alter the program if necessary

Welfare and Health and Safety Animal

- Events run to the By-Laws and Regulation of the Royal Agricultural Society. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety in Employment Act 1992
- Kaikohe A & P Show is a 'Clean Sport Show'

Competitors

- Competitors can compete in other rings, but classes will not be held up for their accommodation, therefore at their discretion.

Championships and Supreme Exhibit of the Show

- In all Championships only First Prize winners may parade for Champion. Once the Champion is selected Second Place getters to Champion must parade for Reserve. Flat Champions at this show qualify for the appropriate Championships at the New Zealand Horse of the Year show
- All champions must present for Supreme Exhibit or forfeit their Champion win
- Only under extreme circumstances and consultation with the Chief Steward will this be waived

Height Certificates

- Height Certificates must be current and carried at all times during the Show

Stallions and Colts

- **NO** Colts & Stallions allowed due to stringent Health & Safety Rules & not having the adequate facilities. (This rule is waived with the Miniature Horse Schedule)

Bits and Bridles

- All horses are to be ridden with a Bit attached to the bridle in the Show Ring. Noncompliance will result in Disqualification and bits and bridles must comply with the rules of the RAS. Please make yourself aware of the Rules & Regulations of RAS NZ

Electronic or Audio Equipment

- If carried by a competitor, they are banned from all competitions at RAS A&P Shows. Failure to comply with rules and regulations will see the forfeiture of all Prize money, Awards, Qualifications and Banned from further Classes at the Show

Temporary Pens

- No temporary pens are allowed under the Rules of the RAS. Prior arrangements should be made for on-site horse yards

Late Entry Policy

- No class swapping on Show Day
- Late entries will be accepted after the closing date on Show Day

Entries & Entry Fees

- Include RAS of NZ Equestrian Levy and GST
- Be taken via EVO Entries online

- Prize money will be awarded if 4 or more entries are in the class at the close of entry date. 3 entries or less – no prize money awarded. A photo will be taken commencing Judging & sent to NZTA all winners must be present upon presentation

- Judging: 80% Conformation, 20% Paces & Manners
- Ridden Horses to Show true Thoroughbred qualities
- Horses to show good walk as well as gallop (room permitting)
- Judges then to assess each Horse individually with Saddles removed

Class 3 Warmblood – Sport Horse Class

- No Height Certificate Required
- Open to Thoroughbred Horses that are NOT eligible for the NZTR Class
- Judging on 60% Confirmation and 40% Paces and Manners
- A workout will be required, including a good walk and a lengthened trot and canter to be included in the workout section
- Judge to assess each horse individually with saddles on and turnout will be included
- All Paces and Manners will be assessed

ADULT RIDER - HOY Qualifier

AGE: Rider/Handler eligibility is determined as per age at 1 August. ie: Rider/Handlers who are of age for any division/section on the 1st August completing the show year/season in that division/section.

- Only cavesson nosebands are permitted.
- Whips may be carried but must not exceed 76cms in length.
- Spurs are not to be worn. Riders may have completed outside the Pleasure Horse/Pony section.
- Riders in Pony classes must be under 17yrs (proof of riders age may be requested). Age is taken as at 1 August 2025(beginning of the season)

- Children Riding hacks must compete in the Horse Class

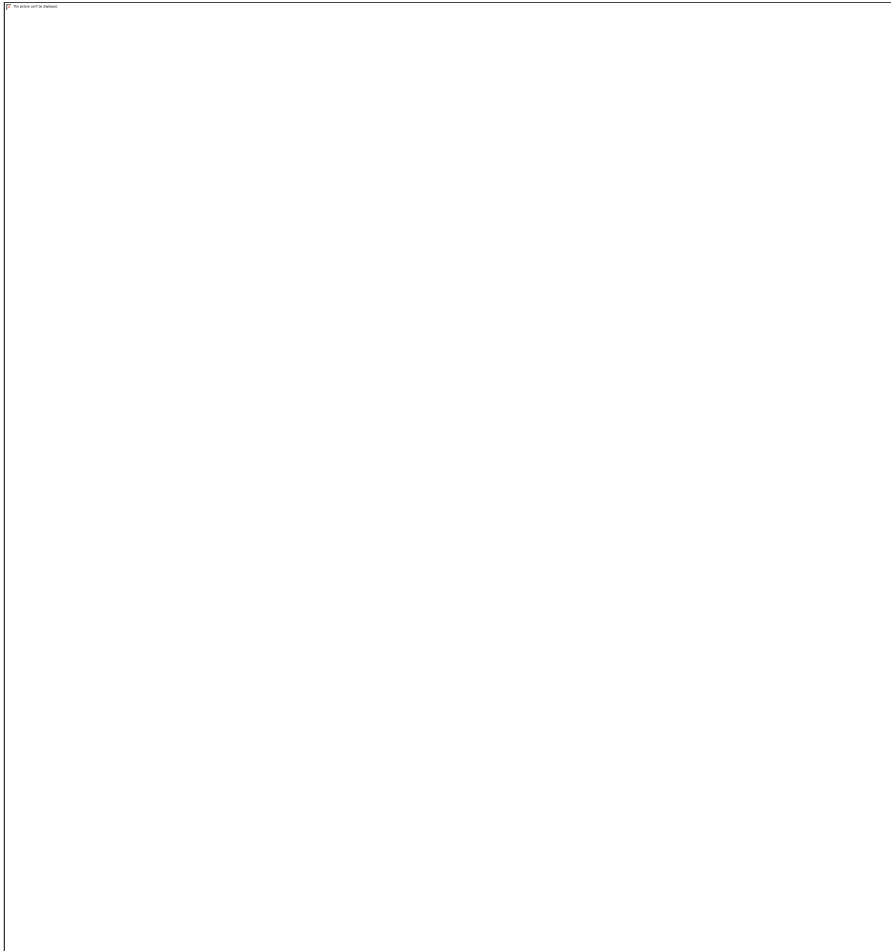
