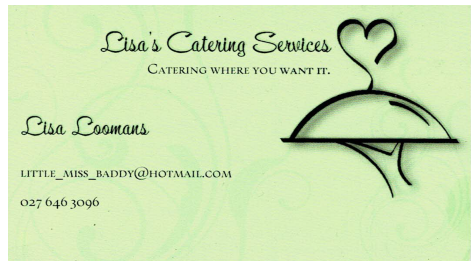

DEFINITIONS OF BLOOMS - SECTION B: ROSES

DECORATIVE BLOOM: Open. Less petals than Exhibition Bloom, refined shape, more slender than Exhibition Bloom e.g. First Love, Virgo. Side bud disqualifies. ¼ to ½ open.

EXHIBITION BLOOM: Ample petals of good substance, symmetrically arranged with a circular outline. Well-formed Centre. Blooms – open, e.g. Peace, Diamond Jubilee. Side bud disqualifies. ½ to ¾ open.

FULL BLOOM: More than ¾ open. Stamens need not be showing, petals have unfurled.

STEM OF ROSES – NO MORE THAN 3 OPEN FLOWERS: All sepals separated, must be open more than bud but NOT more than decorative bloom.

OWN CONTAINER OF MINIATURE ROSES: Any stage of development. Will be judged on freshness, quality and arrangement as viewed from front.

Certificates/Rosettes awarded for Champion Exhibits if warranted.

Roses **MUST HAVE** exhibitor's tickets on the vases when displayed and roses named if possible.

CONDITIONS/RULES OF ENTRY:

1. Entries must be the work of the Competitor only.

ICED CHOCOLATE CAKE *No trimmings, nuts, etc. No Variation on size*

125 grams Butter	1 Cup Sugar
2 Tablespoons Golden Syrup	1 Small tsp Baking Soda
2 Tablespoons Cocoa	1 Egg
2 Cups Flour	1 Teaspoon B/ Powder
1 Cup Milk	

Cream butter and sugar, add egg and golden syrup. Add flour, cocoa, baking powder, and lastly baking soda dissolved in milk. Bake in a moderate oven (180°C). Bake in a 23cm max, round or square tin. NOT IN A RING TIN. Approx. 40 minutes.

ICING: 30g Butter 2 TBSP Cocoa Powder ½ tsp Salt
 1 cup Icing Sugar 1-2 TBSP Hot Water

Mix dry ingredients together, add butter and mix in. Pour in hot water and use whisk to combine. Add more water if necessary.

NOTE: Judge may break 1 Egg into a container.

Do NOT remove this container with egg in it when collecting Exhibits.

One of each fruit will be cut for judging.

Class 7	3 Grapefruit on a plate
Class 8	3 Different Citrus Fruit - one of each. On a plate
Class 9	3 Other Fruit. Non-Citrus. Same Variety. On a plate
Class 10	3 Beans or Peas – on a plate
Class 11	3 New Potatoes – freshly dug, not washed. On a plate.
Class 12	Any other Vegetable not mentioned - grown BELOW ground level e.g. Radish, Beetroot – trim leaves. On a plate
Class 13	Any other Vegetable not mentioned - grown ABOVE ground level - trim leaves. On a plate
Class 14	3 Chicken Eggs – In your own container



SECTION E. PRESERVES

ENTRIES to be labelled and dated. Exhibitor ticket to be taped to bottom of jar. Jars not to be leaking and to be cleaned of old labels etc. Jar rings to be removed before staging by Competitor otherwise not judged.

Jams and Jelly etc. to be covered with **CELLOPHANE** or **SCREW LIDS**, which must be loosened when exhibited except for Classes 5, 6 and 10
