SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

All entries are made subject to the Rules and Regulations and by-laws of the RAS and West Otago A&P Society. Exhibitors or persons entering this show shall be deemed to accept and be bound by these By-Laws Regulations and procedures.

1. All entries to be made in writing on the official entry form or via www.showdayonline.com, and should be lodged with the Secretary before **10 pm on Sunday 16th NOVEMBER 2025**.
2. Exhibitors are specially requested to forward their entries as early as possible, and thus facilitate the preparation of the Show Catalogue, and to state in legible figures the number of the class in which each exhibit is to be placed.
3. Late entries will incur a penalty of \$20 per exhibitor.
4. Entry forms must be filled in by the exhibitor or some person authorised by him or her, and no entry will be received except on the express condition that the exhibitor will comply with and submit to the Rules of the Society in all respects. A copy of the Rules can be had at any time on application to the Secretary, for a fee of \$10. Unsigned entry forms agreeing to these conditions will not be accepted, unless received via www.showdayonline.com, when the process of entering is deemed as accepting the Rules and Regulations and by-laws of the RAS and West Otago Society.
5. All entries must be made in the name of the bona-fide owner of the exhibits.
6. The ages of all stock must date from August 1st in each year, except Cattle – June 1st.
7. Persons in charge of exhibits must produce their entry tickets to the gatekeeper.
8. An entry fee will be charged to competitors in Sheep and Cattle of \$6.00 unless otherwise specified. Horses entry fee will be \$7.00. All exhibitors are required to pay a \$5.00 administration fee – this includes the cost of St Johns and a Catalogue.
9. All exhibitors of stock will need to provide their own forage.

MEMBERSHIP

10. Gates will be open to the public at 9 am and will be closed at 5 pm. The prices for admission will be: - **Adults \$15; Children under 16 free; Vehicles N/C**
11. On payment of the annual fee of \$20 for the year a ticket will be given which will admit two adults & family under 16 years of age, on presentation to all the Society's exhibitions during the year.

PRIZES

12. Standard points for all most points presented are: -Where there are five entries or more: 1st...6 points - 2nd ...4 points - 3rd ...2 points - 4th...1 point. Where there are less than five entries: 1st...6 points - 2nd...4 points - 3rd...2 points - 4th ...nil. Champion 2 points extra Reserve Champion 1 point extra. In special classes points do not count. In classes where there is only one exhibitor points count half. In the event of a tie for any cup or trophy the winner of the greatest number of first prizes takes precedence. Points for trophies presented prior to the 1960 Show will be awarded as set out in rules when trophy presented.
13. Whilst all cups and trophies will be presented when awarded, they are to be returned to the steward prior to winner leaving the ring.
14. Any prize awarded shall lapse if not applied for within three months from date of award.
15. The Committee reserve the right to allot specials in lieu of prize money mentioned in this programme.
16. **All prizewinners are to parade. Equestrian exhibitors will forfeit Prize Money if they do not parade.**
17. No games of chance or gambling of any kind will be allowed within the Ring.
18. No person to make any drawing of stock or machinery without the consent of the owner, obtained through the Secretary.
19. The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for any loss, damage, or misdelivery of stock, implements, or other articles exhibited or taken on to the Showground.
20. Supreme Awards for Sheep, Cattle, Equestrian (Miniature, Horse and Pony), Trade Display and Show Market will be awarded after the Opening Speech at the Grand Parade.
21. **HEALTH & SAFETY** - In the event of an accident and/or injury there are qualified St John Officers on site at all time. All accidents and near misses must be reported to the Secretary's Office and recorded in the Near Misses and Accidents register.

It is the exhibitors responsibility to notify NAIT when bringing an animal to the Show, and again when you take it home. The Show will not be communicating i.d's to NAIT.

Cattle not NAIT transferred will not be eligible to Show.

All entries must be to the secretary by Friday 14th November 2025.

All led Bulls (born before 31 December last) must have a ring through the nose and be led by two leads and be under adequate supervision. It is compulsory that all Beef Females (born before 31 December last) be led by a halter and nose clip. Two Handlers are allowed with Senior Bulls whilst they are parading in the Show Ring.

TB

All animals entered for showing must be from a current TB Clear Status herd. A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to the entry form. The Society must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form. There are two documents required under the Animal Health Board regulations.

First document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area - all animals aged three months or older are to be tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with it's current routine TB testing requirements.

Second document is a TB Animal Status Declaration Card. all animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animals Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. these cards may be inspected at the unloading area.

It is a requirement that ALL cattle over the age of 30 days will be correctly identified using an official primary and secondary ear tag from the AHB or MINDA identification programme as implemented on 1 July 1999.

All cattle must have in their ears the official primary and secondary ear tags.

All classes in which cows in milk are entered must be judged first, and all other stock will be judged in order it appears in the catalogue.

All cattle must be named on entry form, and birth date and NAIT number given.

Highland Cattle: A valid RAS Highland passport must accompany Highland cattle entries into the Royal Event classes. Entries received without a passport will not be accepted.

At the conclusion of the judging these cards will be handed to the Senior Steward who will award points of six, four, two and one on each card. The animal then gaining the most points will be the winner. Should there be a tie in the number of points the animal with the most firsts will win. The Stewards shall then line the animals up in the order in which each judge has judged them and the judges name shall be announced. Finally, the animals shall be lined up in order of placing in accordance with the number of points gained. 3. Grand Parade will be led by the winner of this trophy and its breed to follow, then others in catalogue order.

SHEEP

Sheep entered in the Breed Classes can be registered or unregistered, but must be purebred.

Sheep cannot enter in more than one class.

OVINE BRUCELLOSIS CERTIFICATES: It is compulsory that all male sheep excluding lambs entered in the sheep section of this show be accompanied by a photocopied certificate signifying that they are from a Brucellosis accredited flock. This document is to be signed by a practising veterinarian, and be for the current year of showing.

Sheep, except those in commercial ewe classes, must be shorn between July 20 and not later than one calendar month prior to the show. All sheep to be fairly shorn.

IN ALL SECTIONS HOGGETS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Each section shall have a Champion and Reserve Champion Ram and Champion and Reserve Champion Ewe. The Champions will be judged for a Supreme, per section. The Wool Breeds Supreme winners will be judged for the Best Wool Exhibit - AFFCO Trophy. The Meat Breeds Supreme winners will be judged for the Best Meat Exhibit - AFFCO Trophy. The AFFCO Trophy winners will be judged to attain the Supreme Champion Sheep Exhibit of the Show.

EQUESTRIAN

All Prize winners must parade or forfeit Prize Money.

YARDS are available for hire at \$5.00 per night. Bookings essential. n.b. the sheep pens and cattle pens are NOT to be used on Friday night. Covered stalls will be used on show day so if you have been allocated one of these stalls Friday night take all your gear with you during the show.

There are to be NO tape sensors for horse pens on the grounds under any circumstances.

RIDERS MUST CARRY THEIR RAS HEIGHT CERTIFICATES ON THE DAY. **Failure to do so will result in elimination. There will be no Day Certificates measuring this year.**

All equestrian exhibitors are required to use a breast plate number holder or back number. Back numbers

will be available on the day.

The use of Prefixes on Horses and Ponies must be those of the Breeder.

Novice saddle ponies may be ridden in novice classes by any age rider, including adults

Novice horses/ponies must carry their performance cards - FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN ELIMINATION.

All horses and ponies entering in Novice classes must be in a snaffle bit.

The classification (section nominated) of a horse or pony must be made at the time of its first adult measure; however a change to this classification (section nominated) (with the exceptions listed in rule CDE 1 d) may be made by making application to RAS Head Office (download the application from the website www.ras.org.nz). Any subsequent changes will require a full submission with the final decision on granting further changes resting with the RAS Executive.

Regardless of Rule CDE 1 c), equestrian title winners, of open conformation titles, at Royal A&P Shows/Events, Showing Championships endorsed by the RAS or HOY are not entitled to change classification (section) after winning a title class at any of these events and must stay within their nominated classification (section) with the exception if the horse/pony is under eight (8) years of age, a change of classification may be made upon application to and approval of, the RAS Executive.

When horses or ponies are entered in more than one class and the starting times clash, the exhibitor must elect which class they will start the horse or pony in. At NO time can a substitute rider compete that horse/pony due to the clash, unless you have prior approval of the Head Equestrian Steward. The programme will not be held up for horses/ponies or riders competing in another ring. Horses or ponies arriving at the ring after judging has commenced will not be allowed in the ring or be judged.

No rider is permitted to leave the classing ring to compete in another ring until they have been dismissed by the Ring Steward.

All placegetters must be presented by the rider who started in the class, until the completion of sashing unless there are extenuating circumstances and the Chief Steward has been notified.

There will be no substitute riders after the section has started, (Exception: Novice classes please see rule E7f) or if you have approval from the Chief Equestrian Steward.

Novice pony exhibits (except Novice Pony Stallions) may be ridden by a rider of any age, in novice pony classes only

MARES

-'Dry' mare is a mare not to foal during the current show season (1 August to 31 July).

-Mares shown in Brood Mare classes must have a foal at foot or present a veterinary certificate of pregnancy that includes a projected foaling date. Mares shown in the summer season without a foal at foot, would be expected (before Christmas) to be late foaling in the summer or autumn, or (after Christmas) to have weaned an early foal and be back in foal with a spring due date. Mare falling into either of the above categories should prove their eligibility with a veterinary certificate. Anything less will be unacceptable.

-Broodmares with foal at foot are ineligible for ridden and harness classes.

STALLIONS & COLTS

-All stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature horses and foals) must be shown in a bit.

-A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.

-It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands from RAS Head Office.

-Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

A STALLION MUST HAVE A HANDLER WITH THEM AT ALL TIMES.

No horses will be allowed to practice in the ring prior to judging.

Whips in ridden classes shall not exceed 76cm in length. Competitors in Led Classes may carry a dressage style whip, however Horses and Ponies showing welts from whip abuse will be immediately dismissed for

the ring and disqualified without further recourse for the remaining events at that Show.

AGE OF RIDERS/HANDLERS/HORSES/PONIES

- Rider/Handlers/Horses/Ponies age and eligibility is determined as per the 1 August i.e. Riders/handlers who are of age for any division/section on the 1 August complete the show year/season in that division/section. Proof of age may be required and should be on hand.
- Lead Rein classes are restricted to riders under eight (8) years of age with a minimum age of four (4) years, who are not competing in any other sections at any A&P Show/Event. To be led by an attendant fourteen (14) years of age or over.
- First Ridden classes are restricted to riders under ten (10) years of age, who are not competing in any other sections at any A&P Show/Event unless in a Breed First Ridden Class.
- Novice pony exhibits (except Novice Pony Stallions) may be ridden by a rider of any age.
- Novice pony stallions must be led or ridden by a rider fourteen (14) years and over.
- Open pony exhibits must be ridden by riders under seventeen (17) years of age.
- Open pony stallions must be ridden by a rider fourteen (14), or fifteen (15), or sixteen (16) years of age, led handlers must be fourteen (14) years and over.
- Riders in horse rings (exhibits over 148cm) must be twelve (12) years and over (as per RAS rules).
- Stallions over 148cm must be led or ridden by a rider seventeen (17) years of age or older.

AGE OF RIDDEN EXHIBITS

Exhibits three (3) years of age and under are not permitted in any ridden or driven (harness) class no matter what the rules of any affiliated Breed Society or Kindred Society may prescribe.

RULES FOR STANDARDBREDS

- Horses age as of 1st August.
- Competitors must state their NZSBA Passport Registration number on entry forms. Entry's may not be accepted without it.
- All Standardbreds must carry a brand or a microchip that is registered with Harness Racing New Zealand.
- NZSBA Passports must be carried by all Standardbreds for both Inhand and Ridden sections for identification.
- RAS Height Certificates are not required for the Inhand section, unless classes are defined by height.
- RAS Height Certificates must be carried by all ridden competitors and wins are to be recorded on the RAS Height Certificate under the Breed/Standardbred section.
- Novice horses to be ridden in a snaffle bridle.
- On entering the ring, Competitors must present their NZSBA Showing Passport to the Steward to check - a strict policy of "*no passport - no entry*" will be in place at all shows.

HELMETS

All competitors either in the arena, jumping or practice arena and anywhere else on the Showgrounds are required to wear a safety helmet that meets new safety standards. All helmets must be YELLOW tagged. If helmets are not tagged riders will not be permitted to enter the ring.

Please note: As from 1 August 2023 there are new standards and a 'yellow' tag must be shown - <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/>

GR 8. FALL OF RIDER If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the 'all-clear' before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

Any electronic or audio equipment carried on a competitor deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor is banned from all competition, with the penalty of forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at the Show.

CLEAN SPORT

The use of tranquillisers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses & ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that a test for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show & that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agriculture Society Clean Sport Judiciary Committee (CSJC) procedures & rules (Refer TAB 6 Clean Sport RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book).

In-Line Resolution Process Policy - Our Equestrian Convenor may issue a yellow or red card instead of fines or other penalties as indicated in the RAS affiliated Show Rules and Regulations to the Person Responsible (PR) in the following instances:

Abuse of exhibits in any form as provided in Rule GR6 (RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book)

Inappropriate behaviour towards Show Officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book. (Inappropriate behaviour constitutes any behaviour deemed by the President of the Show or their duly appointed delegate and/or the Chief Ring Steward that brings the equestrian sport into disrepute, including but not limited to inappropriate language, swearing, cheating or deliberately attempting to work outside of the generally accepted show rules and protocols. Full details of the Policy can be found on the RAS website. Section Championships are judged from the winners in the conformation classes. Reserve Championships are judged from the eligible winners and the second placed exhibit to the champion.

Paced and Mannered Horse and Pony Championships will be judged from the winners of all paced and mannered open classes after the completion of section judging. Horses will be judged in the Derby Ring, and Ponies will be judged in front of the Grandstand.

The Committee have the right to make any alterations to the timetable or withdraw / combine any classes / sections as may be deemed desirable once entries are closed.
