

Entries & Payments

- Entries are to be received on or before the **23rd February 2026**
- Entries will be taken in all sections on the day, but a penalty will be added for entries that are late **UNLESS** the sections only take the entries on the day and only these sections will have no penalty added. Cash only on Show Day.
- **Tickets are to be produced to the Gate Person, otherwise you will be required to pay to enter. So do not forget your tickets, there will be no refunds given.**
- All entries must be printed clearly.
- All entry forms must be signed by a person 18 years of age and over
- **ONLINE ENTRIES** will be available through Main Events at www.main-events.co.nz

Alternatively entries will be accepted through post or email using the entry form supplied.

- Prize money will be paid directly into your bank account up to 1 month after the show. Except for Pony Section and Lead Rein and First Ridden classes. They will given out on Show day.

RULES FOR THE SHOW

RIBBONS KINDLY SPONSORED BY PROPERTY BROKERS

ENTRIES CLOSE 23rd FEBRUARY 2026 - LATE ENTRIES AND ENTRIES ON THE DAY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITH A LATE ENTRY FEE AND YOU WILL HAVE TO PAY A GATE ENTRY IF THERE IS NOT ENOUGH TIME TO GET YOU YOUR TICKETS. WHICH IS NOT REFUNDABLE.

RULES:

Clean Sport- This applies to all sections of the A&P Show. Any animal maybe be tested for drugs or forbidden substances at any Show under the By Laws and Regulations adopted by the RAS and procedures adopted by the CSIC.

Exhibitors or Persons entering or competing in Shows or Events affiliated to the RAS shall be deemed to accept and be bound by these By-Laws Regulations & Procedures.

Drugs & Forbidden Substances means any substance capable of effecting speed, stamina, courage, conformation or conduct of an animal by its action upon or cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musco skeletal or urogenital systems.

The following practices are banned from the Equestrian section of all A & P Shows. From the time any animal enters the grounds of any Show or Event or competes in any class or event, the Society or its duly appointed officer shall have the powers to order a drug test and if a test is ordered, the existing CSIC rules suitably adapted in accordance with the type of animal being tested and procedures and fines shall apply.

Ages – Age of Riders/Handlers are as at 1 August 2025. Horses/Ponies 3 years and under are not to be ridden.

Please note that the Morrinsville A & P Society is no longer registered for GST.

Refunding Entry Fees: A refund of fees will be made on presentation of a doctor's or Veterinary Certificate, at the discretion of the committee. Please note that the on-line fees are non-refundable.

All entries received must be paid for when the entry is submitted

RAS Equestrian levy of **\$1.25 per entry** is additional to the entry fee, as per entry form.

Attendant's tickets for exhibitors with a large number of horses will be issued at the rate of **1 per 3 exhibits** on application to the Secretary.

Entries close 23rd February 2026, LATE entries are liable for an additional fee of \$20.00 per horse/pony. Late entries on the day in CASH only.

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds. Exhibitors must comply with appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety in Employment Act 2015 and amendments thereafter. By entering the show you agree to abide by the terms and conditions of the Morrinsville A & P Society.

If suitable, classes with less than three entries may be combined.

For classes with a small number of entries Prize Money will be paid as follows:

Three competitors or less – 1st Prize only will be paid out

Four competitors – 1st and 2nd prizes will be paid out

Five competitors or more – 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes will be paid.

No person is permitted in any Judging Ring without express permission from the Head Steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

The Morrinsville A & P Society or any other organizations in conjunction with the show will not be held accountable for any cancellation of all or part of the show. Refunds will be looked at due to unforeseen circumstances and you will be contacted accordingly.

Pony & Juvenile Section:

1. All entries must be in the name of the bonafide owner.
2. All persons competing in Horse and Pony Rings do so at their own risk and must wear hard hats in jumping events.
3. The Morrinsville A & P Society reserves the right to amalgamate or delete classes where there is no competition.
4. The use of tranquillizers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses & ponies is forbidden

Hats and Safety Helmets:

In all cases current Worksafe New Zealand rules prevail.

All Riders including harness drivers with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Show/ Events must wear protective head gear, which includes a retaining harness, secured to the shell at more than 2 points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, practice area, collecting rings, or anywhere else within a Showground or the grounds of an affiliated event. Hats/ Helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards maybe subject to change but the list can be found at www.ras.org.nz - Equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook. All hats/ helmets that conform must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. **Please Note** New 'Yellow' Tags regulations come in to force on 1 August 2023.

Whisker and Inner Ear Trimming

From 1 January 2022, the trimming of a horse/pony's whiskers, eye and inner ear hair is banned for any horses/ponies exhibiting or competing at affiliated A&P Shows or Kindred Events

Protests: Covering all Sections.

All protests must be in writing and must be entered with the Secretary **no later than 15 minutes after the event.** The party entering a protest must deposit \$100.00

The deposit will be returned if the protest is sustained. The Committee will decide all protests as soon as practicable and there shall be no appeal from their decision.

Protest Committee are: President & (Secretary or Vice President) and Chief Steward of the ring concerned.

RIDDEN HORSE SECTION: Please Note: Height certificates must be available in the ring.

GR 8. FALL OF RIDER If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the 'all-clear' before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

In-Line Resolution Process Policy

"This Show supports the RAS system In-Line Resolution Policy, which will operate across all sections of affiliated Shows and will be offered for any inappropriate behavior towards Show Officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the Equestrian Discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook of the RAS Constitution.

Implementation of the Policy will be in accordance with the RAS Rules that accompanied this card, and full working of the Policy is available to view on the RAS Website.

LED SPORT HORSE SECTION

Competitors note that the test for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the RAS forbidden substance judicial committee procedures and rules. (Refer Rule 97 - RAS Judges and Competitors rule book and rule 55a of the RAS general rules and regulations).

* A party entering a protest must deposit \$100.00 (See protest rules)

* Name of Horse must be stated on entry form where required.



2. Any animal may be tested for drugs or forbidden substances at any show under the By-Laws & Regulations adopted by the RAS & the procedures adopted by the FSJC.
3. Exhibitors or Persons entering or competing in Shows or Events affiliated to the RAS shall be deemed to accept & be bound by these By-Laws Regulations & Procedures.
4. Drugs & Forbidden Substances means any substance capable of effecting speed, stamina, courage, conformation or conduct of an animal by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musco skeletal or urogenital systems.
5. The following practices are banned from the Dairy Cattle section of all A&P Shows, refer to the Dairy Cattle Section.
6. From the time any animal enters the grounds of any show or event or competes in any class or event, the Society or its duly appointed officer shall have the powers to order a drug test & if a test is ordered, the existing FSJC rules suitably adapted in accordance with the type of animal being tested & procedures & fines shall apply.
7. Please note that the Morrinsville A & P Society is no longer registered for GST.
8. Refunding Entry Fees: A refund of fees will be made on presentation of a doctor's or veterinary certificate, at the discretion of the committee. There will be no refunds under \$10. Please note that on-line entry fees are non-refundable.
9. Attendant's tickets for exhibitors with a large number of exhibits will be issued at the rate of 1 per 3 exhibits on application to the Secretary.
10. Entries close **23 February 2026**, LATE entries will be accepted but are liable for an addition fee of \$20 per animal.
11. All entries received must be paid for when the entry is submitted.
12. Prize money will be paid into your nominated bank account after the show. Some section will be paid in cash on Show Day.
13. If suitable, Classes with less than three entries may be combined.
14. **For classes with a small number of entries Prize Money will be paid as follows:**

16. Exhibitors must comply with appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health & Safety in Employment Act 2015 & amendments thereafter. By entering the Show you agree to abide by the terms and conditions of the Morrinsville A & P Society.
17. No person is permitted in any Judging Ring without express permission from the Head Steward of that ring.
18. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.
19. The Morrinsville A & P Society or any other organisations in conjunction with the show will not be held accountable for any cancellation of all or part of the show. Refunds will be looked at due to unforeseen circumstances and you will be contacted accordingly.

For Cattle being moved from 1 July 2012 a NAIT approved RFID Tag is mandatory for all movements of Cattle, including Calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA Tags.

As of 1 July 2012, a secondary tag is no longer required under the new NAIT scheme.

Where live cattle form part of a trade display the exhibitor is responsible for:

Ensuring all stock have completed all TB Testing requirements as per Animal Health Board testing regulations.

Ensuring all stock are identified in accordance with current legal requirements.

IMPORTANT: It is the Exhibitors' responsibility to record all animal movements with NAIT 48 hours prior to leaving the Farm/property for the Show and then within 48 hours of returning to the Farm/property from the Show.

TUBERCULOSIS TESTING: (2 DOCUMENTS REQUIRED)

NO CATTLE FROM A MOVEMENT CONTROL HERD MAY BE EXHIBITED

T.B. STATUS (CATTLE, DEER & OTHER TB PRONE ANIMALS)

As per the current Bio-security requirements:

All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd.

A Copy of the current TB Test Certificate must be attached to entry forms. The Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering Cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form.

There are two documents required:

- First document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area- all animals aged three months or older are to be TB Tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with its current routine TB testing requirements.
- Second document is a TB Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. **These cards may be inspected at the unloading area.**

PROTEST: Covering all Sections:

All protests must be in writing & must be entered with the secretary no later than 15 minutes after the event. The party entering a protest must deposit \$100.00.

The deposit will be returned if the protest is sustained.

The Committee will decide all protests as soon as practicable and there shall be no appeal from their decision.

Protest committee are: President & Secretary or Vice President & Chief Steward of the ring concerned.

- i. Yellow Card. This Show/Event supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulation/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz
- ii. Forbidden Substances - The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible risk. Forbidden Substance Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.
- iii. Arrears - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.



All Alpacas are to be penned by 8:30am. Judging will commence at 9am.

This show is run under the rules and regulations of AANZ.

Conditions of Entry:

All animals must belong to a clear TB herd where whole herd testing is performed in accordance with AANZ voluntary scheme.

All alpacas entered must be registered with AANZ and carry a brass ear tag displaying its corresponding IAR number. Animals must be registered by the 08 February 2026.

The exhibitor is the owner listed on the alpaca's registration certificate. In case of a registered lease the lessee is deemed the owner.

The age of the alpaca is its age on the day of the show.

All exhibitors and handlers must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Convenor.

Placement of animals in "trade pens" will only be done with the permission of the Chief Steward.

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents illness or damage by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds.

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.

No person is permitted in any judging ring without the express permission of the Chief Steward.

Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

Dress code black and white. No alpaca related logos other than the AANZ logo to be worn in the ring.

No alpaca is to be removed prior to the completion of the Show except where permission is granted by the Chief Steward.

YELLOW CARD AND FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES

i. Yellow Card. This Show/Event supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulation/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz.

ii. Forbidden Substances - The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk.

Forbidden Substance. Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

iii. Arrears - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

iv. Summary of RAS Resolution Process - the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the Show. 
