## **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

*The Temuka & Geraldine A & P Association hereby adopts By-laws of the Royal Agricultural Society, and agrees to abide by these By-laws, which are available for inspection on request from the Secretary. All entries to be accepted on these conditions:*

- 1 Exhibits must be on the Showgrounds & ready for Judging as per the date and time in the schedule
- 2 Gate Passes will be allocated to exhibitors who have paid **\$15.00** or more in entry fees.
- 3 Cups and Trophies may be presented on Show Day and photographed but need to be handed back immediately.
- 4 All prizes not claimed within six months after the date of the Show will be forfeited to the Association.
- 5 Refunds: 80% of Entry Fee on production of a Veterinary Certificate & Doctor's Certificate or at discretion of the organising committee (on the day of the show).
- 6 Allocation of Points: Standard Points: First *6 points*; Second *4 points*; Third *2 points*; V H C *1 point* (no points if less than five entries.) Champions *2 points*; Reserve Champion *1 point extra*. In the event of no competition, only half points awarded. Competition means two or more exhibitors, whose exhibits are judged competing for the prize or prizes in the particular class for which prizes are awarded. Ties to count 1 win each. For points prizes no additional points will be awarded for Supreme or Grand Champion. In the event of two exhibitors or more gaining equal points, the exhibitor gaining most first prizes will be declared the winner. If points are still equal the exhibitor being awarded most championships will be declared the winner.
- 7 All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor & the exhibitor must have grown all produce. All stock must be the property of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the official date of entries closing & in the case of Sheep, exhibitors must own a registered brand. The pet lamb classes are exempt from this condition.
- 8 Where a Class has an age qualification, this is 1 August.
- 9 Improper Conduct: Any exhibitor or other person interfering or using insulting or improper language to a Judge or any other Officer of the Association, in regard to the execution of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Show Ground, may be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Association, and, if a prize taker, shall be liable to have all his/her unpaid prize forfeited at the discretion of the Committee of the Association whose decision is final.
- 10 Disqualified Persons: Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by a kindred or Metropolitan Association, the Committee of the Association shall have power to endorse such disqualification or suspension, should they see fit.
- 11 All protests must be in writing, and may be lodged with the President within one hour from the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of Horse Section \$50.00 cash, Cattle and Sheep Section \$20.00 cash and all other sections \$10.00 cash which shall be returned should the protest be sustained. If the protest be lodged before the judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the exhibitor, if after that the onus of proof will be with the party protesting. No protest will be accepted later than one hour after the prize tickets are affixed. The Temuka and Geraldine A&P Assn. Committee, or not less than five members thereof, will decide all protests as soon as practicable, and there shall be no appeal from their decision.
- 12 Exhibitors may arrange for the SALE OF STOCK, etc, but the sale shall not take place prior to 4.00pm unless the Executive give a consent in writing, signed by the Secretary. No advertising allowed. No stock shall be removed from the ground until after 3.30pm. **NOTE:** All stock entries can be removed from grounds after 3.30pm; all other sections must not be uplifted till after 4.00pm. Permission to remove exhibits from any classes before stated times must be obtained from the Secretary & will only be considered in special circumstances.
- 13 The Association will not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage that may be caused to or suffered by any exhibit, or which may be caused directly by any other exhibit, notwithstanding any alleged negligence on the part of any officer or servant of the Association and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association indemnified against any class in respect of any such accident, loss or damage caused by any exhibit of such exhibitor.
- 14 The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for the loss, damage or miss-delivery of stock, produce, goods etc exhibited at the show.
- 15 Exhibitors & spectators are advised that the Association carries a Public Insurance Risk Policy for the day of the Show.
- 16 The Association holds records of names & addresses of all Members & Exhibitors and photos of competitors/exhibitors maybe posted on the Temuka and Geraldine A&P Association website.

- Livestock exhibitors and competitors must follow the instructions of Marshals and Officials.
- Exhibitors and competitors are responsible for ensuring their animals are kept in control at all times.
- The Temuka & Geraldine A&P Association reserves the right to order the immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable.
- Livestock exhibitors must ensure they keep walkways clear and that no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public.

### CONDITIONS:

1. All Fleeces to be properly skirted as required by trade. Only wool off sheep in the current season is eligible for competition.
2. The Judge may at his discretion, change fleeces from one class to their correct class without prejudice to the exhibitor.
3. Growers who have their exhibits changed are to apply to the section steward in charge, who will inform them where their exhibits have been placed.
4. All fleeces must be the property of the bona fide farmer, but it is not necessary that the exhibitor be the breeder of the sheep.
5. Fleeces must not be removed before 4.00 pm & then only under the supervision of a class steward.

## CONDITIONS:

1. The giving of a prize to a sheep shall imply that the judges are satisfied that such sheep are fairly shorn or trimmed.
2. **Definition of a Hogget:** A sheep born after 1 July in any one year shall be considered a Hogget up to and including 31 December in the following year, except in the case of the Dorset Horn & Poll Dorset sheep when 1 May should be substituted for 1 July.
3. Hoggets are now eligible for Championship Judging.
4. All sheep in Pedigree Shorn Classes must be shorn not earlier than 20 July, unless otherwise stated.
5. Championships will only be awarded as provided where there are at least three exhibitors unless in the opinion of the Judge, an animal is deemed worthy of the award but medals may only be given where there are three or more exhibitors. In such cases a certificate will be issued.
6. No stud sheep or lambs, rams or rigs admitted in Prime Stock Classes.
7. Breeding to be stated on entry forms in Prime Stock Classes.
8. Judges will be instructed not to award prizes to sheep which they consider unfairly shorn or excessively trimmed or excessively coloured: also to disqualify sheep which are unfairly presented.
9. All male animals only from brucellosis accredited free flocks will be allowed on the Showground.
10. **All Sheep to be penned by 9.30am.**

## CONDITIONS:

1. All entries must be made in the name of bona fide owner(s). Full name of the goat and registered number, date of birth, sire's name and number, Dam's name and number to be given at the time of entry. Associated Record Entries may state "unknown" for sire or dam.
2. All goats must be Registered or Recorded.
3. Animals entered in special classes must have been exhibited in their appropriate standard age class.
4. No person being a member of the family or an employee of the Official Judge shall be entitled to exhibit.
5. The age of the goat will be taken on the day of judging.
6. Goats which gained their GCH or AGCH awards are not eligible to compete in the normal standard age classes. They may compete in the Grand Champion Class and other Special Classes.
7. All goats to be exhibited must be penned by 9.00am on Saturday.
8. Handlers must wear white coats in the ring and whilst participating in the Grand Parade.
9. No entire senior male goat will be admitted to the Showgrounds.
10. **Breed Awards.** To be awarded only if the animal is deemed worthy and is not already eligible for a Breed Champion prefix or is a BCH.
11. Will comply with the by-laws of the RAS of NZ for the exhibition of Dairy goats.

## **EQUESTRIAN RULES:**

To be read in conjunction with General Conditions of the Temuka and Geraldine A & P Assn and the Royal Agricultural Society Equestrian Rule Book.

**Your signature on the entry form denotes acceptance of these conditions.**

1. **LEASE OR PARTNERSHIP OF HORSES:** A lease or partnership of a Horse must be registered with the Royal Agricultural Society. Proof of registration must be available on request.
2. **District Classes** require exhibitor to reside in the Timaru District Council area.
3. **Horses must be exercised** only in the areas provided, or they will be disqualified.
4. **Height and Performance cards** to be carried at all times (refer Rule CDE 1, RAS Rule Book). Measuring will **NOT** take place on either Show Day or the night before. Final Measuring date will be the 1<sup>st</sup> of March 2026
5. **Helmets must display the yellow tag or will be eliminated. These may be obtained at the measuring stand or from the Horse Convenor prior to show day**
6. **GR 8. FALL OF RIDER** If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the 'all-clear' before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.
7. Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. All wins in Novice Classes within each section count and must be recorded. Should a Novice Horse win an Open conformation class, including Lady's or Gentleman's classes, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in conformation classes, this horse is not eligible to return to Novice.  
A Novice in Paced and Mannered classes is a Horse or Pony that has not won 6 firsts in Paced and/or Mannered at an A & P Show at the time of the Show. Novices may enter Open Classes. Novices are to be shown in simple snaffle bits only in Novice classes. If a novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the show, the competitor must advise the Secretary's office and may change to an Open Class. Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age in Novice classes but not in Open Section where the stated age applies.
8. A competitor who requires a transfer for Horse/Pony or rider must obtain one from the Horse Section Convenor or face elimination.
9. **Ground Fee:** \$10.00 per Horse/Pony. \$4.00 Admin/Judge Fee.
10. **BACKNUMBERS: Riders can use their own back numbers, but they must be white with black numbers. If you do not have your own back number, please note this on the entry form. \$5.00 will be charged and refunded when returned to the Secretaries' office.**
11. Horse/Pony is not eligible to compete in more than one "height" class.
12. Yards available at \$20.00 per yard. \$10.00 will be refunded provided the yard is left clean and tidy.
13. Yards will be available on the day for young stock if required.
14. An 80% refund will only be made on production of a Veterinary Certificate or Doctor's Certificate if cancellation is made or at the discretion of the organising committee. In the event of an entered horse or pony becoming unsound prior to the show, a substitute may be entered in the same section, ridden by

the same rider, provided a vet's certificate is produced. The Secretary must be notified prior to the show. The Horse Section Convenor's decision is final.

15. **Prize Winners must parade in the Grand Parade**
16. **Pony Riders to be under the age of 17 as of 1st August.**
17. Age of Riders/Handlers/Ponies/Horses are as at 1 August 2025. No horse/pony 3 years and under to be ridden.
18. **CLEAN SPORT:** The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any drug that affects the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show. Testing of all animals is at the owners' risk and will be carried out under CSJC procedures (RAS Equestrian Rules of Clean Sport Section of the RAS Equestrian Rulebook). Your signature on the entry form, and/or participation in competition, denotes acceptance of these conditions (Ref EEFSL 2 Entry Forms of RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rule Book).
19. **Electronic Devices** - It is an offence for any electronic or audio equipment to be carried on a competitor in the show ring, deemed to be possible of outside assistance. Penalties may include forfeiting all prize money, awards, qualifications, and elimination from any further classes at the Show.
20. All Horses & Ponies must compete in their nominated height section as specified on a current RAS Height Certificate for the full season.
21. No Horse or Pony to be tied to ringside fences.
22. **Best Rider Classes:** Rider eligible only for Riding Class in the section entered. Only first prize winners in Open Rider to go forward to Champion Rider.
23. Only first prize winners from conformation classes are to parade for championship consideration. Only after selecting the champion should the horse or pony second to the champion in the qualifying class come forward for the judging of reserve champion.
24. Choices must be made if classes clash. No class will be held up. No refunds.
25. **In-Line Resolution Process Policy:** This show supports this Policy, which will operate in all sections of the show including the equestrian sections and will be followed for any inappropriate behaviour toward show officials, judges, fellow competitors, or any other third party connected with the Show, bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute. Implementation of the Policy will be in accordance with the RAS Rules, which accompanied this card. Full wording of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website.
26. **All stallions and colts must be shown in a bit, with the exception of Foals, Miniature Horses and Shetland Pony Yearlings.** If utilising the option of a halter and a stallion chain, the horse's original RAS height certificate must be carried at the time to show proof of height.
  - a. A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
  - b. **It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events. The rider must also wear two RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring.**
  - c. **Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi-Viz and be over the age of 16 years.**
27. **Competitors may enter only ONE ridden showing section per exhibit BUT may also enter working hunter/hunter pony and RTR hunter/RTR hunter pony.**
28. Where a Rider Class has an age qualification, this is **1st August**.
29. **The Parking Warden is in charge of all parking. There will be no reserved parking.**
30. All prize money will be paid at the end of each class.
