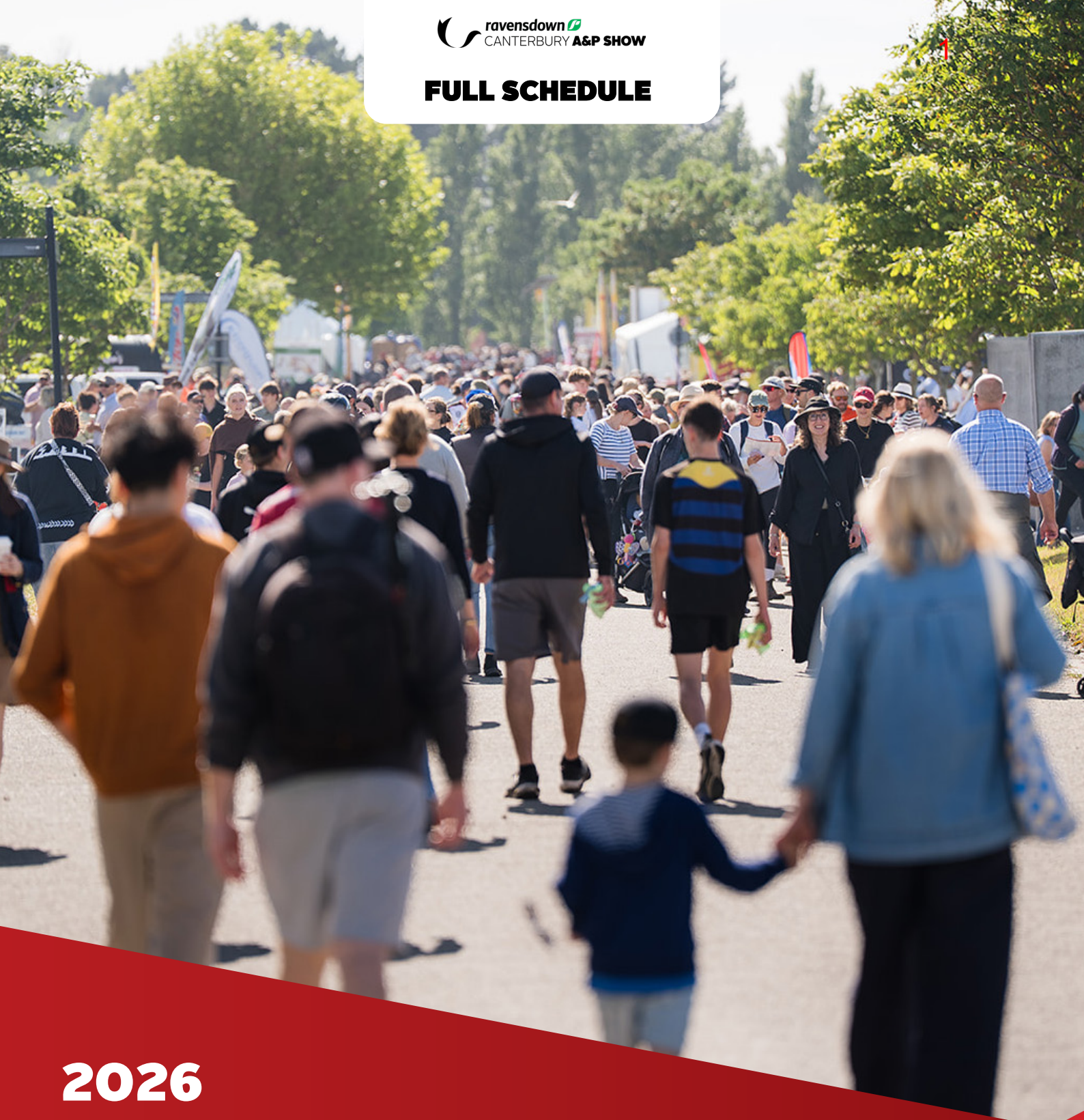

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

A1: PENNING NO LATER THAN 7.30 AM – THURSDAY 12TH NOVEMBER 2026

A2: Alpacas residing in the current OSPRI defined Surveillance area: regular testing is **no longer required**. Please email the convenor a copy of your latest whole herd TB certificate.

Alpacas residing in the current OSPRI TB Disease Control Areas: Movement Control Area, Special Testing Area – Annual, Special Testing Area – Biennial: please email the convenor a copy of your whole herd TB test certificate relevant to the requirements for your specific area.

Alpacas coming from a newly established herd that has never been tested are required to complete a whole herd test. Please email the convenor a copy of your new whole herd TB test.

A3: All alpacas entered in Championship Classes must be registered with the IAR and carry an approved AANZ ear tag displaying its corresponding IAR number.

A4: The exhibitor is the owner(s) listed on the alpaca's registration certificate. In the case of a registered lease, the lessee is deemed the owner.

A5: The age of the alpaca is its age on the first day of the show – 12th November 2026

A6: All exhibitors or handlers must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Convenor. Placement of show animals in 'trade pens' can only be done with the permission of the Chief Steward.

A7: No animal shall be removed from the Showgrounds before 5.00 pm on Thursday, 12th November without the permission of the Chief Steward. Failure to comply with this condition of entry will result in disqualification.

A8: Dress Code for this show is black and white. No alpaca related logos are permitted on handlers clothing with the exception of the AANZ logo”.

A9: Supreme Champion Suri and Huacaya Alpacas are required to attend the Grand Parade on Friday 13th November

ENTRY FEES:

Entry Fee: Fleece \$15

Entry Fee: Breed \$22 non-members, \$12 members

There is a one-off admin fee of \$10 **per exhibitor** regardless of how many entries are submitted, however, all entries must be submitted at the same time on the same form. An additional admin fee will be charged if further entries are added later.

PEN FEE:

\$10 per pen

PRIZE MONEY:

\$50 for Supremes

PLEASE NOTE: Due to the public being at risk of injury while stock are being continually moved to the judging area that the Cattle pen are of the Livestock Pavilion be closed to the public between the hours of 8am and 1pm on Wednesday & Thursday. These times will be confirmed and may be extended or shortened to fit with the judging programme.

ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE IN THEIR EARS THE OFFICIAL PRIMARY & SECONDARY A.H.B.TAGS.

ENTRIES CLOSE: WEDNESDAY 30TH SEPTEMBER 2026

MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTIONS (GST included): Family Membership \$180, Individual \$90,

ENTRY FEES:

Beef Cattle - Members \$20, Non-Members \$30 (GST included)

Dairy Cattle - Members \$20, Non-Members \$30 (GST included)

Stock Judging - \$5

Paraders - \$5

There is a one-off admin fee of \$10 **per exhibitor** regardless of how many entries are submitted, however, all entries must be submitted at the same time on the same form. An additional admin fee will be charged if further entries are added later.

PEN FEES:

Beef Cattle - \$10 per pen required for cattle stalling and show preparation. Every exhibitor will receive 1 free feed pen and 1 free social pen. All other pens are required to be purchased.

Straw for beef pens will be provided.

Medic Fee \$5.00

Fresh cut grass will no longer be supplied.

Exhibitors will be required to supply all their own feed for the duration of the show.

Straw will be provided for the Dairy Tent.

C.1: All cattle entered in Purebred Classes must be entered in the recognized Herd Books of the respective breeds, or if under one year of age they must be eligible for entry. The names of all Purebred Cattle must be stated in the entry form. This rule will be rigidly adhered to.

C.2: All cattle must be tattooed or marked in accordance with their respective Breed Society Rules otherwise they will be disqualified.

C.3: The registered number of the exhibited animal entered in the Purebred Classes must be given at time of entry, but registered numbers of Sire and Dam are not required. Breeding details will not be printed in the catalogue; however, details are required for the entry form for verification of eligibility.

In the case of young cattle where the registered number of the animal is not available, the date of birth and the name of sire and dam must be given.

C.4: Exhibitors must state the breeder's name.

C.5: The owner of the dam of an animal at the date of mating shall be considered the breeder.

C.6: All Cattle must be on the ground and stalled by 8pm the day prior to judging. All cattle are required to remain on the ground until the last day of the Show approximately 3.30pm – unless otherwise given permission by Convenor. No vehicles are to be driven within the Showgrounds prior to 5.30pm on any day of the Show.

C.7: Cattle arriving late will be liable to disqualification.

C.8: The same animal cannot be entered in two Classes unless the contrary is specified.

C.9: Exhibits competing in the family and group classes must be entered in other classes.

C.10: The age of all Cattle, including calves at foot, is determined from 1st June each year with the exception of children's calf classes.

C.11: All exhibits must be shown up to their respective ages, and no two-year-old animal may be shown as a three-year-old, and no yearling may be shown in a two or three-year-old class. This applies to all sections.

REPLACEMENTS

C.12: Notwithstanding Rule 15 of the General Conditions and Regulations of the Canterbury A&P Association, when an animal has been duly entered and catalogued in any class but cannot be paraded, it may be replaced provided notification is given to the Cattle Supervisor and providing it is the property of the Exhibitor concerned as stated in Rule 2 of the General Conditions. The replacement must meet entry criteria for TB and been tested clear. Breeding data is to be displayed on the stall.

IDENTIFICATION

C.13: T.B. Testing. All cattle entered for showing must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd. A copy of the current TB test certificate must be included with your entry forms. The Canterbury A&P Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted.

Owners entering cattle must sign the declaration printed on the entry form. There are now two documents required under Animal Health Board and Canterbury A&P Committee regulations - TB Test Certificate: For cattle from a Declared Movement Controlled Areas - All Cattle aged 3 months or older are to be TB tested, and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other cattle must be from a herd that is up to date with its current routine TB testing requirements. TB Animal Status Declaration Cards: This is a legal requirement for all cattle being moved. All cattle entered for this Show must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards will be inspected at the unloading area. A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags. All animals being exhibited at the Show including any participating in a hoof and hook carcass competition comes under the standard identification and ASD regulations. These cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag. It is the livestock exhibitors responsibility to record all animal movements with NAIT 48 hours prior to leaving the farm/property for the Show and then within 48 hours of returning to the farm/property from the Show.

Canterbury A&P Association - NAIT National Number: 454698.

Where live cattle or deer form part of a trade display the exhibitor is responsible for: i. ensuring all stock have completed all TB testing requirements as per Animal Health Board testing regulations, ii. ensuring all stock are identified in accordance with current legal requirements.

INSPECTION

C.14: The Canterbury A&P Committee reserves the right to inspect at random any cattle for tattoos or identification to establish TB Status, or to detect any malpractice of presentation in Dairy Cattle (see Condition C.37)

JUDGING

C.15: Exhibits being presented in the ring for judging without the allocated NECK NUMBER, will be disqualified from the class.

C.15A: If an exhibitor has more than two animals they must have an appropriate number of handlers so they are not holding up proceedings.

PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS/EXHIBITORS DURING JUDGING AND PARADES

No distinguishing mark of ownership or stud name, with the exception of 'earmarks, tattoos, ear tags' and registered brands may be attached to the animal exhibited. Exhibitors are requested to see that all leaders of cattle in judging rings and parades are to wear Breed Uniform.

AWARD OF CHAMPIONSHIPS

C.16: Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected as follows: First Prize winners in all eligible Classes to be paraded before the judge. Immediately after the Champion has been selected the second prize animal in the Class from which the Champion has been selected may be asked into the ring for judging of Reserve Champion.

First place Yearling Heifer and First place Yearling Bull eligible for Champion Junior. Second place getter to the Champion is eligible for Reserve Champion.

First Place Cow 3yrs and Over, First Place Heifer 2 Years and First Place Bull 2yrs and Over, eligible for Champion Senior. Second place getter to the Champion eligible for Reserve Champion.

C.17: Juniors shall not be eligible for senior championships but are eligible for Supreme Breed Champions. First Place Yearling Heifer and First Place Yearling Bull both go forward to Junior Champion Cup.

Supreme Champion of Breed goes forward to Meat and Wool Cup.

C.18: Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons will be awarded at the Judge's discretion.

C.19: SPONSORSHIPS are subject to confirmation.

C.20: PARADES: ALL prizewinning Cattle will take part in the Cattle Parade on Thursday and the Ballantynes Grand Parade on Friday. Eligible non-participants will be liable for disqualification and prize money forfeited. The Cattle Parades, including the Grand Parade, will be led by the winning breed of the Meat & Wool Cup followed by the second-place breed winner of the Meat & Wool Cup followed by all other breeds in catalogue order led by the Supreme Champion Animal of the breed followed by the Champion Senior, Reserve Champion Senior, Champion Junior & Reserve Champion Junior & other top prize getters. Children aged under 12 years leading cattle in any livestock parade are to be accompanied by an adult. Any animal 2 years or over must be led by a person aged 16 years and over.

C.21: All led bulls (born before 31 December last) must have a ring through the nose and be under adequate supervision. It is compulsory that all Beef Females, including yearling heifers, be led by a nose clip.

C.22: Bulls in the Cattle Pavilion must be securely tied by an adequate chain around the neck or a stout leather collar with an adequate rope attached, as well as a halter, unless securely penned (closed gate).

C.23: UNRULY ANIMALS: The Canterbury A&P Association, through the Chairman of its Cattle Committee, reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showground of any animal it considers unruly or unmanageable. Exhibitors expelled from the Showgrounds are not entitled to any refund of entry fees.

C.24: GREENFEED: No Greenfeed will be supplied. Exhibitors will be required to supply all their own feed for the duration of the show.

C.25: BEEF CATTLE - WEIGHING OF ANIMALS: No weighing available.

C.26: AGE OF CATTLE

Beef Cattle: 2 years and over - born before 1st June 2024 Yearling - born 1st June 2025

Calf at Foot - born since 1st June 2026

GENERAL CONDITIONS

C.27: LIMITING OF ENTRIES - The Committee reserves the right to limit entries in any class or section in the event of excessive numbers of animals to accommodate.

C. 28: After 5pm the Cattle Committee reserves the right to pack up/remove equipment as necessary.

GENERAL RULES

At time of entry

The office will record via the electronic entry system the following details:

 5. Number of animals entered in the Show
- The office will provide an extract of entries to the respective Cattle Convenor for cross checking with OSPRI and signing off by Cattle Committee Chairperson or delegated official.
 - To be included on the extract/spreadsheet
 - * Column for signing in the animals that have been NAIT tag checked as they arrive at the Show
 - * Space for Cattle Committee Chairperson to sign off that all checks are correct and complete
 - Ensure Tb certification is supplied at time of entry and declaration has been signed on the entry form.

At time of arrival

- OSPRI to scan all the animals present on Tuesday afternoon/evening once all animals are on site.
- Check the spreadsheet exhibitor numbers against the animal NAIT tag numbers & sign off on animals present.

PUBLIC ACCESS

Public to be excluded from the livestock pavilion and dairy marquee during judging as much as possible to reduce the risk of contamination. Cattle can be viewed in the show rings on the Cattle Lawn.

Pavilion and Marquee Closure to Public;

Wednesday from 7am – 2pm

Thursday from 7am – 2pm

Friday from 7am - 2pm

PENNING IN CATTLE PAVILION

Plan of cattle shed to be completed immediately after close of entries.

Cleaning prior to the show to consist of hot water blasting of the pens in use after the final weekly Canterbury Park sale and prior to the Saturday before the show.

Placement of barriers, through the use of tarpaulins, will be identified to reduce the need for cattle from different herds being in nose to nose contact during the period of the show.

Herds will be situated in the shed in order that drainage of effluent/urine from pens will not flow through other herd pens.

Individual herd/pen water trough/bucket(s) is required. To be supplied by exhibitors.

Cleaning during the Show – mucking out. All exhibitors to be responsible for the mucking out of their own pens and removing waste straw to the site outside the pavilion – no heaps in the aisles. Exhibitors will also be responsible for keeping the aisles clean where their cattle are penned and cleaning up after their own cattle in shared aisles/exits and entries to the show rings.

PENNING IN DAIRY MARQUE

Penning plan to be completed immediately after entries close with the use of plywood to separate herds in the marquee.

Exhibitors to be allocated a space in the wash bay with all wash tools and containers to be removed from the wash bay once washing is finished.

Cleaning during the Show – mucking out. All exhibitors to be responsible for the mucking out of their own pens

and removing waste straw to the site outside the marquee. Exhibitors will also be responsible for keeping the aisles clean where their cattle are penned and cleaning up after their own cattle in shared aisles/exits and entries to the show rings.

WASH BAYS

Wash bays will be allocated to each exhibitor. Exhibitors must not use any wash bay not allocated to them. For beef cattle, wash bays are located at the loading ramp end of the pavilion in double sized pens. For dairy cattle, wash bays are located behind the dairy milking shed in the truck effluent disposal site. Exhibitors are to remove all cleaning products and tools once completed washing as this is still a shared space. Disinfectant in a sprayers will be available for use if required or desired.

EXITS AND ENTRANCES TO SHOW RING

Entry to pavilion through the door closest to main office. Exit the pavilion through the middle door (the next one towards the ramp end of the pavilion).

This entry and exit procedure avoids the risk of animals passing one another in the aisles with 'one way traffic'.

MOVEMENT TO/FROM AND WITHIN THE SHOW RING

A distance of 2 metres around the animal (front, back and sides) standing and moving to/from and around the show ring will be maintained at all times for animals from separate herds.

Head and muzzles of livestock not to be touched by judges and/or stewards.

Supply mini hand sanitiser's – available in cattle offices and around pavilion for exhibitors.

Ribbons to be handed to exhibitors not to be placed on animals.

Animals from one class are to completely exit the ring before animals from the next class are to enter the ring.

MILKING AREA

Milking bays to be allocated to exhibitors.

Milking clusters to be individually cleaned after each herd/exhibitor has completed milking.

Knapsack spray to be used for pipework after each herd/exhibitor has completed milking.

If space allows, a clear bay between milking bays will be implemented. Warning signs to be placed in each clear bay - DO NOT USE

YOUTH CLASSES

No swapping of animals during youth parader classes.

GRAND PARADE & LIVESTOCK PARADE.

Maintain a 2 metre gap between exhibitors.

b) All bulls must be from tested dams with production records above standard.

c) No records are necessary for maiden three-year-olds.

C.32: Production Standards:

The standard of production required is the following minimum standard: Age at starting a Test Standard 305 day test

2 year olds 265 kg milk solids

3 year olds 295 kg

4 year olds 330 kg

Mature 360 kg

NOTE: It is not necessary for a cow to qualify in the season previous to the Show (unless specifically stated).

C.33: Judges in the All Breeds Dairy section shall judge all classes even if their breed is not represented in all classes.

C.34: The following practices are banned from the Dairy Cattle Section at all A&P Shows:

1. The administration of any drug to enhance the appearance of the animal.
2. The infusion of any substance to the mammary system to alter the outward appearance of the udder or milk veins.
3. The gluing, sealing or taping of teats or the use of artificial practices to affect the teat angle or teat placement.
4. Canterbury A&P Association reserve that right to conduct random milk or blood testing. These practices, in any form, will be considered an act of malpractice at A&P Shows with disqualification likely to result.

Canterbury reserves the right to notify competitors before the competition to default to its own rules if circumstances require it to.

Showing Section: Breastplate numbers (black on white or white on black only) only at this Competition.

Showing Section: Breastplate numbers (black on white or white on black only) at this show. Hunter Jumping &

Working Hunters: Back numbers **will not** be provided for this section. Back numbers available from: Finishing Touch Equestrian sales@fte.co.nz

All Horses/Ponies must have an identification name tag with contact details attached to their halters.

STABLE/CAMPING APPLICATIONS FOR ALL EQUESTRIAN ENTRIES CLOSE: WEDNESDAY 30TH SEPTEMBER 2026

LATE ENTRIES – Late entries may be taken up to the 14th October with a \$50 late entry fee on top of the entry fees. After the 14th October, late entries may be taken at the Secretary's discretion with 100% of the entry fee being charged on top of the original entry fee. Payment must be made before the entry is accepted.

CUPS & TROPHIES:

CUPS & TROPHIES AWARDED LAST YEAR TO BE RETURNED BY THURSDAY 18TH SEPTEMBER 2026 TO THE OFFICE AT CANTERBURY AGRICULTURAL PARK IN A CONDITION READY TO RE-PRESENTED THIS YEAR. WE EXPECT THESE TROPHIES TO BE TREATED WITH THE HUGE RESPECT THEY DESERVE.

TIMETABLE:

Exhibitors must know their class numbers and times by checking the timetable and Catalogue that is available on the website www.theshow.co.nz, www.showdayonline.com and on our Canterbury A&P Equestrian Facebook page in case of class time changes and be ready to enter the ring before their start time. Classes missed are the exhibitor's responsibility. Late exhibitors will be excluded from the class.

If the exhibitor is entered in multiple sections, the exhibitor must decide which class/section to compete in. No class or championship judging will be held up for delayed competitors.

THE COMMITTEE HAS THE RIGHT TO COMBINE CLASSES IF INSUFFICIENT ENTRIES ENTRY FEES

(Unless otherwise stated): Members \$14, All Non-members \$32 (GST included). Ground Fees: \$15 per horse. All other fees listed at time of entry. There is a one-off admin fee of \$10 **per exhibitor** regardless of how many entries are submitted, however, all entries must be submitted at the same time on the same form. An additional admin fee will be charged if further entries are added later.

MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTIONS

(GST included): Family \$180, Corporate and Stud Membership \$195, Individual \$90

NB: To claim membership rates on entry fees, all named parties in a partnership or lease must be members, including Junior riders.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

RAS Rule GR4 - All riders, including harness drivers with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes competing at RAS affiliated A&P Competitions/ Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Competition grounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards and have the yellow tag attached. These standards may be subject to change, but the latest list can be found at www.ras.org.nz . RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse at an A&P Competition or in any area considered to be for whatever reason a part of the Competition ground. It is required that all riders, particularly those jumping horses, wear protective headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety Standard or an equivalent standard and that the headgear be secured by a retention harness.

ABUSE OF EXHIBITS

Horses and ponies must not be lunged for more than a total of 30 minutes per day, whether with or without a rider, at a RAS affiliated show/event – RAS Equestrian Rule GR 6.

ENTRIES:

PLEASE NOTE: The Committee has the right to combine and/or delete classes where appropriate due to lack of entries and combine novice classes where there is less than three entries in one class. Any alterations to Classes must be made to the Secretary by 30 October 2026. NO EXCEPTIONS, except Novice upgrading changes see H.6. Any class changes/scratching's etc. during the Competition must be made to the Horse Office, located at the Halswell Pony Clubrooms.

H.1: AGE OF HORSES & PONIES

Age is determined as from 1st August 2026.

Yearling - born since 31st July 2025

2 year old - born since 31st July 2024

3 year old - born since 31st July 2023

4 year old - born since 31st July 2022

H.2: OWNERSHIP & LEASES: RAS Rule ER 8K (2015).

All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibit, and such exhibits must have been the property of the Exhibitor at time of entry. The Association may require evidence of the date of sale of an exhibit. A bona fide owner shall include a PARTNERSHIP or LEASE that has been registered with the Royal Agricultural Society prior to closing of entries. A Lease must be for a term of not less than 6 months and shall commence on receipt of confirmation from the RAS that it has been received.

H.3: The Committee reserves the right to alter conditions, the order of events, or cancel/combine classes, entirely at its own discretion. (If too many entries are received in any Class the Committee may ballot or otherwise reduce the number).

H.4: EQUESTRIAN LEVY: The Royal Agricultural Society of NZ has imposed a levy on each horse and pony entry at the NZ Agricultural Competition for as long as the Canterbury A&P Association is a member of the RAS, which is paid at time of entry and included in the class fee (\$1.25 per class).

REFUNDS OF ENTRY FEES:

H5: The Canterbury A&P Association will refund 70% of the entry fees upon receipt of a Medical or Veterinary Certificate. These must be received by the Show Secretary within 14 days of the Show.

QUALIFICATION: Qualifications are not required for this event 2026.

NOVICE SECTION

H.6: Snaffle bits to be worn in all Novice classes.

Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. RAS Horse/Pony Certificates must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

All wins in Novice Sections (excluding breed sections) within each division count and must be recorded. Should a Novice horse win an open conformation class, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in either the conformation classes or paced and mannered classes, this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change Sections at the beginning of a new Competition season - excludes Lead Rein, First Ridden and Breed section wins.

A Novice Exhibit or Rider is one that has yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided at any RAS A&P Show/Event or overseas RAS Shows/Events equivalent at the time of the first day of the Show/Event/Competition – RAS Equestrian Rule CDE 6.

Once a Horse or Pony has had 6 wins it is not eligible for Novice Classes. Number of wins is to be counted at time of Competition not time of entry.

If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Competition, the competitor must advise the Secretary's office and may change to an Open class within the Sub-Section, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the Competition.

A Novice in Paced and Mannered classes is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Paced and/or Mannered classes at an A&P Competition at the time of the Competition.

Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won their Open Class, nor are they eligible for Supreme Award. Championship award does not count as a win.

Novices may enter Open Classes.

Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age in Novice Classes only but not in Open Section where the stated age applies.

Riders of any age on ponies must wear jodhpur boots. No long boots, chaps or gaiters – RAS Equestrian Rule GR 9

All A&P Competition/Event results are collated at the Royal Agricultural Society Head Office to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all novice wins.

SUBSTITUTIONS

H.7: A Vet Certificate must be produced to the Secretary for any horse or pony being substituted. The substitution is required to meet qualification stipulations and must be owned by the exhibitor in accordance with Condition H.2.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

H.8: It is an offence for any electronic or audio equipment to be carried on a competitor in the competition ring, deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor. Penalties may include forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at that Competition.

DISABLED EXHIBITORS

Those exhibitors requiring an aid for assistance during competition may apply to the Royal Agricultural Society for an identification card. RAS, PO Box 44, Oxford 7430, telephone 022 567 7551. Disabled competitors are welcome at the Competition, however if you are on crutches or in a wheelchair or disabled in a way that limits your ability to control a horse the Canterbury A&P Association Horse Committee requires a plan to manage your horse to be received before 1st of October 2026 for review and approval. The purpose of this is to ensure the safety of all competitors and volunteers in the ring. The committee's decision will be final and binding.

CLEAN SPORT TESTING

H.9: The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any substance which affects the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

H.10: Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Competition. Testing of all animals will be at the owner's risk and will be carried out under CS procedures - RAS Equestrian Rules CS7

H.11: Your signature on the Summary of Entry form, and/or participation in competition, denotes acceptance of these conditions. - RAS Equestrian Rules for Affiliated Competitions/Events, Competitors and Judges; CS Clean Sport.

JUDGING AND PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

H.12: Competitors must have their entries ready for judging at the times stated, or they will be liable to disqualification.

H.13: No distinguishing mark of ownership or stud name, with the exception of registered brands, may be attached to the animal exhibited or the handler.

H.14: No competitor, exhibitor or member of their family shall approach a judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Competition Convenor/Manager/Ring Master or Ring Steward the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day.

IN HAND HORSES & PONIES

H.15: In Led Classes breeding must be shown on the Entry Form.

H.16: Horses must be presented for judging in the required manner.

H.17: For In Hand classes all stock to be led clockwise with the attendant on the near side. Attendants are requested to be suitably attired when parading horses in the ring. No-one under the age of 16 can lead a large animal.

STALLIONS

H.18: All stallions when being led should be controlled by a colt bit with a single lead or a chain over the nose attached to a single lead, with the exception of foals, Miniature horses and Shetland pony yearlings. Stallions must be kept in their stables/horse box or approved suitable yards when not competing. Stallions must not be tied up unattended unless in an appropriate confinement.

STALLION IDENTIFICATION

It is compulsory for all stallions and colts except foals to wear two (2) Official identification 'S' badges; one on each side of the bridle. Riders/Handlers - must wear two (2) Official Stallion ID Arm Bands; one on each arm. The Rider/Handler and the attendant(s) must wear an Official ID 'S' Bib at all times outside the showing ring. This includes Shetland's.

WARM UP AREA

In a warm up area a stallion must be accompanied by at least one attendant, in addition to the Rider/Handler at all times. Official sets of 'S' badges and Arm Bands are available from ESNZ.

H.19: A marshal or steward has the right to order any stallion/colt considered to be out of control or to be causing disquiet to other horses from the Ring/Marshalling area without recourse from the stallion/colts owner/exhibitor/competitor.

SADDLE HORSES & PONIES

H.20: No horse or pony under 4 years of age is permitted to be shown under saddle.

H.21: Horses/Ponies may only compete in the Section nominated on their RAS certificate.

H.22: At no time may horses or ponies be ridden outside the designated areas.

H.23: No change of rider will be allowed in any horse or pony classes after entering the ring for that class, except in exceptional cases when consent of the Judge or Chief Marshall must be obtained.

H.24: A horse or pony being eligible for a Championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified unless the permission of the Chief Horse Steward has been obtained. In the case of a rider qualifying more than one pony, a second rider may be found.

H.25: The age of the rider is taken as at 1st August this year. Riders on open ponies are to be under 17 years of age.

H.26: Judges are directed to award prizes only to Horses which they consider free from hereditary unsoundness.

H.27: Classes where the sex is not specified are open only to Mares, Fillies or Geldings unless otherwise stated. In all Classes LATE COMERS will not be accepted into the Ring for judging.

H.28: All Riders under 17 years in rider classes must wear jodhpur boots. No long boots, chaps or gaiters – RAS Equestrian Rule GR 9

HUNTER JUMPING

H.29: The Ringmaster and the Convenor have the authority to refuse a competitor on the day if that combination is considered at risk of mishap if allowed to compete.

H.30: In all Hunting events one baulk will disqualify.

H.31: A saddle must be provided for each horse, so that there may be no delay in starting.

H.32: Hunters must be ready to start when called and must run in catalogue order, unless by permission of the Chief Steward.

H.33: It shall be a direction to the Judge that in all Hunting events, style and manners are to be taken into consideration.

H.34: To demonstrate that they have their mounts under control, competitors in all Hunting events must at the conclusion of their round, pull up and face the Judge. Points will be scored for manners.

SHOWJUMPING

H.35: ESNZ Competitions: To be eligible, competitors and horses must be registered. Showjumping entries close Friday 30th October via <https://www.main-events.com/event/12074/royal-ap-show-canterbury-equestrian>. See Conditions in front of showjumping Section. Stable/Camping Applications for all Equestrian Entries Close, Wednesday 30th September

MEASURING: Fees for Measuring, Life & Replacement Certificates

The following charges, inclusive of GST, shall apply nationwide for the measuring service however individual stands are entitled to charge additional operating costs. First Measure (either annual or youngstock) with issue of certificate - \$40.00, Annual re-measure \$25.00, Young stock re- measure \$15.00, Life Certificate \$100.00 The fees will be split with 70% remaining with the measuring stand and 30% going to the RAS Head Office.

Replacement Certificate \$100.00

All replacement certificates (lost certificates, change of horse/pony name etc.) must be issued from the RAS Head Office. The person seeking the replacement certificate must apply to the RAS Head Office for their replacement certificate and have received that certificate before taking the animal to the measuring stand for ongoing measured. Any replacement certificates issued directly from the measuring stand will be invalid. Cost for a replacement certificate may be reduced at the discretion of the RAS Head Office. The classification (section nominated) of a horse or pony must be made at the time of its adult measure or from the 1 August 2026 at the time the horse/pony is first registered prior to its first Measure (whichever occurred first) however, a change to this classification (section nominated) (with the exceptions listed in rule CDE 1 d) may be made by making application to RAS Head Office (download the application from the website www.ras.org.nz). Any subsequent changes will require a full submission with the final decision on granting further changes resting with the RAS Horse Stewards Council Executive.

H.36: There will be no measuring during the Competition. The Canterbury A&P Association measurer cannot take responsibility if a horse is not measured before Competition. All stock to be measured must be measured prior to 31 October and class changes notified immediately. The onus is on the exhibitor to enter the correct class.

H.37: Where height is a requirement of the Section, exhibitors must carry an official RAS Horse/Pony Certificate, failure to do so will result in elimination.

H.38: Young stock, 3 years and under, must have an RAS Horse/Pony Certificate dated no earlier than 1 August this year, which is eligible until 31st January. RAS Horse/Pony Certificates are only required where height is a requirement of the section.

H.39: All stock presented for measuring must be in a bridle or bit suitable for control.

H.40: Horses and Ponies must be measured by an Official Measurer and his decision shall be final. When shod, 0.5cm thickness of shoes allowed.

H.41: Young stock certificates issued by any Official RAS Measuring stand and issued by an official RAS Measurer in the current spring season will be accepted.

H.42 The Measuring stand will only be open on TUESDAY 10TH NOVEMBER 4.00-6.00 PM.

PLEASE NOTE: There will be no special measures. The RAS Website lists measuring dates for other measuring stands in the district <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/measuring-height-certificates/>

HORSEBOXES

H.43: Parking is available on a daily basis for local exhibitors' trucks and cars with floats, with horses being able to be tied to floats in the designated area excluding Stallions (refer to H.18).

NB: Yards are available; no temporary yards are allowed to be erected. ESNZ approved yards that attach to trucks may be allowed if written request is received by the Committee.

H.44: Applications must be made at time of entry via <https://showday.online/show/canterbury> Applications must also be received at the normal closing date of 30th September from showjumping competitors.

H.45: Application must be restricted to a box for each horse exhibited. Boxes are not to be used for storing gear, feed etc. If a horse/pony is scratched the exhibitor must notify the horse box supervisor for the box to be reallocated.

H.46: Preference for boxes is given to Stallions, Colts, Brood Mares with Foals, Young stock, and exhibitors from a distance. DUE TO HIGH DEMAND PREFERENCE IS ALSO GIVEN ON DATE ORDER OF ENTRY AND BOX REQUEST RECEIVED I.E. ON A FIRST IN FIRST SERVED BASIS. Miniature stallions from a distance will receive consideration in box allocation for Option B (horse box form). Donkeys will not be allocated boxes. Stallion boxes must have sign denoting "STALLION" on outside of box. If a stallion cannot be stabled next to any other horses the onus is on the competitor to book and pay for two stables.

H.47: Exhibitors tying horses in alleyways of the Stable Complex will be liable to disqualification and asked to remove their horses from the showgrounds.

H.48: The Association does not guarantee to provide horse accommodation as the number of boxes is limited. Exhibitors who are not allocated a box may obtain a refund on application to the Horse Office.

H.49: Boxes allocated to led stock, must be vacated and left clean by 6.00pm on the first day so that they can be reallocated to Exhibitors in other classes. Wet and dirty sawdust/hay must be removed on vacating box. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to keep boxes and the area outside boxes clean and tidy. Exhibitors are asked to notify the steward at the Horse Office located next to the stables if box is not clean. Exhibitors WILL BE FINED at the cost of full hire incurred if stables are not left clean. No manure/hay to be left in the aisles or end of the stables, must go over on the muck heap.

SMOKING IN HORSEBOXES IS PROHIBITED

H.50: 1. Smoking is prohibited in and around the stable blocks. 2. Any person found smoking in or around the vicinity of the Horseboxes will be fined \$1000.

PUBLIC ENTER STABLES AT THEIR OWN RISK.

UNLOADING OF HORSES AND VEHICLE PARKING

H.51: Exhibitors who have booked a stable/yard are to enter off the Motorway through Curletts Road Entrance to designated unloading and parking areas. All other exhibitors enter off McMahon Drive to designated parking areas. Vehicles must have appropriate windscreen passes in place PRIOR to arrival or vehicles will be turned away. Parked vehicles will be policed for windscreen passes and those not displaying correct passes will be towed away without warning. Exhibitors must remove floats from unloading area beside horse boxes immediately after unloading is completed. Camping in horse trucks is available at a fee of \$60 and is to remain in horse float parking area where showers and toilets will be provided.

AWARD OF CHAMPIONSHIPS

H.52: Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected as follows: First Prize winners in all eligible classes to be paraded before the Judge. Immediately after the Champion has been selected, the Second Prize animal from the class the Champion came from shall parade with the others for Reserve Champion.

H.53: Sponsorship of a section or a class may be paid in lieu of Association's prize money and will not be additional. Sponsorships are subject to confirmation.

2. Horses/ponies must never have been placed first in an open show ring class including working hunter. However, members may apply for dispensation to NZEPS. Please note - open show ring includes wins in novice classes in a ring defined open i.e. saddle hunter, park hack etc this also includes NZ Show Council and Showing Championships.
3. Riders may be registered with other bodies.
4. Riders may compete outside the Pleasure Horse/pony section.
5. Riders in Pony classes must be under 17yrs (proof of rider's age may be requested). Age is taken as of 1st August.

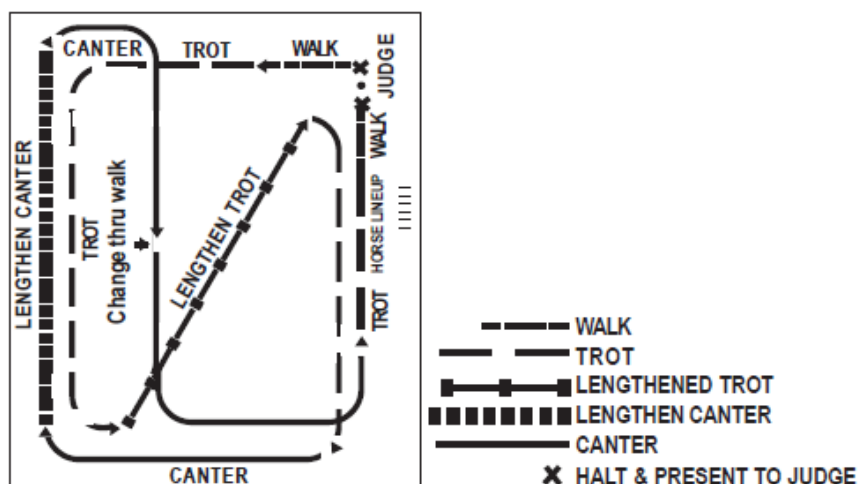

10: Any previous winning combination of this trophy will incur a 10 point penalty.

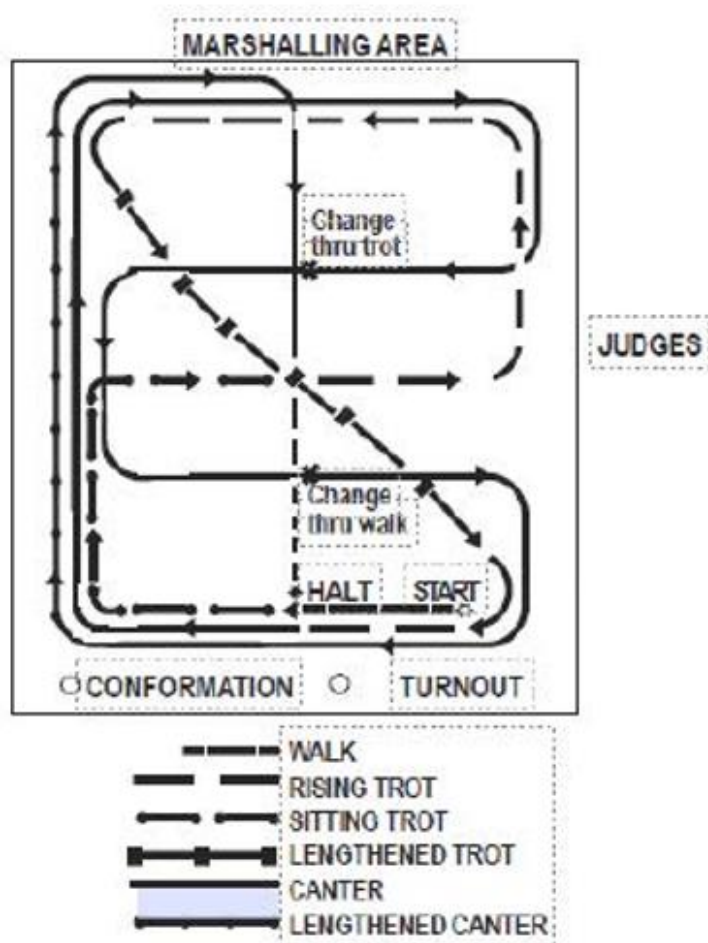

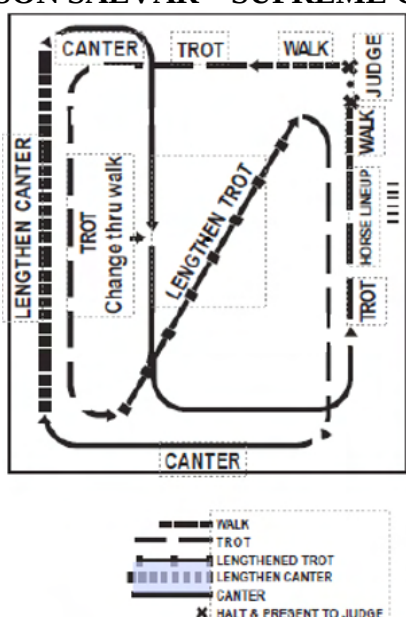

This can often be a stressful time, so ensure you are well prepared. All pigs coming to the show, will require a Water and Feed bowls along with enough feed for the duration of the stay. Pigs can be brought to the grounds the day before and be penned up. We will have a list of allocated pens. All pigs are required to be washed one hour prior to judging, ready for initial inspection in the pens. Bring buckets, shampoo, and baby oil to ensure your pig can be washed adequately prior to the show. No pigs are to remain at the show grounds after 5.00pm Thursday.

JUDGING

Will take place from 10.00am -12.00pm

Pigs will be judged on conformation, balance, muscle and finish. Pigs will ideally weigh between 80-100kg. There will be no breed bias, but rather a focus on the finished product. Entrants must have their pig for a minimum of two months prior to the show.

Boars can be entered in up to all three classes if applicable. Entry fee \$30 is per class.

Given the number of entries it is likely that only the top 15-20 pigs from the pens will be brought into the arena for further judging. Please Note: All sections will be penned in Breeder Groups, and sheep judged in judging rings. It will be the Exhibitor's responsibility to have sufficient handlers and to present their sheep for judging in the judging rings. The Committee will not be held responsible for any sheep not presented at the scheduled time for judging.

Exhibitors are asked to ensure that judging times as stated in the Catalogue, or posted at the Sheep Office, are noted.

SPONSORSHIP

The Sheep Committee and CAPA gratefully acknowledge the generous support of all our sponsors.

ENTRIES

Entry Fees: Members \$25, Non-members \$35 (GST included) which includes the pen fee.

Extra Pen Fees: \$10 per animal. Ewe with lamb(s) at foot is classed as one animal.

There is a one-off admin fee of \$10 **per exhibitor** regardless of how many entries are submitted, however, all entries must be submitted at the same time on the same form. An additional admin fee will be charged if further entries are added later.

S.1: All Sheep must be penned by 10.00PM Tuesday as gates will be locked at 11.00pm for security reasons. No late penning of sheep will be tolerated unless prior arrangements have been made. Latecomers will be refused entry. All sheep to remain penned until after 4.00pm Friday unless consent of the Sheep Section Chairman is given or exhibitors otherwise advised.

S.2: All sheep must be entered in the name of bona fide owner or owners and the original breeder's name must be stated where there has been a change of ownership of a registered flock of the same breed as the sheep being entered and must be from registered flocks.

FLOCK NUMBER to be stated on entry form.

S.3: BRUCELLOSIS - All sheep entered in the Show must be from a flock currently accredited Brucellosis free. Entries will be accepted from ABF breeders with status being confirmed by Breed Societies.

Brucellosis Certificates must accompany entries. Entries who do not meet accreditation will not be accepted and will be returned by post.

S.4: No exhibit entered in the Sheep Classes will be allowed on the ground if infested with external parasites or suffering from footrot.

S.5: In Purebred Classes for Ewes with Lamb at Foot, the Lamb must belong to the ewe and be of the same breed.

S.6: If requested by the Association an exhibitor must furnish a declaration that the sheep exhibited are eligible by reason of age, to compete in the class for which they are entered.

S.7: Sheep in the Breeding Classes must be unshorn (except those entered in the shorn classes). Sheep are preferred in natural condition.

S.8: Sheep must be exhibited in the class entered - No changes can be made.

S.9: No signs placed in the Sheep Section may exceed the height of 1.4m from the ground, maximum of one sign per Stud. To be strictly adhered to.

S.10: SHEARING CONDITIONS

For all sheep other than Merinos and Corriedales who have their own shearing conditions specified under section conditions.

Rams and Ewes Full wool - all Rams and Ewes exhibited in woolly classes must have been machine shorn on or after 1st November in the year preceding the show.

Shorn Wool Breeds rams and ewes all ages - all Sheep must have been machine shorn on or after 20 July in the year of the show.

Shorn Meat Breed rams and ewes of all ages - all sheep must have been machine shorn on or after 1 September in the year of the show.

Black and Coloured Sheep shearing date on or before 20 May.

S.11: Sheep exhibited in shorn classes are to be machine-shorn evenly.

S.12: Exhibitors of all shorn sheep must furnish evidence of date of shearing if required. CORRIEDALE SHEARING CONDITIONS

Refer to NZ Sheep Breeders' Association Flock Book, and as detailed per section and class. JUDGING

S.13: AWARD OF CHAMPIONSHIPS. Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected as follows:

First Prize winners in all eligible classes to be paraded before the judge. Immediately the Champion has been selected the Second Prize animal in the class from which the Champion has been selected shall parade with the others for Reserve Champion. Note: Hoggets are now eligible for championship judging unless otherwise stated.

PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS DURING JUDGING

No distinguishing mark of ownership or stud name, except for earmarks, tattoos, eartags and registered brands, may be attached to the animal exhibited.

CHAMPIONSHIP RIBBONS
